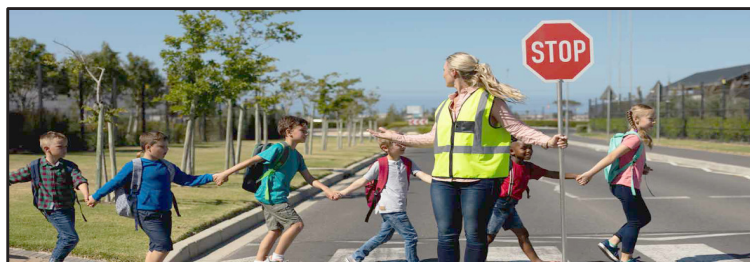
Commodore's Corner

MARINA NEWS

As we move into August, we've officially entered the busiest part of the boating season. The marina has been extremely active, and we'd like to thank everyone for helping make this another successful summer. Your cooperation and respect for our marina, volunteers, and fellow members continue to make a tremendous difference.

Heat & Storm Season Reminders

With continued high temperatures and the peak of storm season approaching, now is the time to make sure both you and your boat are prepared.

Please remember to:

- Stay hydrated and protect yourself and your guests from heat-related illness.
- Inspect shore power cords, air conditioning units, and electrical connections for safe operation.
- Review your storm preparations before a storm is forecast:
- Inspect dock lines and replace worn or undersized lines.
- Add chafe protection where necessary.
- Remove loose canvas, cushions, dock carts, and other items that could become airborne.
- Test bilge pumps, float switches, and batteries.
- Confirm your contact information is current with the Club

Storm preparation is much easier before a storm is approaching. Please don't wait until the last minute.

Updated Marina Rules

The Board has approved several updates to the Marina Rules for the 2026 season. We encourage every Captain to review the attached updated Marina Rules on the pages following the calendars in this newsletter, as they now include several important changes and clarifications regarding marina operations, safety, and member responsibilities.

Please take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with these revisions. Understanding the rules helps us maintain a safe, organized, and enjoyable marina for everyone.

New Dock Box Program

We're pleased to announce that dock box installations are now available.

Members may now apply to have an approved dock box installed in designated areas of the marina. To maintain a consistent appearance and ensure safe dock operations:

- Only the approved standard white dock box may be used.
- Dock boxes require prior approval from the Marina Committee.
- Installation and removal will be performed exclusively by the Marina Committee.
- A \$125 installation fee applies.
- Not every slip location is eligible due to utility access and operational requirements.

- Dock boxes are only permitted in the following locations:

- North Side of A dock
- South Side of B Dock
- North Side of C Dock
- North Side of D Dock

Dock Box Request Forms are available and can be found in the form rack above the sign in book. Please drop your completed form in the Marina Committee mailbox.

Complete details are also included in the updated Marina Rules.

Slip Compliance

The Marina Committee continues to monitor slip occupancy and required documentation.

Violation notices continue to be issued for boats that remain out of compliance with registration, insurance, or Online Mooring requirements, as well as members who have failed to occupy or notify us regarding their assigned slips.

Short Hauls & Week Hauls

Short hauls and week hauls continue to be available by request.

Please complete a Haul-Out Request Form (located behind the bar) and remember to provide your own boat stands.

Parking Reminder

Please remember that there is no early morning or overnight parking in any yellow-marked spaces in the yard.

These areas must remain available for launching, hauling, equipment access, and volunteer operations. Unauthorized vehicles create safety concerns and interfere with marina activities.

Your cooperation is appreciated.

Quick Reminders

- **Dock Carts:** Loading and unloading only. Please return carts immediately after use and respect the "Clean Only" and "Work Cart" designations.
- **Dock Safety:** Keep docks free of hoses, cords, fishing gear, bicycles, and other trip hazards.
- **Courtesy:** Please be respectful of your neighbors by keeping noise levels to a minimum, particularly during early mornings and late evenings.
- **Fish Cleaning & Grilling:** Please remember that fish cleaning and grilling are not permitted within the marina.

As we head toward the final months of another great boating season, let's continue working together to keep South Norwalk Boat Club one of the finest marinas in New England.

Thank you to all of our volunteers and members for your continued cooperation and support.

