It was just a "WOW" moment listening to him recollect them with nostalgia.

One story, in particular, really stuck out to me. I was raised with the saying, "TV destroyed our communities." It always made sense. When people watch tv, they go into their living rooms with their families. Separated. It makes sense. But not when you hear my dad's story of their first tv.

My dad told me that they had the first one on the block. That's sounds so strange to me. One tv on a street?! And "new technology"? But they did. I can only imagine what the neighbors thought. "Well, aren't they uppity?!" But here's where the story blew me away. Every evening, they would pull it out on the porch. They used those extension cords that were brown and sparked all the time, but out would come this thirteen-inch screen and people would bring their lawn chairs and sit and watch a little screen with their neighbors for hours. Isn't that amazing?!

Maybe it wasn't the tv that destroyed neighborhoods. Maybe it was just us. We stopped considering what our neighbors meant to us and what we meant to them. Maybe it became easier to run up to Walmart for a cup of sugar or milk. Maybe life became more about what I want and not what would make our community better. And slowly we forgot we had people that mean so much to us called "neighbors."

Maybe it's time to go introduce yourself and do what Jesus said. "Love your neighbor as yourself." We need community, which means we need...neighbors. Our country is a collection of communities of neighbors. Maybe it's not the tv. Maybe it's us. You. Me.

DISCIPLESHIP AT HOME

 $4\ \mbox{ways}$ to pray with your family when you don't know what to pray for or about.

- Praying Scripture > gather your family around and open your Bibles to Philippians. Each person pick TWO verses. Assign the verses to a family member and pray all week for them. For an example Philippians 1:9 says, "I pray that your love will overflow more and more and that you will keep on growing in knowledge and understanding." My prayer to the KFC Families; Dear Heavenly Father, I pray for all the KFC families that they will grow in Your Word and they will love You so much that they would want to share Your love with others. Lord, thank you for loving us and please bless each family. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.
- Praying Blessing > The Bible is full of blessings where someone is asking for God to favor someone else. Google search "Blessings in Scripture" (suggestion, christianity.com). Read through them and pick one blessing for a family member. Say that blessing in prayer for them all week long.
- Praying Remembrance > Paul in the Bible tells us to pray for our brothers and sisters around the world. As a family, look up www.operationworld.org. There you will find opportunities to pray for people in the world.
- Praying Power > Jesus says in Matthew 17:20, "He replied, "Because you have so little faith. Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." As a family, read the story about Elijah in 1 Kings 18:1-15. Is there anyone you may know that needs God's courage to help them? Discuss who that may be and pray for them all week.

Praying is so much more than talking to God. It's a communion with one another as a family, growing in your faith and putting Jesus in your hearts.

I am praying for you this month that your families will grow deeper in God's Word and in prayer.
