**Monthly Command Report**

**For February Emergency Response:**

For the month of February, there were a total of **23** fire calls.

For the month of February, there were total of **36 911** EMS calls **21** transports and **15** non- transports. Of the transports, there were **18** ALS and **03** BLS calls.

In addition, there were **15** facility transfers completed.

For the month of February there were a total of **51** EMS runs.

ALS- Advanced Life Support

BLS- Basic Life Support

Average response time for the month was **06** minutes and **36** seconds. This is a door-to-door time.

**Emergency Vehicles:**

**B-22:** Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service.

**B-21B (New Heavy):** Apparatus is being checked daily without major issues to report.

**2 ½ Ton 22 B:** Apparatus is being checked daily and is in Service.

**E-22:** No change in status.

**E-21:** Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

**Loaner Engine:** Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. We are responsible for any repairs while it is in our possession. Siddons is allowing us to keep the unit in our possession until the tank repairs on T22 are complete.

**T-22:** Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service.

**M-22:** The unit is being checked daily and is in service without any major issues to report.

**M-23:** The unit is being checked daily and is in service.

**M-21 (New Medic Unit):** Due to a cracked radiator, the unit was towed to Atascosa Dodge. A new radiator was installed, fuel injector service & routine oil change were all performed. The unit is back in service and is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

**Rescue 22:** Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. This unit is still being utilized as a temporary Command. The unit will need the suspension, brakes & exhaust system serviced soon.

### **MISC:**

Crews have begun working with commercial properties in the district to update our pre plans as part of our gear up for a new ISO survey to be conducted in the Spring/Summer of 2023. The new engine being built by Pierce is currently tracking to be completed the first week of May.

### **Personnel:**

Chief Officers have continued to work shift vacancies, when possible, in effort to keep overtime costs down.

### **Station:**

Any public walk ups to the department are being redirected to the front doors instead on leaving the apparatus bays open. This is to ensure health safety for both the public and the personnel.

Station 1 had a pipe break at the rear exterior. Crews were able to shut the water off and repair the pipe in house.

A 40 yard construction roll off dumpster is currently at Station 1 to support Spring cleaning.

We need to start staggering purchases of new mattresses & chairs due to the state of the current ones at both stations.

### **Grants/Donations:**

The Command Staff is currently working on several grants. Firehouse Grants is assisting us with obtaining funding for new SCBA's.

### **Public Relations:**

We are currently working with several entities to plan PR events for spring & summer.

**Fleet Summary:** Our biggest obstacle remains to be the age and condition of apparatus and equipment, leaving more equipment out of service than in service. This has continued to cause a decrease in the quality of relationships with surrounding departments as well as confidence in the equipment from the staff.

**Misc.:** Staff completed a 2 day Engine Ops class that was provided by Coyote Fire Training at no cost. We provided a room at the Holiday Inn Express in Floresville for the instructors to stay

as a courtesy due to their travel from Hutto, TX. The full 2-day course involved classroom and hands on training over tactics geared towards departments working incidents with minimal staff.
