- On the third Sunday of each month, Eucharistic Ministers should bring their communion kits to the altar to be blessed and serviced for communion visitations. Blessings will occur after communion has been administered and the altar is cleaned.
- All communion kits should be well stocked with host, wine, and blessed oil.
- For all communion visits, Deacons and Eucharistic Ministers are asked to deliver a current bulletin and offering envelope to the communicant.
- There should always be two or more that accompany each other on communion calls. Always contact those on the visitation list prior to the call and report any cares or concerns to the Priest-in-Charge.
