

I am at my favorite place on earth. Most who know me know that it does not involve the city, OU, or the Thunder. Although I appreciate all those things, they aren't my favorite place on earth.

I am outside a cabin in Davis, Oklahoma sitting by a campfire that I made. I love it as I push wood in as it starts getting dark. I don't know if it is because I am alone in the woods or what, but I've realized a few things about fire and the kingdom of God.

One is that I had to prepare it while it was still light. I walked around picking up wood of all shapes and sizes that I knew would be best for a fire. It was their specific job to burn and cause light and heat. I carried and dragged them to my pit.

We are called to be the Kingdom; the Church. We have the job of submitting to the work of the Savior to bring His light to our world. And just as I got my wood during the day, it's better to start being a part of the Kingdom when it is "day" in your life. Darkness comes. It always does and it's not impossible to do it in darkness, but it is slower and much harder.

Once I had enough wood for tonight and tomorrow, I started building. That brings me to my second thing. It takes all different kinds of wood to build a fire. When I was younger, I never could make a good fire. I was too eager to make it BIG. I would go get all the big logs I could find. But as you probably guessed, it wouldn't light. This time I got small twigs and tinder to get my fire going. The big stuff would come in its time but not without the starter fuel.

In the church, it takes all kinds. We are not all alike and thank God for that. What if we were clones of each other, the only thing that would be successful would be the weirdness of our cult. But God made us different and for different purposes. Some of us are good at getting things started, but tire out quick. Others of us don't start much but we have the power and patience to keep it going. Different people for different purposes.

And third is that when it was dark, I lit it. Slowly the fire spread through the tinder and held the flame just long enough to ignite the bigger pieces. After a few minutes, it was burning bright. I looked around, mostly because it is creepy in the woods by yourself after dark. But I could see for about a hundred yards in every direction. Those scary shadows were revealed in the firelight. Just trees. I felt better being able to see clearly in the dark. And I was warming up.

That's the Kingdom. Different people with different gifts being used by God to illuminate the dark world around them. That's church. That's us.

Well, my fire is shrinking so I better get back at it. I hate being alone in the dark.



Merry Christmas!

Most of us would agree that the Christmas season can be quite chaotic. It is easy to get caught up in the hustle and bustle and lose sight of why we celebrate. That is why it is important for you to be intentional in pointing your kids to Jesus during this Christmas season. Dedicate time to worship God as a family and explore the meaning of Christmas. There are many helpful resources for drawing your family's attention to Jesus during Christmas, but no resource is as valuable as God's Word. Consider using this short devotion to lead your family in a time of worship.

Open your Bible to Luke 2. Read Luke 2:1-20 aloud or designate a child to read aloud. Consider letting children take turns reading the Bible story.

- Ask: "Why do we celebrate Christmas?" Explain that we celebrate Christmas to honor the birth of Jesus.
- Ask: "What makes Jesus' birth different from any other baby's birth?" Remind family members that the Son of God was in heaven with God but came to earth as a human baby. Pick up a wrapped Christmas gift. Challenge family members to think of what it would be like to try and put the entire world in a gift box. Explain that Jesus is the mighty, all-powerful God who created everything but He came to earth as the most tiny and helpless of all human forms.
- Ask the big picture question: "Why was Jesus born?" Say the
 answer together as a family, "Jesus was born to rescue us
 (from sin)." Explain that we need a Savior. As sinners, we
 deserve to spend forever apart from God because of our sin.
 Jesus kept all of God's laws perfectly while He was on earth.
 Jesus did not deserve to die, but He took God's punishment
 we deserved and died on the cross in our place.
- Ask: "What makes Jesus' birth good news?" Explain that because Jesus came to earth, we can be saved from sin.
 Jesus rose from the dead, and one day, He is coming back to make everything new and right.

Lead your family in a time of prayer.
