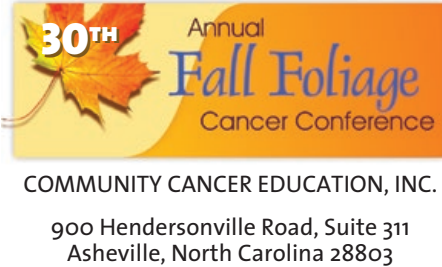

## Cancer.

**Assistance.** 21st Century C.A.R.E. provides patients immediate financial assistance for incidental expenses related to active cancer treatments. This allows the patient to put his/her focus where it belongs – on beating the disease.

We actively participate in Community Health Fairs and provide free screenings for breast, prostate, skin and other cancers. We can even provide noted physicians for speaking engagements and lecture series.
