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RESIDENTIAL LEASE AGREEMENT

The word "Landlord" as used in this Lease means all of the landlords above listed. In all instances in which the Landlord may exercise rights or perform obligations under this Lease, it may do so through its authorized agents or representatives.

The word "Tenant" as used in this Lease means all of the tenants above listed.

1. CONDOMINIUM/CO-OPERATIVE RIGHT OF TERMINATION: (The following statement generally, as required by law, must be included in a lease for a condominium or cooperative unit.) THIS BUILDING IS BEING CONVERTED TO OR IS A CONDOMINIUM OR COOPERATIVE. YOUR TENANCY CAN BE TERMINATED UPON 60 DAYS NOTICE IF YOUR APARTMENT IS SOLD TO A BUYER WHO SEEKS TO PERSONALLY OCCUPY IT. IF YOU MOVE OUT AS A RESULT OF RECEIVING SUCH A NOTICE, AND THE LANDLORD ARBITRARILY FAILS TO COMPLETE THE SALE, THE LANDLORD SHALL BE LIABLE FOR TREBLE DAMAGES AND COURT COSTS.

2. PROPERTY: The Tenant agrees to lease from the Landlord and the Landlord agrees to lease to the Tenant (the single family home) (apartment # 12) (condominium unit #) (townhouse unit #) having a street address of 3624-44 Atlantic Brigantine Blvd located in Brigantine, New Jersey (referred to as the "Property").

39 3. **TERM:** The Term of this Lease is for 12 months (months) (years) starting on 1st
40 July, 2023 and ending on June 30, 2024. This is referred to
41 as the "Term". If the Landlord is unable to give possession of the Property to the Tenant on the first day of the Term, the Landlord shall
42 not have any liability to the Tenant. However, the Tenant shall not be liable for the payment of rent until the Landlord gives possession of
43 the Property to the Tenant. If the Landlord fails to give possession of the Property within 30 days of the start date set forth above, then
44 the Tenant may terminate this Lease by giving notice to Landlord. If the first day of the Term is delayed, then the last day of the Term
45 shall be adjusted accordingly, so that the Term remains for the number of months or years above stated.

47 4. **RENT:** The rent for the Term of this Lease is \$ 15,000.00, to be paid as follows: \$ 1,250.00 per month, which is
48 due on the 1st day of each month. Rent shall be payable to: Cane Management LLC, 819 N Park Ave., Norristown,

51 5. **INITIAL DEPOSIT:** Tenant has paid an initial deposit of \$ _____ received on _____ that will
52 be credited towards _____ the first month's rent or _____ the Security Deposit. The balance shall be paid as
53 follows: First month's rent \$ 1,250.00 Due on June 26, 2023, Security Deposit \$ 1,875.00 Due on
54 June 26, 2023.

55
56 6. **SECURITY DEPOSIT:** The Tenant shall pay to the Landlord the sum of \$ 1,875.00 (the "Security Deposit" which cannot
57 exceed one and one-half months rent) to assure that the Tenant performs all of the Tenant's obligations under this Lease. If the
58 Landlord collects any additional Security Deposit, the additional security collected annually shall not be greater than ten (10) percent of the
59 current Security Deposit. Landlord shall comply with the Rent Security Deposit Act, N.J.S.A. 46:8-19 et seq. (the "Act"), unless this Lease
60 is for owner-occupied Property with not more than two (2) rental units or is a seasonal tenancy of not more than 125 consecutive days. Any
61 attempt to waive the requirements of the Act is prohibited and void as a matter of law.

62 The Act requires depositing the Security Deposit into a banking institution or investment company in New Jersey and notifying the Tenant in
63 writing of the name and address of the banking institution or investment company, the type of account in which the Security Deposit is deposited
64 or invested (for example, interest bearing or money market), the amount of the Security Deposit, and the current rate of interest for the account
65 within thirty (30) days of each of the following: (a) the Landlord's receipt of the Security Deposit from the Tenant; (b) the Landlord moving the deposit
66 from one institution or fund to another (unless the move is due to a merger, in which case a notice to the Tenant must be within thirty (30) days of receipt
67 of notice by the Landlord of the merger if the merger occurs more than sixty (60) days prior to the annual interest payment); or (c) the transfer or convey-
68 ance of ownership or control of the Property. Such notice also must be provided at the time of each annual interest payment. All interest earned
69 on the Security Deposit shall be paid to the Tenant in cash or be credited toward the payment of rent due under this Lease upon the anniversary
70 date of this Lease, the renewal of the Term or on January 31, if the Landlord gives the Tenant written notice that interest will be paid on January 31.

