A New Way to Win - With A Tournament Cause to Help Others



Daily events under the **WNESC** “Worlds New Era of Sports Competitions” organization in preliminary development supporting GOLF programs and other sports soon.

Purpose & Benefits: The purpose of the **WNESC** is to support strategies to acquire funding for non-profits groups from golf enthusiasts who love to play golf in whatever capacity they can. Enhancing their own health and fitness activities, instead of sitting at a screen via other virtual sports tournaments. While providing a percentage of their entry fees as donations funding for non-profit golf organizations that need financial support to help others.

Financing Strategy & Funding Allotment:



Tournament Participants: Payout of all funds collected to the teams based on participation involved in an event a percentage of team payouts ranking position based on final placements or ties will be distributed. **Range of payout 25-35% of total funds collected.**

Non-Profit Organization Donations: A minimum of 50% of funds as a donation to one or multiple non-profit golf-related organizations to be used for grants, clinics, equipment etc.

WNESC Operations Support Max of 15% for operations, new development, data architecture, cyber-security, app enhancements, fund management and allocation etc.

Golf Tournament Structure: Based on tournament set up and non-profit organizations identified for donations. Tournament entry fees will be pre-determined in marketing efforts for a tournament event. An infinite number of registered golfers on the same day can involve golfers of all abilities, ages and gender to participate who have a current USGA handicap.

Golfers' sign-up for the tournament by submitting an entry fee managed by Stripe Financial Services. Competing in the event to conquer with others as a virtual team member playing on their own course against other teams comprised with team members across the country.

How Are Teams Selected? Team members are **randomly selected by an AI algorithm** for team selection based on registered golfers' handicaps. All tournaments will be set up for a **team of 4 golfers and to be balanced each team will have an ABCD level player** to ensure all teams are equitable to compete against each other.

How Does Everyone Play Without Contacting Each Other?

The preliminary data architecture can handle up to 5000 golfers daily 7– days a week. Expansion of daily volume of golfers will be updated for data storage as interest grows. Golfers can play on their own course tournaments or a game with a friend at the same time they participate in a WNESC sponsored tournament. The only requirement for a **WNESC Tournament** is that a golfer registered in the tournament must play a round that provides a **NET SCORE** for 18 holes.

Score Entry All scores will be updated on the golfers USGA Handicap Index, on the date they participated. In the future, if enough interest 9-hole tournaments can take place as well as other tournament formats that can be played with virtual team members.

Logistics: Because of multiple Time Zone that teams maybe comprised of. All participants must have uploaded their NET SCORE automatically calculated by the USGA Handicap Index and verified before entry by 11:00 PM Eastern Standard Time, on the day of the event.

What About False Entries? The final analysis of the score entered will identify any discrepancies or trends of current USGA Handicap to score entered before player assigned on a team. If score is flagged, a penalty will be added pursuant to the rules and guidelines of the tournament operations and registration policies before entering a tournament the golfer needs to agree to.

Next Steps-How Do to Get Involved?

This is a collaborative effort working with other groups behind the scenes to make this vision a reality. Helping Hands Golf Resources is leading this effort and managing operations, design of user interface and testing of this new model of interactive golf tournaments.

HHGR is looking for individual golfers, golf courses, community programs, golf organizations to take part in beta testing of the tournaments system.
