### Operating Budget

Safe Streets was allocated \$250k through the Department of Commerce

HB 1221 (Rep. Orwall), Improving crisis planning in schools to prevent youth suicide

HB 1920 (Rep. Mossbrucker), Assessing patient anxiety

ESHB 1504 (Rep. Klippert), Concerning impaired driving

SB 5216 (Sen. O'Ban), Developing multistage threat assessments to increase safety in K-12 schools and institutions of higher education

SB 5340 (Sen. Kuderer), Banning the sale of assault weapons and large capacity magazines

SSB 5464 (Sen. Frockt), Concerning opioid overdose medication at schools with grades seven through twelve and higher education institutions

SB 5546 (Sen. Conway), Creating a pilot project to establish an enhanced 211 drug line in certain counties

SSB 5549 (Sen. Liias), Modernizing resident distillery marketing and sales restrictions

SB 5636 (Sen. Brown), Concerning fiscal notes

SB 5685 (Sen. Bailey), Requiring a primary contact in schools to recognize, screen, and respond to emotional or behavioral distress in students

SB 5835 (Sen. Brown), Creating a hotline to receive reports of potential self-harm and criminal acts

SB 5940 (Sen. Keiser), Imposing a business and occupation surtax on prescription opioid drugs

SB 5988 (Sen. Carlyle), Reducing a tax preference for prescription drug warehousing to invest in opioid abuse treatment services in rural and high-need areas

SB 6007 (Sen. Keiser), Increasing the tax on cigarettes

SJM 8008 (Sen. Bailey), Urging federal legislation to prohibit the sale of tobacco and vapor products to anyone under the age of twenty-one [But raising the age via our own legislation probably sends an even more effective message]