71
72 The Act also provides that, if the Landlord sells or conveys the Property during the Term of this Lease, the Landlord will transfer
73 the Security Deposit plus the undistributed interest to the new owner. The Landlord shall notify the Tenant of the sale or conveyance, as
74 well as the name and address of the new owner. The notice shall be given by registered or certified mail within five days after conveyance
75 of title. After acquisition of the Property, the new owner shall be liable for investing the Security Deposit, making all interest payments,
76 giving all notices and returning the Security Deposit as required under the Act, even if the Landlord fails to transfer the Security Deposit.

77
78 The Landlord shall inspect the Property after the Tenant vacates at the end of the Term. Within thirty (30) days of the termination of this
79 Lease, the Landlord shall return the Security Deposit plus the undistributed interest to the Tenant, less any charges expended by the Land-
80 lord for damages to the Property resulting from the Tenant's occupancy. The interest and deductions shall be itemized in a statement by
81 the Landlord, and shall be forwarded to the Tenant with the balance of the Security Deposit by personal delivery, or registered or certified
82 mail. The Security Deposit may not be used by the Tenant for the payment of rent without the written consent of the Landlord.

83
84 7. **LATE PAYMENT PENALTY:** If the Tenant does not pay the rent by the 5th day of the month, the Tenant shall pay
85 a late charge of \$100.00 until the rent is received by Landlord. The late charge shall be added to the rent, and shall be considered
86 as additional rent, which is defined in Section 8. In the event any rent check is returned unpaid due to insufficient funds, the Tenant agrees
87 to pay the Landlord a \$ 50.00 processing charge. In such event, the Landlord reserves the right to demand that future rent
88 payments be made in cash, bank or certified check.

89
90 8. **ADDITIONAL RENT:** Landlord may perform any obligations under this Lease which are Tenant's responsibility and which
91 Tenant fails to perform. The cost to Landlord for such performance may be charged to tenant as "additional rent" which shall be due
92 and payable with the next installment of monthly rent. Landlord has the same rights against Tenant for failure to pay additional rent as
93 Landlord has for Tenant's failure to pay monthly rent. This means that the Landlord may evict Tenant for failure to pay additional rent.

94
95 9. **POSSESSION AND USE:** The Landlord shall give possession of the Property to the Tenant for the Term of this Lease except as
96 otherwise provided in this Lease. The Tenant shall occupy the Property only as a private residence, and will not use the Property for any
97 business, trade or profession. The Tenant shall not store any flammable, dangerous or hazardous materials at the Property, other than
98 ordinary household cleaning materials. The Property shall not be allowed to be vacant for any extended period of time.

99 **10. UTILITIES:** The Tenant shall arrange to have the utilities transferred into Tenant's name prior to occupancy, and shall be respon-
 100 sible for paying the following utility services: Gas Electric Water Heat Sewer General Trash Disposal
 101 (Other) _____

102 The Landlord shall provide and pay for the following utility services: Gas Electric Water Heat Sewer
 103 General Trash Disposal (Other) _____. The Tenant agrees
 104 not to waste or unreasonably use any utility or appliance that is provided by the Landlord. Landlord shall not be responsible for any dam-
 105 age or loss caused to Tenant or Tenant's property because of an interruption in utility services over which Landlord has no reasonable
 106 means of control. Any such interruption shall not be grounds for Tenant to reduce or stop paying rent.

107
 108 **11. NO ASSIGNMENT OR SUBLETTING:** The Tenant may not assign this Lease, sublet all or any part of the Property, or permit
 109 any other person to use the Property without the prior written permission of the Landlord. The Landlord may withhold such permission
 110 in Landlord's sole and absolute discretion.

