Monthly Command Report

For December 2020

Emergency Response:

For the month of December, there were a total of **25** fire calls. Average response time for the month was **8** minutes and **08** seconds. This is a door-to-door time. An increased response time was experienced due to mechanical issues. Additional information can be viewed in the all in one report for the month.

For the month of December, there were total of **38** EMS calls with **26** Transports and **12** non- transports. Of the transports, there were **21** ALS and **05** BLS calls.

ALS- Advanced Life Support

BLS- Basic Life Support

Emergency Vehicles:

B-21(91)- Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

5-TON/B92: Apparatus is out of service due to a blown head gasket, but still runs and drive. The apparatus will be decommissioned and sold. Funds from sale will cover repairs to a light brush truck.

2 ½ Ton/B 21(93): Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

E-22(90): Apparatus is still out of service. Annual PM is currently on hold.

E-21(91): Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

T-21(90): Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

M-23(90): The apparatus is being checked daily and is in good working order. The new gear steering box and bushings have been installed by Billy Bob's; all is working properly. This unit will be shifted to a transfer unit once the new medic unit is in service.

M-22(91): The apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

M-21 (New Medic Unit): Unit has been delivered by Siddons. The unit is being stocked and made ready to put into service.

Command: The unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report. We have been working to update some of the on-board equipment in house.

Rescue 21 (90): Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. The apparatus received a new set of tires at Billy Bob's.

MISC:

All front-line apparatus including base station radios have been updated.

Sherriff Stewart has required for all agencies to change their call numbers and unit numbers. This is to have a more uniformed approach as a county.

The first number in an apparatus ID is the District number, therefore all of our unit numbers now start with a 2. This required us to quickly update the decals on each unit.

Siddons was able to meet the demand of the short time frame. All units have had their unit numbers updated for under \$500.00. This included the cost of making the new decals, removing the old ones, and installing the new numbers.

Personnel:

We are still working to increase our number of local volunteers.

Inactive personnel will be removed from the roster in the month of December.

Administration:

***Command staff has been working closely with local and state agencies to ensure that our department is professionally trained and prepared for anything that may come from the recent COVID-19 outbreak.

The agreements for the employee retirement have been completed and are under review by our attorney.

Training:

EMS

Crews reviewed and worked on Adult Cardiac Life Support skills and standards

Fire

Crews completed multiple days of joint department training with Bexar County ESD 10 on Jet siphoning and drafting operations

Station:

Any public walk ups to the department are being redirected to the front doors instead on leaving the apparatus bays open. This is to ensure health safety for both the public and the personnel. The alerting system at Station 2 has been installed by Industrial Communications and is working properly.

Grants/Donations:

Crews will continue working on the new Heavy brush truck in house, this must be in service by May per the Forestry service.

We are currently working on compiling information needed to submit our application for the current FEMA Assistance to Firefighters grant

Public Relations:

All public relation events have been postponed until further notice due to COVID-19.

Fire: Our biggest obstacle remains to be the age and condition of apparatus and equipment. The new Edraulic rescue tools are anticipated to be received either at the end of January or beginning of February.

EMS:

The Standard Medical Operating Protocols are currently under annual review by Doctor Ogden and Chief Marconi.

Misc.: A major focus point of the department has been to create a strong professional working relationship with surrounding departments.
