
Fieldwork Update.



Field work is underway as another spring is upon us. Harrowing is underway throughout the area as producers are looking to seal in moisture and fill in cracks in the soil in preparation of seeding. Speaking of seeding, reports are coming in of peas already in the ground in the Boyer area. My travels took me to Fairview last weekend, where seeding of canola and peas is underway.



Agronomic Initial Visits



In my first scouting visits to your farm, I will perform and initial field assessment looking for any early season weeds requiring a pre-seed burn off application, as well as collecting some general information on any tillage done, your seeding practices, and fertility program. If you've happened to have already seeded, then I will monitor any



emergence information as well. This information is designed to help me to provide you with the best agronomic recommendations based on your farming practices. I will begin these visits next week.

Moisture



Soil Moisture conditions are holding on for right now. However recent hot, dry and windy days have had an impact on the surface moisture. While that is good for draining and drying out low spots, current soil reserves will not be enough to sustain us through the growing season.

Last September was very dry, which greatly benefitted harvest, soil moisture reserves were low going into winter. The we only received 60% of the normal snowpack, so will most of the snow melt went directly into the soil, soil moisture conservation should be a priority until we get that 2 day soaker.