111
 112 **12. VIOLATION, EVICTION AND RE-ENTRY:** The Landlord reserves the right of re-entry. This means that if the Tenant
 113 violates the terms of this Lease, the Landlord may terminate this Lease and regain possession of the Property. This is done by a court
 114 proceeding known as an eviction. A complaint is served upon the Tenant and the Tenant must appear in court. The Landlord may also
 115 evict the Tenant for any other cause which is permitted by applicable law. When the eviction proceeding is concluded, the Landlord may
 116 regain possession of the Property.

117
 118 **13. DAMAGES:** The Tenant is liable for all the Landlord's damages caused by the Tenant's breach of this Lease. Such damages may
 119 include loss of rent, the cost of preparing the Property for re-renting and a brokerage commission incurred finding a new tenant as a result
 120 of the Tenant's eviction or if the Tenant moves out prior to the end of the Term.

121
 122 **14. QUIET ENJOYMENT:** The Tenant may occupy the Property without interference, subject to Tenant's compliance with the
 123 Terms of this Lease.

124
 125 **15. TENANT'S REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE:** The Tenant shall:

- 126 (a) Pay for all repairs, replacements and damages caused by the act or neglect of the Tenant, the Tenant's family, domestic employees,
 127 guests or visitors, which includes but is not limited to sewer and plumbing drainage problems caused by the Tenant.
 128 (b) Keep and maintain the Property in a neat, clean, safe and sanitary condition.
 129 (c) Cut the grass and maintain the shrubbery.
 130 (d) Drive and park vehicles only in designated areas, if any.
 131 (e) Take good care of the Property and all equipment, fixtures, carpeting and appliances located in it.
 132 (f) Keep the furnace clean, and regularly change the furnace filters, if applicable.
 133 (g) Keep nothing in the Property which is flammable, dangerous or which might increase the danger of fire or other casualty.
 134 (h) Promptly notify the Landlord of any condition which requires repairs to be done.
 135 (i) Use the electric, plumbing and other systems and facilities in a safe manner.
 136 (j) Promptly remove all garbage and recyclables from the Property and place it at the curb (or other designated area) in the proper
 137 containers in accordance with the prescribed pick-up schedule.
 138 (k) Not engage in any activity which may cause a cancellation or an increase in the cost of the Landlord's insurance coverages.
 139 (l) Use no more electricity than the receptacles, wiring or feeders to the Property can safely carry.
 140 (m) Obey all instructions, written or otherwise, of the Landlord for the care and use of appliances, equipment and other personal
 141 property.
 142 (n) Do nothing to destroy, deface or damage any part of the Property.
 143 (o) Promptly comply with all orders and rules of the Board of Health or any other governmental authority which are directed to the
 144 Tenant.
 145 (p) Do nothing which interferes with the use and enjoyment of neighboring properties.
 146 (q) Do nothing to cause any damage to any trees or landscaping on the Property.
 147 (r) Keep the walks and driveway free from dirt, debris, snow, ice and any hazardous objects.
 148 (s) Comply with such rules and regulations that may be published from time to time by the Landlord.

149
 150 **16. LANDLORD REPAIRS:** The Landlord shall make any necessary repairs and replacements to the vital facilities serving the
 151 Property, such as the heating, plumbing and electrical systems, within a reasonable time after notice by the Tenant. The Tenant may be
 152 liable for the cost of such repairs and replacements pursuant to Section 15. The Landlord shall not be liable for interruption of services
 153 or inconvenience resulting from delays in making repairs or replacements if due to circumstances beyond Landlord's reasonable control.

154
 155 **17. ACCESS TO THE PROPERTY:** The Landlord shall have access to the Property on reasonable notice to the Tenant in order to
 156 (a) inspect the interior and exterior of the Property, (b) make necessary repairs, alterations, or improvements, (c) supply services, and (d)
 157 show it to prospective buyers, appraisers, contractors or insurers. The Landlord may enter the Property without prior notice in the event
 158 of an emergency or if the Tenant is not home for more than seven (7) consecutive days. If this Lease is not renewed as per Section 27 of this

159 Lease Agreement, Landlord shall then be allowed access to the Property at any time prior to the end of the Term for showing of Property
160 to prospective tenants.
161

162 **18. NO ALTERATIONS OR INSTALLATION OF EQUIPMENT:** The Tenant may not alter or change the Property without first
163 obtaining Landlord's written consent. By way of example, the Tenant may not:

