Dust of the Rabbi

“Jesus replied: “‘Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.’” – Matt. 22:38-40

A saying that is loosely interpreted from the Mishnah, (The Mishnah is a collection of rabbinic thought from 200 BC to 200 AD that still forms the core of Jewish belief today) is, “be covered in your rabbi’s dust.” In Jesus’ time, a rabbi would walk and teach his students. He would lead and his students would follow. The saying means to follow your rabbi (teacher) so close that you are covered with the dust of his teaching.

When starting His ministry, Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee and called James and John to follow Him. Going a little further, He also called Peter and Andrew. The Word says they “immediately” left and followed Him. He taught. They listened. He walked. They followed. Rabbi. Student.

And Jesus still calls us to “Follow Me” every day. Some drop the “world” and follow immediately. Some are more reluctant, but still follow. Some refuse and continue “fishing for themselves.” Question is...which are you? Do you desire to learn from the Rabbi that you walk so close to Him that the dust of His sandals lands on you? Do you stretch to hear what He is saying? Do you desire more than anything to just “be” in His presence?

But that is only the first step. To “come” and “follow” Jesus is the beginning of the adventure. To listen to His “Words of Life” is the start. Don’t get me wrong. It is essential and very important for it directly affects all that you do for His kingdom, but there is more. You must pass it on.

Becoming a disciple of Jesus is also a pledge to make other disciples. It isn’t just something between you and Him. It is taking what you have learned from Him and passing it on to others. It is allowing you to be a rabbi to others who need to know how to be a disciple and so on. Too many people take on a little “dust” of Jesus and feel they have done enough. But they apparently did not follow close enough, for those who were caked with dust understand they are to leave “dust” on others.

Following Jesus is also about leading others to Jesus. It’s about shaking off “Jesus’ dust” on to others. Taking what you have learned and experienced and giving it to someone else. So are you caked with the dust of your rabbi? Then who are you shaking His dust onto?

Follow...and lead.

It's the season of new beginning. I don't know how your year went last year, but mine was a roller coaster to say the least. God and I had many long talks, some were very productive, and some felt like I was talking into the wind. Regardless, here we are and a new year begins.

As the new year begins, I ponder a new beginning in scripture. I was reading Acts chapter 1 recently and I sat and thought through what it would have been like to be the disciples. They followed Jesus for 3 years, (Excitement builds) He dies on a cross, (Complete fear and uncertainty arises) Jesus rises from the dead (overcome with Joy) and now he says he needs to leave, (major let down) He leaves with a command to the disciples to go and be witnesses for the Gospel. This is not so much a surprise as it is a fuller understanding. The last 3 years of the disciple's lives have been a training ground for this moment in history. Jesus has prepared them for his departure, (they just hadn't realized it at the time) and now they have a task before them, a new beginning, a new season. This new season will be different, this time instead of Jesus walking along side them the Holy Spirit will lead them from within. The Spirit will help them become witnesses to the whole world, the Spirit will help them start a movement that will encompass generations upon generations of people. What a task, change the world, talk to your friends and talk to your enemies about the Gospel of Jesus. Jesus shares this command and then casually ascends, after he has disappeared from their sight the disciples are met by 2 men, their message simple, Jesus is gone, but he will come back, why are you still looking? I often find myself "gazing" towards the skies, waiting for Jesus to come back, but really, I am just looking for an excuse to be lethargic, why do I stand staring up? The ends of the earth haven't been reached; the ends of our community haven't even been reached. This new season the same challenge remains, be a witness for the Gospel of Jesus, but understand a witness of Jesus is not flippant or lackadaisical, a witness of Jesus is ready to be led by the Holy Spirit so when He speaks, we obey.