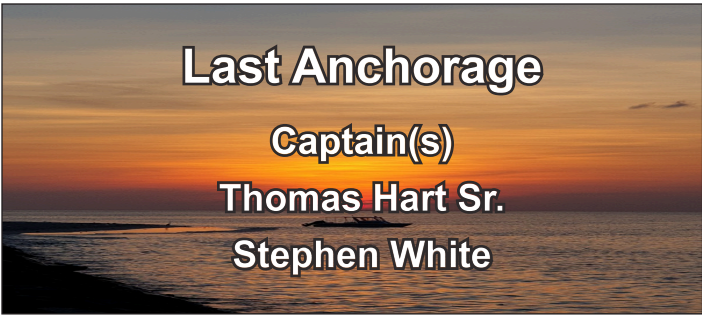

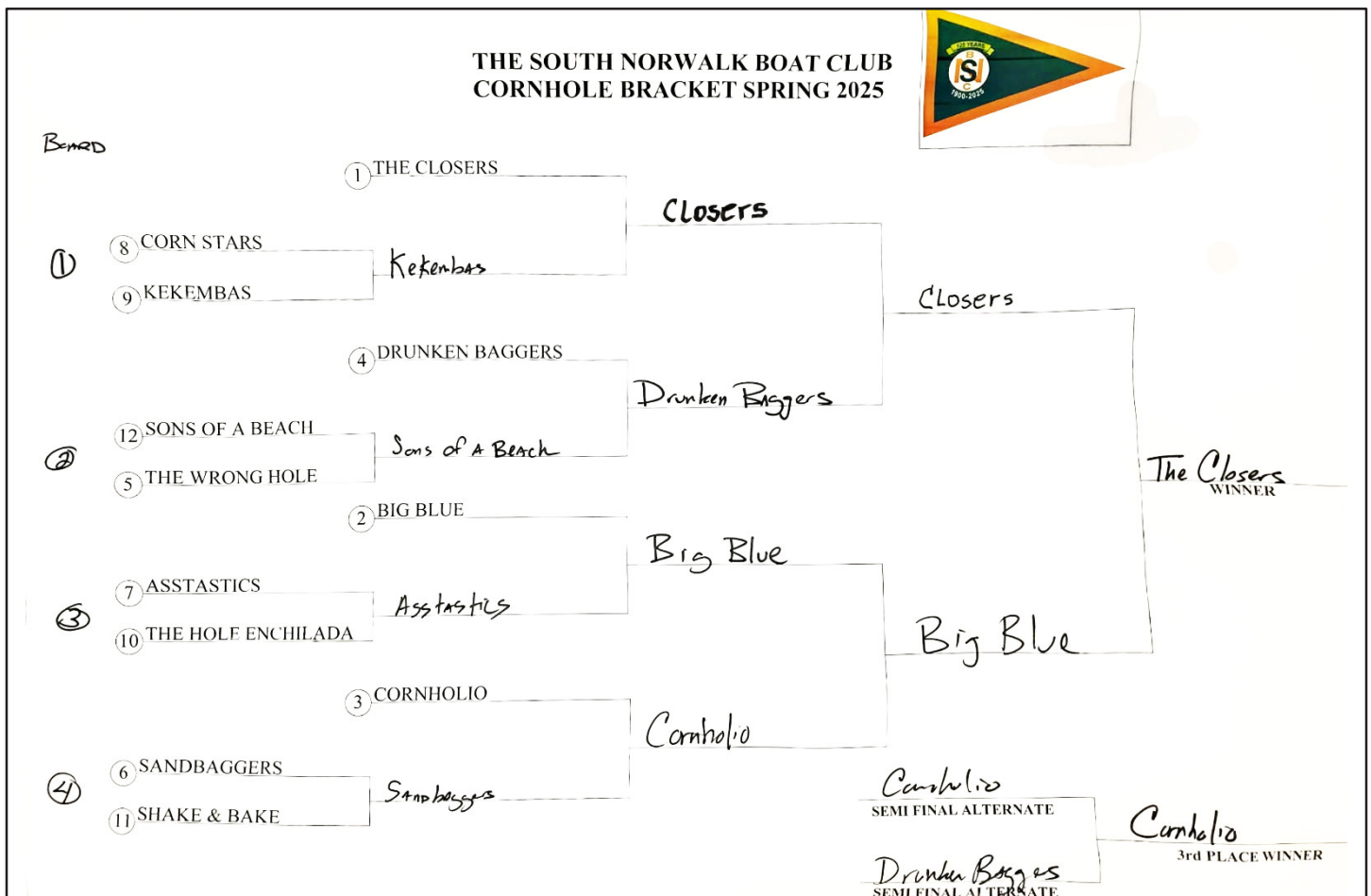

Marina Rules

The boating season begins on April 1 and ends on November 1. Each year, all Captains using the marina facilities agree to the below Marina Rules.