- 164 (a) Install any improvement such as carpeting, paneling, floor tiles, or any other improvement which is nailed or tacked down, cemented
165 or glued in;
166 (b) Install any locks or chain guards;
167 (c) Wallpaper, affix wall coverings or other permanent type decorations;
168 (d) Install or change the electrical, plumbing, heating or air cooling system.
169

170 When painting (whether interior or exterior), the Tenant must have the Landlord's permission regarding paint colors. All painting must
171 be done in a professional and workmanlike manner. The Tenant shall repair all walls and ceilings which had pictures or fixtures attached,
172 prior to vacating. Any and all changes, additions or improvements made without the Landlord's written consent shall be removed by the
173 Tenant on demand by the Landlord. The Property shall be in substantially the same condition at the end of the Term as it was at the
174 beginning of the Term, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
175

176 All permitted changes, additions and improvements shall become the property of the Landlord when completed, shall be fully paid
177 for by the Tenant, and shall remain as part of the Property at the end of the Term of this Lease, unless the Landlord demands that the
178 Tenant remove them. The Tenant shall not allow any construction lien or other claim to be filed against the Property. If any such lien or
179 claim is filed against the Property, the Tenant shall have it promptly removed.
180

181 **19. INSPECTION:** If the municipality requires a continued use inspection or certificate of occupancy prior to occupancy, the Land-
182 lord shall be responsible for obtaining such inspections and certificates as well as making the necessary repairs.
183

184 **20. INSURANCE:** The Tenant shall be responsible for obtaining, at Tenant's own cost and expense, a tenant's insurance policy for the Tenant's
185 furniture, furnishings, clothing and other personal property. The Tenant's personal property shall not be the responsibility of the Landlord and will not be
186 insured by the Landlord. The Tenant's insurance policy must also include liability coverage. Upon request, the Tenant shall periodically furnish Landlord
187 with evidence of Tenant's insurance policy. Landlord's statutory liability insurance requirements are referenced in Section 22 below.
188

189 **21. FIRE AND OTHER CASUALTY:** Immediate notice shall be given by the Tenant to Landlord of any fire or other casualty which
190 occurs at the Property. If the Property is uninhabitable, Tenant's obligation to pay rent shall cease until the time that the Property is re-
191 stored by the Landlord. If only a part of the Property is uninhabitable, then the rent shall be adjusted proportionately.
192

193 If only part of the Property is damaged, the Landlord shall repair the Property within a reasonable period of time. Landlord shall not
194 be obligated to repair or restore any improvements that Tenant has made to the Property.
195

196 Either party may cancel this Lease if the Property is so damaged by fire or other casualty that the property cannot be repaired within
197 ninety (90) days. The Landlord's determination in such regard shall be final, conclusive and binding on both parties.
198

199 The Lease shall end if the Property is totally destroyed. The Tenant shall pay rent to the date of destruction.
200

201 If the fire or other casualty is caused by the act or neglect of the Tenant, the Tenant's family, domestic employees, guests or visitors, the
202 Tenant shall pay for all repairs and other damages.
203

204 **22. LIABILITY OF LANDLORD AND TENANT:** Landlord is not legally responsible for any loss, injury or damage to any
205 person or property unless such loss, injury or damage is directly caused by Landlord's negligence or omissions. The Landlord represents
206 that, as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:10A-1, effective November 3, 2022, Landlord has liability insurance in an amount no less than \$500,000.00
207 for combined property damage and bodily injury to or death of one (1) or more persons in any one (1) incident or occurrence, and that, effective
208 February 1, 2023, if Property is a multifamily home that is four (4) or fewer units, one of which is occupied by Landlord, then the liability
209 insurance is in an amount no less than \$300,000.00. Tenant is legally responsible for loss, injury or damage to any person or property caused
210 by the negligence of Tenant, Tenant's family members, domestic employees, guests or visitors.
211

212 **23. PETS:** No dogs, cats or other pets shall be permitted on the Property without the prior written consent of the Landlord, which the
213 Landlord may withhold in the Landlord's sole and absolute discretion. Failure to obtain written permission from Landlord to have, keep, or
214 allow others to bring any type of pet upon the Property will result in a fine of \$25.00 per day that the pet is present without prior written permission
215 and may result in termination of the Lease for breach of the Lease at Landlord's sole discretion.
216

217 **24. NOTICES:** All notices given under this Lease must be in writing in order to be effective. Delivery of notices may not be refused.
218 If any notice is refused, it shall be considered to have been effectively given. Notices shall be given by (a) personal delivery, or (b) certified
219 mail, return receipt requested, unless applicable law requires a different means of notice. Notices to the Landlord shall be at the address
220 on the first page of this Lease, and to the Tenant at the Property.

