

Meeting Minutes: UPRT Network Board Meeting

Date: January 22, 2026

Theme: The Pursuit of Excellence

Attendees: Pete (Chair), King, Lambo, Jeff, and other board members (Rob and John absent/proxy).

1. Opening & Strategic Vision

Pete introduced the 2026 guiding principle: "**The Pursuit of Excellence.**" This branding will be integrated into all UPRTN social media and communications to establish the network as a leader in General Aviation safety.

Top Three Priorities for Q1 2026:

1. **Full Board Accreditation:** All board members must transition from "provisional" to "fully accredited" status by **March 1, 2026.**
 2. **Membership Infrastructure:** Scaling the network to handle the recent doubling in size.
 3. **Data & Surveys:** Launching the safety surveys to build a database that the **NTSB** and **AOPA** have expressed direct interest in reviewing for Washington D.C. influence.

2. Financial & Systems Update

- **Treasury:** The checking account sits at **\$2,609.00.** Lambo's contact (Karen) is formalizing the non-profit budget and tax filing paperwork.
 - **Membership Software:** The board voted to approve a new management portal (\$313-\$325/year). This system will handle automated payments, member tracking, and a website portal.
 - **Survey Monkey:** The board approved **\$365/year** for Survey Monkey to facilitate the collection of client safety data and recovery metrics.

3. Membership & Branding

- **New Members:** Jeremy Millet (Australia) was voted in as a provisional accredited member. Several instructors from Tennessee Flight Training are also joining as APIs.
- **Logo Design:** King presented several drafts (wings, shields, and "swoop" designs).
 - **Decision:** The "Wing" logo was favored for apparel. King will upload top candidates to the drive for a final vote.
- **Outreach:** Pete and Cuckoo are pursuing speaking slots at **Air Venture 2026.** Jeff is

drafting a standardized slide deck for the network to ensure a unified message.

4. Training & Accreditation Standards

A debate was held regarding the hierarchy of instructor levels:

- **SAI vs. API:** The board discussed whether a **Spin Accredited Instructor (SAI)** should have the authority to accredit an **Accredited Primary Instructor (API)**.
 - **The Consensus:** While the board wants to grow the network, they must avoid the "watered-down" nature of current industry endorsements.
 - **Action:** Tabled until a **Minimum Standards Checklist** is created (referencing AC 61-67 and the ACS) to ensure SAI-led training remains rigorous.
