

Were the Greeks Right?

For the Lord gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.- Proverbs 2:6

One of the long-standing philosophies of the Greek Dynasty was that if an individual has more knowledge, they would be better people and citizens. Considering how long ago this dynasty fell we'd have to say that they were wrong. But you don't have to look back that far. Not even close. All you have to do is look at a computer or smart phone and see proof of this errancy.

We have more abilities than we ever had to attain knowledge at an alarming speed (I'm thinking AI). One click. One word. One phrase and you can accumulate more "stuff" than you are able to understand. In honesty, knowledge drives our ever-changing, ever-updating culture to the point by the time you can dwell on something it is changed or gone. Or worse, it is "anti-cultural" which labels a person...well who knows this week. There are three reasons that this philosophy is failing.

One, Knowledge is not wisdom. Knowledge is the accumulation of facts, information, and skills acquired through experience or education. Wisdom, on the other hand, is the ability to use knowledge effectively and make sound judgments. And where you get your knowledge and wisdom will either lead you to life or destruction. More on that later. The Greeks assumed if you had the information, you would behave appropriately with it. But we can't get out of Genesis before we see humans manipulating it (Genesis 3:1-10). Although having information can make someone more powerful, it cannot necessitate morality for its use. It's like an unmanned ship in the ocean. Just a fact without direction.

Two, just like a compass can direct us to true north, we must also have a "true north" which has the authority to give us knowledge. For example, what if you wanted to come to my house but you needed directions. If you ask my 2-year -old granddaughter, I'm not sure where you would end up, but I know you would be watching Bluey. Honestly, who would you ask for directions? Me or my wife would be authoritative enough to correctly get you there. So, who (Who) or what is your "true north"? Where do you trust to get your knowledge from so that you can live it out appropriately (wisdom)? Proverbs 9:10 says, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and knowledge of the Holy One is understanding." Knowledge found anywhere else may be a 2-year-old opinion.

Three, beware of "Relevant Truth". What is that? It is the opposite of wisdom. It is believing knowledge solely based on how it's relevant to your life. Your actions (relevance) should be directed by knowledge, not the other way around. Many today, because of all the "knowledge" flippantly thrown around on social platforms, choose only those "truths" that agree with their preconceived opinions. That can lead to all kinds of disasters. Imagine an Olympic swimming race without lanes. Or Nascar (we're in Oklahoma, right) with just an open field and no track. That's what happens when we ignore God's objective knowledge and make up our own. Beware of that as our culture is plagued with it.

I don't mean to be too hard on the Greeks. It's just that they honestly thought knowing truth without a God-fearing compass would make us better people. In the words of Plato, "Knowledge becomes evil if the aim be not virtuous." We live in the truth of that statement.

Seek God. Seek His truth and knowledge. Live in the wisdom found therein.

I have been reading the book of 1 Timothy every day for the past 3 weeks. I have decided to read the smaller books in completion every day during this season. It has been interesting to say the least.

I am caught up in the expectations that Paul has on Timothy, not only for Timothy, but also for the church in Ephesus. We see these expectations cover topics like, false teaching, love, law, worship, leadership, behavior, even to Widows. I know this isn't a surprise to most of you, we always expect Paul to have high expectations for those that claim to follow Jesus. Rather i believe the surprise should be related to the expectations you have of yourself as a follower of Jesus. Often believers will get to a point where their expectations are no longer for themselves, but are only projected on others (I believe some of these people consider themselves "mature"). There are times even when an older believer's expectations are no longer even based on scripture, rather they have been mixed or diluted with a person's feelings, traditions, or even political alignment.

Paul's advice to Timothy in chapter 4 is mixed with encouragement, he tells him to not let people look down on him because of his age, but rather to be the example. After this verse Paul goes further and tells him, "Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress. Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers." (vs15-16)

I feel like sometimes we forget these last two verse of chapter 4. Maybe we've done a good job of being an example when we were young, but overtime it could have changed. Again, sometimes we read scripture not so we can be more like Jesus, instead we sometimes read scripture to be more right than the other person. I believe we should continue to follow Paul's advice to timothy, "Be diligent", no matter what age or stage of life we are.