221 **25. NO WAIVER:** The Landlord's failure to enforce any obligation of the Tenant contained in this Lease in any one instance shall
 222 not prevent the Landlord from enforcing the obligation at a later time.
 223

224 **26. SEVERABILITY:** If any term or condition of this Lease is contrary to law, the remainder of the Lease shall be unaffected and
 225 shall continue to be binding upon the parties.
 226

227 **27. RENEWAL OF LEASE:** The Tenant must be offered a renewal of this Lease by the Landlord, unless the Landlord has good
 228 cause not to do so under applicable law. Reasonable changes may be included in the renewal Lease. Not less than 30 days
 229 before the expiration of the Term of this Lease, the Landlord shall notify the Tenant of the proposed terms for the renewal Lease. Within
 230 5 days after the Tenant receives the Landlord's renewal notice, Tenant shall notify Landlord whether Tenant accepts or re-
 231 jects the proposed renewal Lease. If the Tenant does not notify the Landlord of Tenant's acceptance, then the Landlord's proposal shall
 232 be considered to have been rejected. If the Tenant does not accept the renewal Lease, the Tenant must vacate the Property at the end of
 233 the Term.
 234

235 **28. FURNITURE:** If the Property is leased in furnished condition, or if the Landlord leaves personal property to be used by the
 236 Tenant, the Tenant shall maintain the furniture and furnishings in good condition and repair. A list of such items shall be attached to this
 237 Lease and signed by the Landlord and the Tenant.
 238

239 **29. END OF TERM:** At the end of the Term, the Tenant shall (a) leave the Property clean, (b) remove all of the Tenant's property,
 240 (c) repair any damage including that caused by moving, (d) make arrangements for final utility readings and pay all final utility bills and
 241 (e) vacate the Property and return it with all keys to the Landlord in the same condition as it was at the beginning of the Term, except for
 242 normal wear and tear.
 243

244 **30. ASSOCIATION BYLAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS:** If Property is subject to any Association Bylaws and Rules and Regulations including
 245 any amendments, Tenant agrees to comply with such Association Bylaws and Rules and Regulations including
 246 any amendments.
 247

248 **31. BINDING:** This Lease is binding on the Landlord and the Tenant and all parties who lawfully succeed to their rights and respon-
 249 sibilities.
 250

251 **32. ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** This Lease contains the entire agreement of the Landlord and Tenant. No representations have been
 252 made by the Landlord or its real estate broker or agents except as set forth in this Lease. This Lease can only be changed in writing by an
 253 agreement signed by both the Landlord and the Tenant.
 254

255 **33. ATTORNEY REVIEW CLAUSE:**
 256 **(1) Study by Attorney.**
 257 The Tenant or the Landlord may choose to have an attorney study this Lease. If an attorney is consulted, the attorney must complete
 258 his or her review of the Lease within a three-day period. This Lease will be legally binding at the end of this three-day period unless an
 259 attorney for the Tenant or the Landlord reviews or disapproves of the Lease.
 260 **(2) Counting the Time.**
 261 You count the three days from the date of delivery of the signed Lease to the Tenant and the Landlord. You do not count Saturdays,
 262 Sundays or legal holidays. The Tenant and the Landlord may agree in writing to extend the three-day period for attorney review.
 263 **(3) Notice of Disapproval.**
 264 If an attorney for the Tenant or Landlord reviews and disapproves of this Lease, the attorney must notify the Broker(s) and the other
 265 party named in this Lease within the three-day period. Otherwise this Lease will be legally binding as written. The attorney must send the
 266 notice of disapproval to the Broker(s) by fax, e-mail, personal delivery, or overnight mail with proof of delivery. Notice by overnight mail will
 267 be effective upon mailing. The personal delivery will be effective upon delivery to the Broker's office. The attorney may also, but need not,
 268 inform the Broker(s) of any suggested revision(s) in the Lease that would make it satisfactory.
 269

270 **34. BROKER'S COMMISSION:** The Broker's Commission is earned, due and payable upon signing of a fully executed Lease
 271 Agreement and satisfaction of the Attorney Review Period set forth in Section 33 of this Lease. The Commission shall be paid by the
 272 Landlord in accord with previously executed Listing Agreement.

