EXHIBITION STATEMENT

"Roots & Reinventions brings together the Warazi Art Collective in collaboration with Odyssey Collective to explore how contemporary Kenyan artists anchor themselves in heritage while reshaping it through experimental, sustainable, and innovative practice

The exhibition presents a dynamic spectrum of sculpture, woodcut printing, illustration, digital art, interior concepts, bamboo technology, and upcycled design—each offering a distinct response to the question of how tradition can be reimagined today.

From stainless-steel forms forged from everyday cutlery to surreal illustrations infused with cultural symbolism and pioneering bamboo design solutions, the featured works share a fascination with transformation: of materials, of narrative, and of possibility.

The artists approach their roots with deliberate reinvention—reclaiming discarded objects, reframing cultural memory, and proposing new aesthetic and ecological futures.

Together, these voices reflect a modern Africa in motion, where inherited knowledge and contemporary ingenuity continually inform one another. Roots & Reinventions positions Ardhi Gallery as a site of encounter between past and future, inviting viewers to engage with artworks that reshape familiar histories and open space for new imagination.

ARTIST BIO

Lawrence C. N. Mwachiro is a Kenyan visual artist and illustrator based in Nairobi. A graduate of the Buru Buru Institute of Fine Art, his work draws deeply from African culture, heritage, and contemporary social themes. Mwachiro has produced impactful illustrations addressing issues such as domestic violence, post-election trauma, and community healing for Green String Network's Muamko Mpya and Kumekucha projects, as well as visual work for TED Talk x Sprints Climate Change 2025. His artwork has been showcased at prominent spaces including the Railway Museum, the National Museum of Kenya, and the Nairobi Gallery. In addition, he was a participant in the 2019 BIC Africa Competition and exhibited internationally at The Hawke Centre in Australia

ARTIST STATEMENT

"Wahenga na Wahenguzi"—the ancients and the great ancestors—is a series honoring the enduring wisdom of past generations. These portraits blend ritual markings, vibrant flora, birds, and symbolic elements to depict the deep connection between human identity, nature, and ancestral memory. Each figure becomes a living landscape: hair transforms into forests and clouds, markings echo spiritual maps, and surrounding patterns act as portals linking the past and present. Through this fusion of body and environment, the works explore how ancestral knowledge continues to guide and shape us. This series is a visual tribute to those who walked before us—reminding us that their voices, teachings, and energy still live within and around us.





ARTIST BIO



ARTIST STATEMENT

Teddy Ngando (TNN) was born in March 4th 1993 in Kirinyaga County, Kenya. He studied a diploma in interior design at Buru Buru institute of fine arts. Current Secretary and Head of operations at Warazi art collective Organization . He is the founder and executive Director at BAMBE, a bamboo enterprise focusing in beauty accessories. He practices mixed media art in drawing, painting, woodcut printing, sculpture, mosaic art, recycling and photography. He engages in interior design in innovation of sustainable and durable of various house hold accessories. He exploits fashion design in the creation of sustainable beauty accessories. He has exhibited widely in Nairobi where he advocates conservation and sustainability through his various projects. He has exhibited in Kenya over the years at; Kenya National Museum, Nairobi art Gallery, Dari Restaurant, Dusti D2, Bonzo art Gallery, Karen Country Club, International School of Kenya (ISK), Mckinsey&Company, Kioko art Gallery. He has also participated in many local pop up markets: Pop up and chill, Art in the open @ Village Market, Alchemist and others. He has also been involved in community exercises in training the youths and locals in bamboo technology in partnerships with Kenya Forestry Research Institute (KEFRI) and International Bamboo And Rattan Organization (INBAR) He works in a creative collective known as Warazi Art Collective together with other creatives, in mentoring and creating opportunities through Art and Design. Warazi Art Collective is a CBO that was started in 2017 by 10 artists in various fields among fine art, graphic design, interior design, photography, gaming and bamboo technology. He lives at Komarock estate Nairobi.

