«The questionnaire which had the most reliable sensitivity and specificity is the DCDdaily-Q. The DCDdaily-Q is currently the only questionnaire which has a good balance between the categories of items. It can identify children with and without DCD. In order to confirm this assumption, more cultural and psychometric validation is still needed.» (Kaiser Marie-Laure, Albert JM & Cantell MH, 2015)


What the international guidelines (European Academy of Childhood Disability) say about DCDdaily-Q: "The DCDdaily is a parent questionnaire, which exclusively examines ADL. The DCDdaily-Q seems to be a valid and reliable (only internal consistency) questionnaire about children's acquisition of performance and regular participation in ADL. It is the first questionnaire to provide insight into the broad range of ADL that children with DCD seem to struggle with every day." (Rainer Blank & al, 2011)

TRANSLATION AND ADAPTATION OF DCDdaily-Q (AUTUMN 2020 TO DATE)

Attracted by the evidence, I experimented with the English version of the DCDdaily-Q with two parent-collaborators. Noticing its clinical advantages, I undertook a translation. I also modified the framework to encourage the parents' engagement and reflection. My two dedicated collaborators agreed to validate and comment on my improved translation of the questionnaire.