35. LEAD-BASED PAINT: (Applies to dwellings built before 1978)

(A) Document Acknowledgement.

The Tenant acknowledges receipt of the EPA pamphlet, "Protect Your Family From Lead In Your Home". Moreover, a copy of the document entitled, "Disclosure of Information on Lead-Based Paint and Lead-Based Paint Hazards" has been fully completed, signed by Tenant, Landlord and Broker(s) and is appended to and made a part of this Lease.

(B) New Jersey Lead-Based Paint Inspection Law Acknowledgment.

Landlord acknowledges that, effective July 22, 2022, all rental dwelling units built before 1978 required to be inspected pursuant to the New Jersey Lead-Based Paint Inspection Law, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-437.16, et seq., must be inspected for lead-based paint by July 22, 2024, or upon tenant turnover, whichever is earlier (note: there are several exemptions, including but not limited to seasonal rentals that are rented for less than six (6) months duration each year by tenants that do not have consecutive lease renewals). The law imposes an obligation on municipalities to perform or hire, or allow Landlord to directly hire, a certified lead evaluation contractor to perform the inspections of single-family, two-family, and multiple rental dwellings that are covered by the law for lead-based paint hazards, at times specified in the law. The type of inspection depends on the lead levels in children in the municipality where the rental dwelling unit is located. Landlord must provide evidence of a valid lead-safe certification to new tenants of the Property at the time of tenant turnover, unless not required to have had an inspection, and shall attach a copy of such certification to this Lease, which Tenant acknowledges that Landlord has attached.

36. WINDOW GUARD NOTIFICATION:

THE OWNER (LANDLORD) IS REQUIRED BY LAW TO PROVIDE, INSTALL AND MAINTAIN WINDOW GUARDS IN THE APARTMENT IF A CHILD OR CHILDREN 10 YEARS OF AGE OR YOUNGER IS, OR WILL BE, LIVING IN THE APARTMENT OR IS, OR WILL BE, REGULARLY PRESENT THERE FOR A SUBSTANTIAL PERIOD OF TIME IF THE TENANT GIVES THE OWNER (LANDLORD) A WRITTEN REQUEST THAT THE WINDOW GUARDS BE INSTALLED. WIRE FRAUD NOTICE

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PROTECT YOURSELF FROM BECOMING A VICTIM OF WIRE FRAUD. Wire fraud has become very common. It typically involves a criminal hacker sending fraudulent wire transfer instructions in an email to an unsuspecting buyer/tenant or seller/landlord in a real estate transaction that appears as though it is from a trusted source, such as the victim's broker, attorney, appraiser, home inspector or title agent. The email may look exactly like other emails that the victim received in the past from such individuals, including having the same or a similar email address, accurate loan and other financial information, and the logo of one of those individuals. If the hacker is successful, the victim will follow the bogus instructions to wire money, such as deposit money or payment of an invoice, to the hacker's account. Once this money has been wired, it may not be possible to recover it.

We strongly recommend that, **before** you wire funds to any party, including your own attorney, real estate broker or title agent, you **personally call** them to confirm the account number and other wire instructions. You only should call them at a number that you have obtained on your own (e.g., from the sales contract, their website, etc.) and should **not** use any phone number that is in any email - **even if the email appears to be from someone you know.**

If you have any reason to believe that your money was sent to a hacker, you must immediately contact your bank and your local office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, who can work with other agencies to try to recover your money, to advise them where and when the money was sent. You also should promptly file a complaint with the Internet Crime Center at bec.ic3.gov.

Finally, since much of the information included in such fraudulent emails is obtained from email accounts that are not secure, we strongly recommend that you not provide any sensitive personal or financial information in an email or an attachment to an email. Whenever possible, such information, including Social Security numbers, bank account and credit card numbers and wiring instructions, should be sent by more secure means, such as by hand delivery, over the phone, or through secure mail or overnight services.
