



What is oneweb?

It's the best web experience for mobile on any phone, any network. It's fast, cool and easy to use. This new mobile destination brings together search, personalized info and entertainment, social networking, video, widgets and any web site content in a fast and easy to use mobile experience.

What is oneweb Browser?

oneweb™ Browser delivers the internet fast and rich. It has features, views and capabilities similar to those you find on your personal computer web browser, only it's on your mobile phone. Combined with oneweb, it's the ultimate mobile browsing experience.

Know Your Phone

Features, functions and buttons vary between models and manufacturers of mobile phones, so you need to know how to use them. Refer to the phone user's guide provided by the manufacturer or wireless provider.

Oneweb Browser Features

Shortcut Keys

Combinations of the phone's keys are used as shortcuts to some commands and functions. To use a shortcut, press the * Key followed by a **Number Key** (example: *8 to go to the Home page). While on a web page, press the * **Key** to see a list of available shortcuts.

Navigation Links

Note: Depending on your phone's capabilities, you may not see some of these icons.

Some phones lack sufficient memory to display large web pages at one time. oneweb can split web page content down to a size usable for the phone. It then provides special links to access different sections of the web page and controls for certain features:



- Numbered icons lead to different page segments.



- Login icon jumps to the login field on the web page.



- Search icon jumps to the search field on the web page.



- Main Content icon jumps to the web page's main content, such as a news story.



- Next icon loads the next page segment.



- Previous icon loads the previous page segment.



- RSS subscription feature.



- Snapshot icon displays the full desktop page layout with sections identified by numbers. Jump to a section by pressing the matching number on the keypad.

Menus

oneweb Browser menus are available when the **Menu Soft Key** appears at the bottom of the screen. Commands will be grayed-out if that feature/function is not available. When a menu is opened, one of the menu items is highlighted by default. It is the most commonly used command and is a feature of oneweb Browser to reduce the number of key presses.

Main Menu and Function Screen Menus

1. From any web page or function screen, press the **Menu Soft Key**.
2. To close a menu without performing any actions, press the **Close Soft Key**.
3. Choose a menu item by:
Pressing the **Number Key** that matches the menu item number -or-
Highlighting the item and start it with the **Center (OK) Key** or the **Select Soft Key**.
4. If a sub-menu appears, repeat step 3.



Menu Commands/Soft Keys

The menu items and soft key names and functions will change depending on a web page or function screen's content and the location of the cursor. Some of the commands listed are both menu items and soft keys.

Menu Commands/ Soft Keys	Description
Add Page	Adds the currently displayed web page to the Favorites screen.
Back	Goes backwards to a page or series of pages that had been previously visited or the previous screen.
Cancel	Closes currently viewed screen with no action taken.
Clear Cache	Clears the oneweb Browser memory cache.
Clear History	Clears all references to web pages in the History screen.
Close	Closes the screen or menu.
Delete	Deletes the selected Favorite from the list.
Download	Starts the downloading of the selected item.
Edit	Opens the Edit Favorite screen with the information for the selected Favorite.
Enter Address	Displays the Address screen.
Enter Full Screen	Full Screen Removes the Soft Key labels and header from view.
Exit	Exits oneweb Browser and returns to phone's main screen.
Exit Full Screen	Restores the Soft Key labels and header to view.
Favorites ►	Displays the Favorites sub-menu.
Find	<i>Tools Sub-menu:</i> Opens the Find screen to enter text to locate on a web page. <i>Find Screen:</i> Starts looking for the text entered in the Find screen.
Find Next	Continue to look for word previously entered in Find.
Fit to Screen	Puts oneweb Browser in the Fit to Screen mode.
Forward	Goes forward to a page or series of pages that had been previously visited.
Get Image	Request an image that has not downloaded.
Go ►	Displays the Go sub-menu.
Go To	Opens the entered web address.
Help	Displays the oneweb Browser Help page.
History	Displays the History screen.
Home	Opens the Home Page set in the Settings screen.
Menu	Opens the Main Menu or function screen menu.
Move Down	Moves the selected Favorite down the list in the Favorites screen.
Move Up	Moves the selected Favorite up the list in the Favorites screen.
No	Reject the action you just performed.

Menu Commands/ Soft Keys	Description
OK	Saves entered/edited information.
Open	Launches the selected web address.
Page Info	Displays the Properties screen with data about the currently viewed web page.
Pause	Stops Slideshow on the image currently viewed.
PC View	The full desktop web page is reduced to fit the screen. Users pan a small virtual window over the page, and then zoom in to view the specific area.
Play	Restart the image sequence in Slideshow view.
Reload	Displays an updated version of the current web page.
Reset Defaults	Returns oneweb Browser to the factory installed settings.
Return	Takes you out of Slideshow view and back to the web page.
Save	Save changes made to the Edit Favorite screen or save the selections made on a multiple select drop down list.
Save Changes	Saves changes to the Settings screen.
Select	Initiates the highlighted menu item.
Settings	Displays the Settings screen.
Show	Displays the Favorites screen.
Slideshow	Displays all the images on the web page being viewed as a slideshow.
Start Page	Opens the default start page.
Stop	Stops the downloading of the page or image.
Tools ►	Displays the Tools sub-menu.
Yes	Accept the action you just performed.
Zoom	Enlarge selected image.
Zoom In	When in PC View, pressing the Center (OK) Key zooms down to the part of the web page selected in the Zoom frame.

Loading a Web Page

oneweb Browser lets you to enter a shorter version of a web address. For example, <http://www.google.com> can be entered just as www.google.com. However you must enter other protocols such as <https://> (Hyper Text Transfer Protocol - Secure, for access to secure web servers).

1. Press **Menu → 1 Enter Address**. The Address screen appears.
2. If there is an address already present, press the **Clear Key (Back Key)** to delete one character at a time, or press and hold to delete all the text.
3. Enter the web address and press the **Go to Soft Key**.

Links

Links are text or images that when selected take you to another web page or to another part of the same web page. Select the image or underlined link and press the **Center (OK) Key**.

Text Entry

1. Highlight the text field and press the **Center (OK) Key**.
2. Enter the information and press the **OK Soft Key**.

Radio Buttons and Checkboxes

Highlight the radio button or checkbox and press the **Center (OK) Key** to select or check/uncheck.

Dropdown Lists

1. Highlight the dropdown box and press the **Center (OK) Key**. A list of selectable items appears. Multiple-Choice Dropdown Lists will allow you to select one or more items from the list and display a checkbox to the left of each item.
2. Highlight the item(s) you want and press the **Center (OK) Key**. You are returned to the web page with the item(s) you selected appearing in the drop-down box.

Zoom

Images that were reduced in size to fit on the phone screen can be enlarged. It is not available on all images. Highlight the image and press **Zoom Soft Key**. Use the **Navigation Key** to see parts of the image that are off the phone's screen. Press the **Back Soft Key** to return to the web page.

oneweb Home Page

The oneweb Home Page is where it all begins. From here you can browse web sites, do internet searches with the most popular search engines, post to your social network pages and much more. You can do just about everything that you can with your computer and desktop browser; it's just on your mobile phone.

The picture below shows what is currently available on the oneweb Home Page. Don't see that one web site you use often? Just enter your favorite web address, go to the page, and save it as a bookmark.
