- Nassar Beydoun a candidate for US Senate was removed from the ballot as he used a P.O. Box for his address instead of his home address on nomination petitions. This goes against election rules.
- 2. There were 272,000 new jobs in May primarily in health care, business, government, leisure and hospitality. Unemployment was less than 4% for the last four months. Inflation is down 60% from its peak and incomes are up more than prices. Who says Biden is not doing a good job?
- 3. Citizens For Local Choice could not get enough signatures for

- their ballot initiative to overturn a new MI law about clean energy and the Michigan government role in decision making, it will not be on the 2024 ballot (Flint Journal 6/5/24)
- 4. The US Supreme Court did not impose restrictions on a key abortion drug. The next president could choose to impose restrictions on mifepristone (drug used for 60% of abortions) or even take the drug off the market. How will you vote?

### US Senate GOP Defeat IVF Protections - Twice!

Twice this month, Republican troglodytes in the US Senate have defeated measures to give federal protection to the many health care needs related to in-vitro fertilization and the life giving hope that IVF brings to many couples and individuals who are otherwise unable to conceive a child. The Democratic sponsored legislation also included protections for emergency contraception pills which were called by Republicans "radical threats to human life".

While Republicans claim there is no threat to IVF services, they choose to ignore the Republican court in Alabama that ruled IVF services were illegal and banned them in that state until the legislature quickly enacted limited new legislation.

Every person who cares about the ability of couples and individuals to have a child but is unable to conceive must care about this legislation and be voting this November for candidates in the Democratic Party who defend, protect and shield these services from Republican attacks.
