#### **Elders Report**

Our Church and each of us have been through a lot since our congregational meeting last year. Who would have thought we would be living through something out of a Steven King novel? But despite what this year has thrown at us, our Church has adapted and continues to move forward. When the pandemic began, all of the Churches had to adapt quickly. For some, going completely on-line was only a small step since they had been doing it for some time, but for us it was a giant leap. Amazingly, our staff was able to put together our first on-line service in just one week. Throughout this time they continue to put in a lot of extra effort to ensure the Church remains engaged by developing a great Wednesday night bible study, and programs for our children and youth. When we were able to resume in-person services and some activities, the on-line service, bible studies, and programs were continued so we could still reach members who couldn't come in person. Even our in-person services have required a lot of adaptation. While the 6 ft row spacing and the lack of a meet and greet time are the most obvious changes, we also had to come up with safe ways to take Communion and collect the offering. Resumption of the Sunday morning Bible study is a welcome step toward normalcy, but of course it looks a bit different, and includes the necessary on-line component.

What I have observed thru this time is that for every challenge we have faced, the Lord has provided a way to overcome it, and even use it to further his kingdom. While our original intent for the on-line service was to reach our members at home, we have ended up having people from all over watching it. When home schooling suddenly became the norm, we have been able to provide two faith-based home school groups a safe place to meet each week while continuing our own pre-school. While we were sad to see our worship leader move on last summer, we have had other members step forward and use their talents in a big way for the Lord.

So even in this time of uncertainty, the most important things have not changed. The Lord continues to bless us. Although some of our congregation have come down with Covid, most of us have not. While we miss our regular fellowship times, the exceptional way this congregation cares for each other continues. And most important of all, the Lord is being lifted up and the Gospel is still being preached.

- 3. **Relationships** We believe that we all grow together in our faith when students have mentoring relationships with older youth sponsors, when they mentor younger students, and when they hold their peers accountable to walking in their faith.

We want to partner with adult leaders who have a passion to see students' lives changed because of the Gospel. If that sounds like a team you want to join come and find me at anytime.
