

Policy and Code of Conduct Agreement

Tuition

<u>1 utton</u>
Tuition is \$250 per month. A couple times a year there will be 5 lessons in a month,
and a couple times a year such as Thanksgiving and Christmas, there will be 3
lessons per month. <i>Tuition is due the first week of the month.</i> A \$20 late
fee will be assessed for tuition paid after the first week. Venmo, Paypal, Cash, Check,
ApplePay, or Cash App are accepted.*I acknowledge that \$250 tuition is due the first
week of the month and agree to pay the \$20 late fee on day 8 of each month. Twice a
week=\$450, Three times a week= \$600
Parent Child:
Missed lessons and make ups: We do not offer make-up or re-scheduled riding
lessons. We continue our policy of Horse Management lessons being the make up
lessons available to students who have to miss a lesson or reschedule. These are not
on the horse. They are on the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Wednesday of each month from September-
May. They are hands on lessons on varying horse topics from health to first aid and
many other topics. *I understand that there are not "make up riding lessons", but
that a student may attend Horse Management lessons on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays
at 4-5 pm and that it is up to me to utilize that program for a make up lesson.
Parent Child:
Horse Management: We welcome all Whitebrook Farm students, at no additional
cost, to attend these education classes at 4-5pm on the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Wednesdays of
each month September-May. Boots are required.
Pony Club and costs: Please see ponyclub.org for info. Costs include national and
regional memberships and average \$195 per year. These fees are not payable to
Whitebrook Farm, but go to the national and regional offices. If you are ready to sign
up for pony club, the Center Administrator (Christina Ranes for Whitebrook Farm)
must send you an email invite for you to complete membership. Horse Management
class is an important of Pony Club and needs to be a priority for pony club members
to attend. Pony Club members should ride twice or three times a week and can take
advantage of our twice a week lesson discount. Only pony club members who are
riding twice a week may attend an off-property show.
*I understand the requirements of pony club.
Parent Child:
<u>Clothing and Boots</u> : Paddock or Tall boots are always required and no student will
be allowed to ride without them. No fashion/Walmart/Target/Cowboy or other
casual boots are allowed. They must be paddock or tall riding boots for safety.
Breeches or riding tights are required for that extra grip that helps the rider, and
also to protect the saddle from scratches that jeans may make. If a rider is wearing
pants with décor on the pockets or seat, they may not be able to ride so that the
saddle is not damaged. *I understand the clothing and boot requirements.
Parent Child:

Spectators: We are so happy to share our farm with you. We ask that visitors
supervise children and STAY OFF LANDSCAPED AREAS. Please no climbing trees on
rocks. DO NOT FEED HORSES. ALL VISITORS must wear closed toe shoes while on
the property. *I agree to abide by the rules for spectators
Parent Child:
<u>Farm Risks:</u> There are rattlesnakes, scorpions, biting and stinging insects, stinging
nettle or other irritant plants, and animals that may bite, kick, or step on feet. This is
why footwear, appropriate supervision, and vigilance is required while on the
property. *I acknowledge the possible farm risks and will read and sign the release
of liability to properly understand the inherent dangers of riding and spectating at
Whitebrook Farm.
Parent Child:
<u>Time</u> : While your lesson is 1 hour, it is expected and required to properly care for
and clean up after your horse and equipment. This usually takes an extra 10-15
minutes. A checklist posted in the barn lists sweeping up after your horse (debris
picked out of hooves, pee and poop <i>left in the barn or wash rack area</i>), wiping
saddle and bridle down after riding, putting all equipment away, rinsing the horse if
appropriate and directed by instructor, putting fly mask back on your horse once
put away. If you are 15 minutes later or more, you will miss your lesson because
you wont have time to properly groom and tack up. While lessons are scheduled for
1 hour, there are times when the instructor may go over the lesson time in order to
work through an issue with any particular horse or rider. We know your time is
valuable, but we also believe that you are at Whitebrook Farm because you value
the quality of your equine education. Safety and quality will always come first.
Please be patient if a lesson does go overtime, and plan for the "clean up and care
time" after the lesson. *I have read and understand the time commitment for each
lesson to properly care for and clean up after my horse.
Parent Child:
<u>Curriculum and progression</u> : Beginning students start in the round pen, a smaller
riding pen that limits risk to students as they learn to ride. As students
appropriately progress, the instructor makes the decision to move them to the arena
lessons. This usually will be change in instructor, and possibly the horse they are
riding. Most changes in arena take place at the semester change. Our detailed riding
skills curriculum is available in the barn for anyone to read. We try to keep students
on the same horse for as long as that horse is appropriate for the student to learn
on. But in order to keep your student and all Whitebrook Farm students safe, we
may make changes to who the student rides at any time. Please talk to your student
about becoming possessive about the horse they ride. We want everyone to connect
with and love the horses they are building relationships with. But ultimately, they
are Whitebrook Farm horses. Phrases like "why are you riding my horse" or "this
horse likes me better" have no place at this facility as they don't foster kindness and
community. Please be positive and encouraging to the riders and fellow students in
the barn seeking to help and build, rather than compare and tear down. *I agree to
give my best effort in making Whitebrook Farm a place that is safe and positive for
everyone.
