Mulligan's Manor is a loving and supportive group home dedicated to at-risk gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning, and heterosexual adolescents ranging from 12 to 17 years old. We are a family-oriented, GBTQA (Gay, Bi-Sexual, Transgender, Questioning, and Ally) community that nurtures and empowers our youth to reach their full potential, as well as provide tools for a safe and healthy life.

A "Mulligan" is known by golfers as a second chance, or a "do-over". Our mission is to give every member of our family the second chance to experience the love and respect he deserves.

HALO is an acronym that stands for Helping Animals Live On. It is a succinct, four-word definition of what we are here for. It is the reason each and every employee and volunteer puts two feet on the ground. It is a passion that goes beyond just loving dogs and cats. It is a driving force in our lives: to make this community, this world, a safe place for homeless pets.

Located in sunny Phoenix, Arizona, HALO Animal Rescue is a safety net for thousands of homeless dogs and cats each year. We are a no-kill facility, which means we never euthanize an animal because we have run out of room., but it also means we are limited in the animals we can take in at any given time. Our specialty is to provide a refuge to those pets who might otherwise be destroyed at other Valley shelters for reasons such as treatable injury, illness or those who are too scared or too young to go up for adoption at their time of arrival. These animals are lovingly cared for while they are prepared for adoption, and then they are adopted into loving homes.





Stealing Hearts Rescue was founded with the goal of making a difference in the lives of large breed shelter dogs. It is our mission to save the lives of many stronger breed dogs that are often overlooked and provide them with the opportunity to become loved and cherished companions. Stealing Hearts strives to save dogs from euthanasia, dogs that other shelters are unable to adopt including sick, pregnant, nursing moms and breeds of dogs often ignored by our communities. We feel as we educate people about these amazing breeds not only do we save that dog's life, the new knowledge acquired by the owner is shared and we are able to reach many more. By saving one, we save many.

Agenda items

The meeting was called to order at 1:02 PM.

From the President

Recognition of lifetime members present, Dan Bartle, Phyllis Ross, and Dan Brown

A moment of silence was held for lifetime member Willie Jaramillo.

It was announced that viewing will be held April 4 from 5-7 pm @ 710 W. Bethany Home Road, and the service will be Wednesday April 5 @ 11:00 a.m. Willies favorite charity was Saint Vincent De Paul, and members were encouraged to donate.

A motion was made by Dan Bartle for LADS to send a \$100.00 plant. There was a second by Jerry Blankenship and the motion passed unanimously.

LADS will be changing the accounting methods to QuickBooks in the near future. QuickBooks are online with discounts for a charity and has multiple logins. Another benefit is that as officers change the authorizations can be changed as well. Carl will have a report on progress at the May meeting.

From Public Relations:

Jim announced that he wants to work with the historian (Doug) and add him as an administrative user which will allow him to upload pictures to the website. Phyllis added that she had numerous photo albums. They will work together to make a historical project for LADS.

Jim is asking for stories and pictures from favorite events to add to the newsletter and the facebook account to generate interest in LADS.

Several members of the board have attempted to update the Bingo License to include more members with no success. The state of Arizona is hard to reach by phone. Further attempts will be made in the near future.

New Business:

Kevin inquired about membership dues, and asked how LADS knew who was up to date and if anyone was delinquent. Carl informed the group that he will send monthly emails to members who are due for their annual renewal
