### **Real Faith Produces Genuine Stability**

## **Contrasting Temptation & Testing**

#### **4 Truths about Temptation:**

- 1. No one is exempt (Vs. 13)
  - a. 1 Corinthians 10:13 "No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But *when* you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it." (Italics-mine)
- 2. Temptation is never prompted by God (Vs. 13)
  - a. "by"  $\alpha\pi$ o (Gr.) apo (not hypo) "originating from, indirect"
  - b. 2 sides of be holy
    - i. Inability to be affected by evil
    - ii. Inability to cause evil
- 3. Temptation always follows a consistent process (Vss. 14-15)
  - a. Life cycle of Evil
    - i. Conception is "desire" Mental
    - ii. Birth through maturity is "sin" Physical
    - iii. Offspring of evil is "death" Reward
  - b. "by his own evil desires"
    - i. "by" υπο (Gr.) hypo "direct agent of"
- 4. Temptation flourishes on inconsistent thinking (Vs. 16)
  - a. "deceived" πλαναω (Gr.) planao "go astray, err, seduce"
  - b. Temptation builds its case on
    - i. Deceptive thought
    - ii. Empty promises

#### **CONTRAST**

- 1. Testing of your faith reveals truth. (Vs. 16)
  - a. Opposite of "deceived"
  - b. As temptation hides truth, testing reveals the necessity of it
    - i. John 8:31-41
- 2. Testing of your faith helps you to recognize God's good and perfect gifts.
  - a. "perfect" τεκνοτροφεω (Gr.) teknotropheo "brought to its end, complete, perfect"
  - b. John 3:22-30

#### 3. Testing of your faith reveals God's constant unchanging character.

- a. "not" ov (Gr.) ou "absolute negative"
- b. "change" παραλλαγη (Gr. ) parallage "fickleness; variableness"

#### 4. Testing of your faith reveals the magnitude of who you are to God.

- a. "birth" αποκυεω (Gr.) apokyeo "to bring forth, give birth to"
- b. "word"  $\lambda$ 0 $\gamma$ 0 $\zeta$  (Gr.) logos "a word, uttered by a living voice, embodies a conception or idea"
  - i. John 1:1
- c. "firstfruits" απαρχη (Gr.) aparche "the beginning of the sacrifice"
  - i. Genesis 4:4; Exodus 13:2, Revelation 14:4 (aparche is used)
  - ii. Perfect; without blemish

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
