## **Instructions:**

- 1. Trace the outline of your hand on three different shades of construction paper.
- 2. Cut your traced hands out.
- 3. Glue the paper hands to the poster board along the outline of the dove or heart. They should overlap slightly. Hands should be oriented fingers over the palms. See picture.