ARTIST STATEMENT

"Growing up in the rural landscapes of Kerugoya, Kirinyaga County, I was captivated by the rich textures found in nature, trees, stones, and the soil. As a child, my curiosity was especially drawn to sawdust, a byproduct of the frequent tree cutting around our homestead. Fascinated by this material, I began crafting small, imagined homesteads atop the sawdust mounds, using them as playful models of an evolving environment. Years later, this early passion resurfaced in my art practice. I turned to recycling sawdust from my workshop, incorporating it into mixed media paintings. My research led me to the powerful aerial landscape photography of Yann Arthus-Bertrand, whose work profoundly influenced my thematic direction. Inspired by his imagery, I sought to highlight both the fragile beauty of our Earth and the devastating consequences of unconscious deforestation. Over time, I came to see my artworks as vessels for the "resting souls" of trees—the sawdust representing the life force that bleeds when a tree is cut. Repurposing this material allowed me to honor what was lost and breathe new life into the remnants. My journey as a recycling artist also introduced bamboo into my practice—an abundant, sustainable alternative to wood. Today, I integrate bamboo sawdust from my design workshop into my paintings, adding new layers of texture and meaning. Through this work, I hope to inspire both local and international artisans to explore and embrace bamboo as a medium for sustainable creativity and expression. The following mixed media paintings are part of an ongoing series titled Emergence, which I began in 2019. Through this body of

work, I aim to emphasize the evident changes in our climate, reminding us that even

the largest challenges are solved through small, conscious actions."

ARTIST BIO



ARTIST STATEMENT

In this series, Linyerera captures Nairobi in motion the tenderness of everyday labour, the urgency of collective uprising, and the quiet radiance of youth.

Her Walk, His Work places a passing woman beside a cobbler at work, set against an abstracted city. It reflects the dignity of ordinary lives and the journeys that unfold in the margins of the urban day.

Liberation draws from the June 25, 2024 protests, reimagining the young man on a police horse as a symbol of collective imagination. Through abstraction, the moment becomes myth a gesture of courage transformed into shared story..

Moonlight returns to intimacy: a Black girl on a black ground, her smile like a crescent moon and her eyes bright as stars. The painting honours joy as resistance, and the quiet hope that follows struggle.


Together, the three works trace a narrative of labour, rupture, and renewal a city where the ordinary and the transformative coexist, shaping futures from the ground up




ARTIST BIO

He works as a self-employed graphic designer, producing brand identities, visual communication materials, and creative solutions for a wide range of clients. He is a graduate of the Buru Buru Institute of Fine Arts, holding a Diploma in Art and Design with a specialization in Graphic Design. Stephen is also the founder of Wafrka, a screenprinting brand through which he creates original posters and apparel that highlight contemporary urban culture and African identity. In addition to his design practice, he contributes to digital storytelling as a content creator for Hii Story Channel, blending visual design with narrative and cultural research. As the Assistant Chairman of Warazi Art Collective, Stephen plays an important role in coordinating projects, supporting artists, and fostering collaboration within the group. His work across print, apparel, digital media, and community-focused art reflects his commitment to creative innovation, cultural expression, and accessible design.

ARTIST STATEMENT

The question of why God is often referred to as "He" while nature is called "Mother" sparks curiosity in Steve. This inquiry led to a study of women, particularly the contrast between the traditional and modern African woman. Women possess an innate power, a force capable of transforming the Earth into a better place when they fully understand their potential. Inspired by this realization, attention was drawn to three remarkable African women who have left an indelible mark on the world through their inspiring actions: the late Prof. Wangari Maathai, Ellen Johnson Sir leaf, and Miriam Makeba. To honor their legacies and raise awareness, a series of three art prints was created. These works aim to inspire not only women but all individuals to pursue purposeful lives. The art highlights that achieving one's dreams is simple in concept but often fraught with challenges. Curved lines within the pieces symbolize the obstacles these women faced on their journeys, serving as a reminder of the resilience required to make a meaningful impact.

His sculptures often carry subtle narratives figures frozen in motion, gestures of unity, or symbolic pursuits inviting viewers to see beauty and meaning in the overlooked. Through his work, Oliver celebrates sustainability and creativity as acts of renewal, using metal not only as a medium of permanence but also as a metaphor for human strength and transformation.
