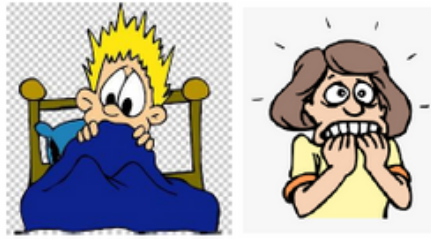


Halloween – Time for Fear and Fright!



A Word Root Lesson on **phob = fear**

Phob is a great word root for Halloween as it means fear or to be afraid. This root produces many words that end in phobe (one who fears) and phobia (fear of ...). See if you can match the person with the fear (Hint: the root odont(o) means “tooth, teeth”):
