Section I. Teaching

GOAL: Teach ED 310 Children's Literature and ED 315 Kindergarten/Primary K-4 Methods.

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal met/exceeded.

This past academic year, I taught both courses, ED 310 and ED 315 fall and spring semester. I also had the opportunity to teach two sections of ED 414 Foundations in Education spring semester. Goals met in my teaching endeavors include the following:

- Reviewed course evaluations and students' self evaluations to make necessary changes in readings, assignments and syllabi for winter semester. These evaluations were predominately positive overall. Based on my students' input in the fall, I changed the spring semester textbook in my ED 315 course, curated files in D2L Brighspace Content, and integrated even more technology into instruction, such as Animoto, PowToon, Kahoot, Quizzes, Survey Monkey and Today's Meet. Additionally, Seesaw, Flipgrid and Thinglink, were overwhelmingly noted as positive learning experiences that would be used in my Block 2 students' future classrooms. The apps that I chose to infuse with my instruction, offered opportunities for choice, creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and communication.
- Observed students as they construct knowledge in a collaborative and social learning environment.
- Used formative assessments to inform planning and instruction.
- Incorporated and modeled student-centered teaching strategies/scaffolding, while using the gradual release model (I do. We do. You do.).
- Selected textbooks, journal articles, readings and assignments to support learning.
- Designed cohesive and organized courses with clear assignment details and due dates.
- Incorporated technology related activities to better prepare our students for teaching and communicating in an app driven world.
- Created a firm, yet safe, culturally responsive learning environment to maximize student learning using Responsive Classroom/Morning Meeting classroom management techniques.
- Embedded conversations that will encourage student growth in professional dispositions.
- Collaborated with Molly Vogt in preparation for the students' Block 1 field experiences.
- Collaborated with Jane Gottfried to ensure that our students are learning about purposeful educational technology and the value of a positive digital footprint.
- Provided guidance and supervised students during the field experience for Block 1.
- Provided read aloud, guided reading, morning meeting activities and other literacy related opportunities in class to prepare students for their field experience.
- Continued to incorporate new and innovative ideas that I have learned in the K-12 reading certificate program, and PhD C&I graduate program.
- Effected an atmosphere to engage students in the process of thinking critically about policy and social justice issues of the past, present and future.

Section II. Scholarship/Research

GOAL: Submit a proposal for a presentation at a national conference within the next school year and/or submit a peer reviewed article proposal for publication.

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal met.

A manuscript is in progress and on schedule for summer 2018 submission deadline, with *The Reading Teacher* peer-reviewed journal. This work is created in collaboration with my NMSU committee chairperson, Dr. Mary Fahrenbruck. The purpose of this research study was to explore preservice teacher attitudes toward technology infused literacy instruction and the implications for teaching and learning in teacher education.

GOAL: Continue on-going research in preparation for my upcoming doctoral comprehensive exams, dissertation writing/work in literacy, language, & culture, and educational technologies.

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal met.

My written comprehensive exams are scheduled for May 21-28, 2018 and oral exams are scheduled for the week of June 11th. A draft of my dissertation proposal is completed and I will be submitting the proposal and IRB by the end of summer semester 2018.

GOAL: Attend and participate in SCSU sponsored seminars and events that will allow me to better serve my Block 1 students.

This year I was predominately focused on attending SCSU workshops/meetings/events that helped me glean new scaffolding strategies to best assist students with technology integration and the edTPA.

GOAL: Continue to co-teach and research technology infused literacy instruction, while working with my dissertation chair and preservice teachers at New Mexico State University (NMSU).

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal met/exceeded.

Not only did I co-teach online successfully with my chairperson, Dr. Fahrenbruck, my study became a pilot that is now steering my dissertation and future scholarly work.

GOAL: Learn more about potential available grants and grant writing, with the aim of acquiring new technology to enhance 21st century teaching and learning.

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal in progress.

I will be attending a grant writing workshop this summer while on campus at NMSU.

GOAL: Continue to use technology to improve responsive communication with students via D2L Brightspace and teleconferencing.

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal met.

I used Adobe Connect, Zoom, FaceTime and D2L to connect synchronously with students and advisees.

GOAL: Complete required coursework Spring 2018, in an online synchronous/asynchronous, and face-to-face setting at NMSU's hybrid PhD - Curriculum and Instruction - Graduate Program.

REPORT/REFLECTIVE STATEMENT: Goal met.

My PhD coursework was successfully completed May 9, 2018.

GOAL: Continue work in Co-Teaching to support Teacher Candidates and Cooperating Teachers.

While Jane Gottfried and I discussed and modeled co-teaching in our Block 1 courses, I was not invited to present at any SCSU co-teaching workshops this year.

This past year I stayed connected with innovative educators across the globe in PLNs via podcasts, blogs, and email. I also have been invited to be a *Seesaw* Ambassador and will complete this training summer 2018.

There was a major program change in the elementary education department.
