After 17 Years, Their Walk Across America Still Making an Impact

Seventeen years after Rick and Jane McKinney completed their 2770-mile walk across America, the story is still resonating with those who hear or read it for the first time. Everyone from grade schoolers who read the children's book to college students and senior adults who hear them speak are challenged to accept their own calling from God. The walk, which started at Santa Monica Pier on January 1st, required over six months to complete and landed them at the Supreme Court steps on July 4th.

Their journey to pray for America and share their faith with others allowed them to encounter hundreds of people. The impact on many lives has been longlasting, including some who have since begun their own ministries. "What we are finding, however," says Rick McKinney, "is that the story is just as powerful today for those who read the book or hear our presentations as it was for the people we met along the way, seventeen years ago."


