It seems that less and less things fill us with awe. I'm serious. When was the last time you were stopped speechless at discovering something? The vastness of the night sky? If I am honest and transparent with you, even in my personal time with God, I haven't been in awe of Him. I even try to make him as much of an "average Joe" so as to think of Him as one of my pals. You know, to hang out with at the restaurant. It seems that I've tried to make Him look more like me than me like Him.

But to put God in such a small box, so to speak, lessens the fact that the entire universe fits in His hands. It makes it appear that He isn't infinite but finite like us. When the truth is, He sees the beginning and the end all at the same time. And He even has the power to walk into any portion of time He wishes. HE IS A BIG GOD!

But He created us in His image so that He, in all His size and wonder, can have a relationship with us. Little us. A blip on one of the trillion planets spinning around one of the trillion stars in one of the trillion galaxies. As David says, "We are fearfully and wonderfully made." (Psalm 139).

He still desires us. Longs for us. Knows us (even our hairs or lack thereof). So when you see a magnificent Oklahoma sunset, remember how big our God is. And then find comfort in the fact He knows you completely.
