#### **IACC Meeting Minutes**



#### October 2, 2023



Mike Palmieri called the meeting to order at 7 pm. He opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and then everyone sang God Bless America. Sal Saladini was ill and not present, so no Italian city was presented.

Mike thanked the CWAG group for all their efforts and reminded everyone that CWAG has a Go Fund Me for donations if interested. He also announced that at the November meeting there will be elections for President, Vice President and Treasurer. Marian Zotti and Annette Martino will take names for the election. He thanked everyone for the many donated items and cash for the Manville Food Pantry and noted that the pantry will be taking donations of turkeys, etc. for the holidays.

Ann Allevi read the Invocation in Sal Saladini's absence. Ann read the minutes of the June meeting.

Steve Selvaggio announced the balance in our treasury last year at this time was \$13,194. Today's balance is \$20,099. He noted largest expenditures and dollars in. Mike spoke about the Bingo, 50/50 fundraising issue and said the CW Board will be applying for a license.

Debbie Stone gave the membership update. We currently have 483 paid members and 49 honorary members for a total of 532 members. She announced 23 new members since June...none were present. Club dues are \$25 for new members and \$20 for renewals and are due in January.

We saw a special video created by Steve of all of our recent events/trips with huge applause at the end. Steve thanked everyone for their photos, especially Charlie Inghilterra.

Mike asked for people to sign up to bring desserts to the next meeting and announced 3 flyers will be available or sign up tonight.

We then sang That's Amore and Mike adjourned the meeting at 7:55 pm. Next meeting will be on November 6th.





- 1. Bisceglie is a city and municipality of 55,000 inhabitants in the province of Barletta-Andria-Trani, in the Apulia region (Italian: Puglia), in southern Italy.
- 2. Bisceglie is a fishing port and seaside resort and also produces wine, olive oil and furniture.
- 3. The area has been inhabited since prehistoric times, with at least two caves showing evidence of occupation during the Neolithic era.
- 4. The Romans called the place Vigiliae, from the watchtowers that were used there in guarding the coast. Examples of 11th- and 12th-century Romanesque-Apulian architecture include the cathedral and the Church of Santa Margherita.

5. Neanderthal people inhabited caves in the area. **Evidence of human activity is** found in numerous stone weapons and tools, remains of animals of extinct species such as prehistoric lions, bears, oxen and horses, remains of animals of remote species like rhinoceros, hyena, and deer, and the curved human femur typical of a **Neanderthal man found in** the grotto of Santa Croce.

6. In the Bronze Age, impressive grave-altars called dolmens were built in the area.



**Bisceglie Cathedral** was started in 1073, and dedicated to, Saint Peter. Building was completed in 1295

7. The modern history of the city starts in the 11th century. In this period the worship of Saints Maurus, Sergius and Pantalemon was introduced, and they became the new patron saints of Bisceglie.


8. In 1167 Bishop Amando ordered the transportation of the sacred relics, to within the city walls where the cathedral building had been completed.

Around that time watchtowers were built. Some surviving examples can be found in the Gavetino tower, the tower of Sant'Antonio and the Zappino tower.



The Church of St Audoin (Italian: Chiesa di Sant'Adoeno) is an 11th-century church in Bisceglie.

The church is named for the Frankish bishop and saint **Audoin**.

# A peek into CALABRIA



The "toe"
of the
Italian
"boot"



The region of Calabria consists of 5 provinces, they are <u>Catanzaro</u>, Cosenza, Crotone, Reggio di Calabria, and <u>Vibo Valentia</u>.

**Catanzaro** is the capital city with a population of approximately 89,000.

Sometimes referred to as the "toe" of the Italian "boot," Calabria is a peninsula of irregular shape, jutting out from the main body of Italy and separating the Tyrrhenian and Ionian seas. Most of the region is mountainous or hilly.

It was the **Byzantines**, in the 3RD century who are credited with naming the area Calabria.

Calabria was a <u>stronghold</u> of Italian republicanism until the <u>Risorgimento</u> (movement for political unity) and became part of Italy after the 1860 expedition of the nationalist leader <u>Giuseppe Garibaldi</u>, (who I was reminded was born n Sadinia.)

The mainstay of Calabria's economy, despite the small lowland area, is farming, which was once characterized by large, landed estates (latifundia) and tiny peasant holdings. Under the Italian <a href="mailto:land:reform">land:reform</a>, the majority of the former latifundia were broken up after 1951 and new, small peasant holdings created, with rural service centers, new houses, and new roads.

Calabrian agriculture concentrated almost entirely on cereals, olives, and the raising of sheep and goats, with occasional work in the forests of the Sila uplands.

The region was long one of the poorest areas in Italy because of its eroded soils and scanty cultivation of them. But the land reforms of the 1950s and subsequent government investment introduced new and more profitable commercial crops, such as citrus fruits (mostly on the west coast), figs, and chestnuts. The government also promoted the development of resorts and recreational areas for tourists in suitable spots along the coasts.

Despite these changes the local Calabrian Mafia, called the 'ndrangheta', persists, and its long-established practice of kidnapping was a model for similar acts by others which plagued Italy during the 1970s.


The region's economic development is still hindered by rugged terrain, frequent earthquakes, and poor communications, and there is very little industry of any importance.

Hydroelectric power was developed in La Sila in the 1920s and '30s and is now an important feature of the Calabrian economy, supplying power for electric railways and the chemical industries at Crotone. Catanzaro, the regional capital (1971), Reggio di Calabria, and Cosenza are the only cities of any size.

Calabria is one of the few areas of southern Italy that has a non-Italian minority: a substantial number of Albanians fled the Turkish <u>conquest</u> of their homeland in the 15th and 16th centuries and settled there.

They have retained their use of the <u>Albanian language</u>, the Greek Orthodox rite in their churches, and, on occasion, their colourful national costumes.


In area it measures about 5,823 square miles (15,080 square km) with a population of approximately Pop. (2006 est.) 2,004,415.