1. The Marina Waiting List is open only to members. The non-refundable application fee for a slip is \$50.00. Only one application may be active per member at any one time.
2. Each boating season, prior to launching a vessel in the marina, every captain assigned a slip shall submit registration and/or vessel documentation that is valid for that season. The certificate of registration or vessel documentation must be in either the captain or the captain and spouse names. Invoices or receipts will not be accepted as valid documentation. Slip assignments are made only to members of SNBC and can only be held in the name of one member. **Boats in violation of this rule must be removed from club property immediately and will be subject to a fine and not permitted to return until in compliance. Penalty may also include the possibility of loss of slip and Marina privileges.**
3. A Certificate of Insurance is required for all boats berthed or stored (wet or dry) on SNBC property. This coverage will include at least \$300,000.00 per incident of liability coverage and name South Norwalk Boat Club as additional insured. This coverage will be maintained for the entire boating season. It is the responsibility of all Captains to ensure that their insurance policy on file with the Club is up to date at all times. Insurance bills, invoices or incomplete insurance policies will not be accepted as proof of insurance. **Boats in violation of this rule must be removed from club property immediately and will be subject to a fine and not permitted to return until in compliance. Penalty may also include the possibility of loss of slip and Marina privileges.**
4. All registration and insurance documentation must be submitted through the Online Mooring system. **Documentation left at the Club will not be accepted.**
5. The occupant of a slip will be identified by an identification plate, supplied and installed by the Marina Committee. Slip assignments are not permanent and may be changed at the discretion of the Marina Committee at any time. The Marina Committee may permit a slip to be temporarily occupied at any time.
6. Captains with assigned slips shall not tie up to the connecting ramps or floats for more than thirty minutes without the express approval of the Marina Committee.
7. No boats shall tie up to the connecting ramps or floats overnight without the express approval of the Marina Committee. All boats (temporarily docked, transient, etc.) must check in at the bar and provide contact information while tied up. Prior approval is required.
8. Slips assigned in the spring for the upcoming boating season must be occupied no later than June 1st. If the Captain will not be using their slip for the season, the Marina Committee must be notified before June 1st. The slip must also be occupied by the Captain by June 1 of the following boating season. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of the slip. There will be no exceptions to this rule unless circumstances are submitted in writing and approved by the Marina Committee.
9. The maximum length of boats permitted in slips inside the marina is 42 feet. The maximum length of boats permitted in slips on the outside of the "T" ramps at the end of the floats is 55 feet overall on B, C, and D docks and 50 feet on A dock. The maximum length of boats permitted on the cross ramp is 50 feet.
10. Members may be assigned up to two slips but may only have their name placed on the waiting list for one slip at a time. The purpose of this rule is to permit captains to keep one "large" and one "small" boat in the Marina. A large boat is defined as being no smaller than 32 feet. A small boat is defined as being no larger than 21 feet.
11. If the Commodore of the SNBC does not have an assigned slip, and if a temporary slip is available, he will have first priority for a temporary assignment.
12. Captains are personally responsible for the integrity of their vessels. Sunken vessels must immediately be removed from the marina. The Captain of a sunken vessel shall also be responsible for any and all damage caused by the sunken vessel, including but not limited to environmental contamination.
13. All marina equipment will only be operated by members so designated by the Marina Committee.
14. Sailboats must secure stays, etc., to prevent slapping.
15. Dock box Policy:
 - a. Members may have dock boxes only with prior approval from the Marina Committee. Approved dock boxes must be the standard small white model measuring **24" inches high x 54 inches wide x 22 inches deep**. No other dock boxes will be permitted.
 - b. Dock boxes are permitted only in the following locations:
 - North Side of A dock
 - South Side of B Dock
 - North Side of C Dock
 - North Side of D Dock
 - c. Note that certain slips may not qualify for dock box installation due to utility access requirements, safety

