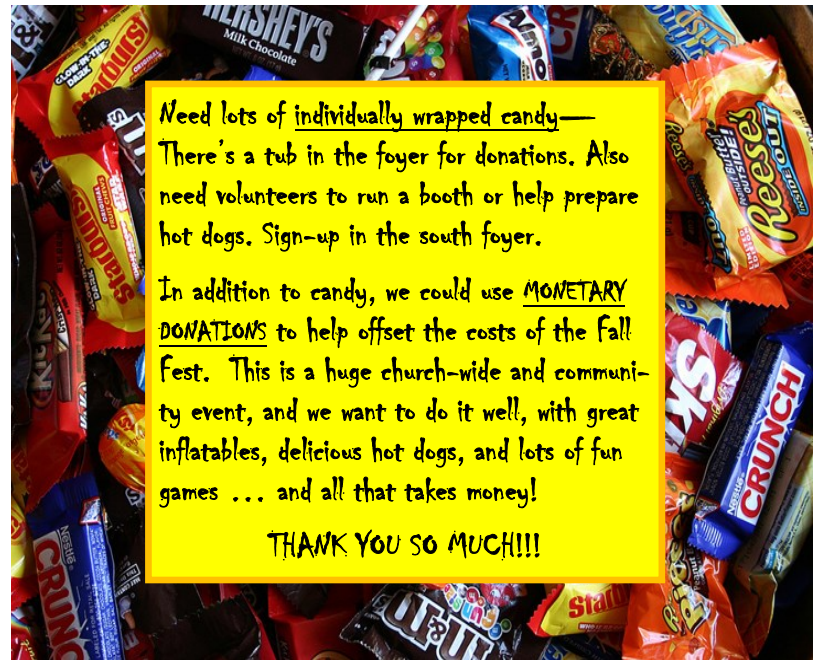

“But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.” Matthew 6:33

October brings about fall vibes, pumkin spice wishes, and hoodie weather. It also brings about talk of spooky things like ghost, monsters, and other frightening entities. The problem with the previously mentioned entities is that we talk about them as if they are just a thing for movies. Mind you "monsters" in the sense of a creature with abnormal strenght and a taste for innocent humans don't exist. Ghost? Nope, at least not in the way we normally think about them. Before we go any further I would like you to understand my view of ghost. I believe ghost are demons pretending to be something that you would find less threatening in hopes that they would be able to fabricate a relationship with you, which is not a good thing. What is a good thing? The fact that we as believers have a power living in us that is much more powerful than anyone gives credit.

One of my favorite stories in the book of Acts is found in the 19th chapter. The book of Acts tell the story of the disciples spreading the Gospel throughout the known world. It follows Peter, John, and Paul for a majority of the book. In chapter 19 the Holy Spirit shows up and moves in power. The power of God was so mighty that even the Apostle Paul's articles of clothing (hankerchiefs, aprons) were taken to the sick and they healed and even demons were cast out because of those articles. Because often we give unholy things more power than we should. We must always remember, the Power of God cannot be stopped or weakened. If you are a follower of Christ this power lives in you and maybe its time we let this power lead us, rather than suppressing it.
