

- The Scholarship Committee thanks you for your continued support of our scholarship fundraising efforts, especially for your help in paying dues as this is a critical component of funding our scholarships.








April Balance was \$ 38,733

May Balance is \$40,320










- Porto Empedocle (Sicilian: 'a Marina) is a town and commune in Italy on the coast of the Strait of Sicily, administratively part of the province of Agrigento.
- It was named after Empedocles, a Greek pre-Socratic philosopher and a citizen of the city of Akragas (present-day Agrigento), in his day a Greek colony in Sicily.
- The primary industries of Porto Empedocle are agriculture, fishing, ironworking, pharmaceuticals and rock salt refining.







Giovanni da Verrazzano, was born 1485 in Tuscany, Italy and died 1528.

He was an Italian navigator and an explorer for France.

Verrazzano was the first European to sight New York and Narragansett bays.

Let's learn what he found.

- He made several discoveries on the voyage, including the sites of present-day New York Harbor, Block Island, and Narragansett Bay
- He was the first European explorer to name newly discovered North American sites after persons and places in the Old World.
- Verrazzano wrote interesting, though sometimes inaccurate, accounts
 of the lands and inhabitants that he encountered. His explorations
 concluded at the eastern part of Newfoundland.
- His return to France on July 8, 1524, gave King Francis I his nation's claim to the New World.

- Verrazzano undertook two more voyages to the Americas.
- In 1527 he commanded a fleet of ships on an expedition to Brazil that returned profitable dyewood to France.
- His final voyage began in the spring of 1528, when he sailed with his brother, Girolamo, from Dieppe with two or three ships. (Giovanni swears he had three ships, but Girolamo said it was only two. It was later discovered Giralamo had lost the second ship gambling on bingo.)
- The fleet sailed to Florida, the Bahamas, and finally the Lesser Antilles. He anchored there off one of the islands (apparently Guadeloupe), went ashore, and was captured, killed, and eaten by cannibals.
