
As businesses emerge from the past year of Covid-19 restrictions and high streets begin to fully reopen and resume trading, the

The benefits



The effects of supporting the Scotland Loves Local Gift Card will be powerful - fuelling the "feel-good factor" in our town and city centres, and keeping community spend local for longer.

By supporting the rollout of the Scotland Loves Local Gift Card in your area - urging stores to sign up as part of the programme - you will be encouraging more shoppers to stay local, triggering a lucrative multiplier effect on the region's economy. It will protect jobs encourage more local investment and reduce travel out of the area.

For everyone, it's win-win, providing another way by which locals can support businesses in their communities - driving footfall and stimulating wider economic activity as people spend more time in towns and shopping areas close to home.

Research by Miconex has found that multi-venue gift cards such as Scotland Loves Local's grew in popularity during 2020 - giving people the power to spend with many different businesses.



The average purchase price of a gift card is £34.56 but recipients of a gift card see this as 'free money' and will spend up to an additional 65%, supporting not only local shops, but cafes, restaurants, leisure and cultural attractions too. They will also be more experimental, trying out new businesses which they may have never used before.

The mechanics of the system guarantee that cards can only be accepted within the region for which they are branded, ensuring it is a true grassroots gift to the local economy.

The Scotland Loves Local Gift Card is the ideal way to support your local area, from individual family gifts, to corporate reward and incentive schemes which ensure that the spend supports local jobs and communities.

Case Study 1



East Ayrshire Council - transferring local spending power to residents

East Ayrshire Council has used the Gift Card platform to distribute 4500 gift cards to families over Easter, as part of a support care package.

The initiative has allowed local families to redeem the disbursed funds with dignity at over 120 participating businesses in East Ayrshire.

Case Study 2



East Lothian - keeping incentive schemes' value in the local economy

The local authority used to provide department store vouchers for long-service awards - now it's the local Gift Card, locking the value into the local economy and making a statement of support for local businesses.

About Scotland Loves Local



Scotland Loves Local is the national drive for people to support their community's recovery from the coronavirus pandemic by thinking local first.

Launched in July 2020, the Campaign - delivered by Scotland's Towns Partnership and supported by a range of partners, including the Scottish Government - has been credited with shining a spotlight on the importance of local businesses and the people behind them, recognising the remarkable ways in which they have supported those around the during Covid-19. That has included celebrating Scotland's High Street Heroes.

The emotional drive behind the campaign is to encourage people to support their local town centres out of a sense of localism, loyalty and community solidarity, much in the same way communities came together during the worst of the lockdown period.