- considerations, or other operational needs as determined by the Marina Committee.
- d. All dock boxes must be approved, installed, and removed by the Marina Committee.
 - e. The Committee reserves the right to remove any dock box at any time if deemed necessary for marina operations, maintenance, safety or compliance with marina rules.
 - f. Any locks may be cut from dock boxes if removal is necessary at any time.
 - g. A \$125.00 installation fee will be charged for each approved dock box installation. No member may install or relocate a dock box independently.
 - h. Members are solely responsible for the purchase, maintenance, repair and overall condition of their dock boxes.
16. ALL mooring lines, shore power cables, hoses, etc. must be removed from the docks at the end of the boating season. The Marina Committee is not responsible for the loss of any items left behind.
17. Outboard motorboats must have at least two fenders of adequate size out when moored.
18. Mooring lines must be of equal or greater strength than those of nylon for the following categories of boats:
- i. Boats up to 17': 3/8" nylon line
 - j. Boats 18' to 27': 1/2" nylon line
 - k. Boats 28' to 37': 5/8" nylon line
 - l. Boats 37' and up: 3/4" nylon line
 - m. Lines must be replaced by the captain when necessary. Each captain is ultimately responsible for securing and fending their own boat. All captains will be held responsible for any damage to the marina or other boats caused by that captain's boat.
19. Transient slip fees are as follows: Members: \$3.00/foot per night; (first night free) Non-members: \$5.00/foot per night. Maximum stay is six nights. All transient boats using shore power will be charged an additional \$10.00 per night.
20. Boats may not be left in the parking lot or area of the small boat lift without the approval of the Marina committee.
21. The following prohibitions apply to the marina and/or yard:
- a. Hoses or cables are not to be hung from light stanchions that are not equipped to receive them, and any hoses and cables must be hung on the outboard side of the docks.
 - b. Hydro-hoists are not permitted.
 - c. Unsafe operation of a boat.
 - d. Swimming.
 - e. Bare feet on the docks.
 - f. The recreational use of paddle boards, kayaks, canoes, etc, in the fairways.
 - g. Pets without a leash.
 - h. Discarding any refuse. Holding tanks (marine sanitation devices) must be pumped out at an approved pumping station or by a licensed pump-out vessel and all Federal, State and City ordinances must be observed.
 - i. Transfer of fuel from one container to another. Refueling on the premises or docks.
 - j. Keeping of fish, bait, or gasoline in lockers.
 - k. Use of a toilet or head, unless the vessel is equipped with Federal, State and City approved facilities.
 - l. Cleaning of fish in the marina, or in the yard.
 - m. Open flames.
 - n. Welding or spray painting of vessels.
 - o. Permanent anti-freeze may not be used to winterize engines, freshwater systems, heads, etc.
 - p. Children under twelve are not permitted on the docks without direct parental supervision.
 - q. Personal watercraft (jet skis, etc. may not be left in the water in the marina).
 - r. No more than one boat, including tenders, dinghies, etc. may occupy a slip.
 - s. Commercial revenue generated by the use of boats in the marina.
 - t. Portable heaters or other types of heating units are not to be used on Club property, including the docks.
 - u. Lithium-ion battery systems shall not be used on Club property.
 - v. Electric boats and motors are not permitted on Club property.
 - w. No grilling in the marina

STORAGE RULES

1. Only boats assigned a permanent slip qualify for winter dry storage in the yard. (All winter storage and haul out contracts must be submitted by October first.)
2. Boats blocked in the yard must be stabilized by the use of boat stands. Cradles and other types of blocking are not permitted. Use of South Norwalk Boat Club ladders are prohibited.
3. Any Captain requesting a move of their boat prior to April 1 of each year is subject to a fine at the discretion of the Marina Committee.
4. Any Captain's boat that needs to be moved after April 1 of each year due to the boat not being ready for launch is subject to a fine at the discretion of the Marina Committee.

5. Power to boats in winter dry storage shall not be left plugged in overnight. Shore power cords and/or extension cords must not be left on the ground when not in use.
6. The boat owner is responsible for electrical use charges incurred by a boat in wet storage.
7. All winter covers must be removed by the second weekend in April.
8. There is no empty trailer storage in the yard without the consent of the Marina Committee. Any trailers left overnight will be removed at the owner's expense and subject to a fine at the discretion of the Marina Committee.
9. Any boat stored on a trailer in the yard is subject to an additional fee.
10. The storage area around each boat must be kept clean and all refuse must be put into the containers provided for this purpose. **Sandblasting, welding and spray-painting** are prohibited during the storage season and require prior approval from the Marina Committee Chairman at all other times. Violation of this rule is subject to a fine at the discretion of the Marina Committee.
11. All boats must be removed from the yard by June 1. Boats left in the yard after this date will be moved at the owner's expense.
12. Captains with boats in wet storage who do not have an assigned slip must remove their boats from the Marina by April 1. Captains with boats in wet storage who do have an assigned slip must relocate into their assigned slip by April 1.
13. The Marina is not a storage area for "derelict" boats. The Marina Committee will alert any owner of a boat they intend to designate "derelict". The Marina Committee will consult with the Board of Governors in designating a boat "derelict". The owner of a boat designated "derelict" shall have one month to remove the boat from the Marina. By this action, the slip thus vacated is forfeited by the Captain to whom it was assigned and made available for permanent reassignment.
14. No outside contractors will be allowed on the premises without providing the required Certificate of Liability Insurance and approval of the Marina Committee.
15. Utilities on the docks (electric, water, etc.) may be shut down at the discretion of the Club at any time.
16. During the course of the year, all Captains must utilize their assigned slip for a minimum of 30 days per season unless other arrangements have been made with the Marina Committee.
17. No slips or vessels without shore power connections or stanchions are permitted to be plugged in overnight.

Violators of these rules are subject to disciplinary action, including **monetary fines and/or** the loss of Marina privileges. We welcome and appreciate your cooperation in observing the letter and spirit of these regulations. The Marina Committee shall be responsible for enforcing these rules. Serious violations will be referred to the Board of Governors for further disciplinary action. Any exceptions requested by a captain to these Marina Rules must be in writing and approved by the Marina Committee. **All violations shall be assessed at \$150.00 unless otherwise specified.**
