Monthly Command Report

For March Emergency Response:

For the month of March, there were a total of **33** fire calls.

For the month of March, there were a total of **40 911** EMS calls **35** transports and **05** non- transports. Of the transports, there were **27** ALS and **08** BLS calls.

In addition, there were **38** facility transfers completed.

For the month of March there were a total of **78** EMS runs.

ALS- Advanced Life Support

BLS- Basic Life Support

Average response time for the month was **06** minutes and **50** seconds. This is a door-to-door time.

Emergency Vehicles:

B-22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service.

B-21B (New Heavy): Apparatus is being checked daily without major issues to report.

2 ½ Ton 22 B: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in Service.

E-22: No change in status.

E-21: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

Loaner Engine: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. We are responsible for any repairs while it is in our possession. Siddons is allowing us to keep the unit in our possession until the tank repairs on T22 are complete.

T-22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. The apparatus is scheduled to go to Siddons on April 2nd for a 104 point inspection and repair plan for the damaged Poly tank.

M-22: The unit is being checked daily and is in service without any major issues to report. This unit was used in place of M21 until repairs were completed.

M-23: The unit is being checked daily and is in service.

M-21 (New Medic Unit): The unit is being checked daily and is in service. M21 was OOS from March 14th-March 27th due to a gasket malfunction from the recent maintenance job, we were able to get the issue addressed at no cost to us.

Rescue 22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. This unit is still being utilized as a temporary Command. The unit will need the suspension, brakes & exhaust system serviced soon.

MISC:

Crews have begun working with commercial properties in the district to update our pre plans as part of our gear up for a new ISO survey to be conducted in the Spring/Summer of 2023. The new engine being built by Pierce is currently tracking to be completed May 15th.

Personnel:

Chief Officers have continued to work shift vacancies assigned to apparatus, when possible, in an effort to keep overtime costs down.

Inactive personnel were removed from the roster per department policies.

Administration:

TCDRS is still in process and is currently in the meeting phase with the ESD board retirement committee.

Fire

Crews reviewed and trained on the following:

- Hose Deployment
- Scene size up
- Drafting Operations
- Primary & Secondary Search

- Emergency Vehicle Operations

Station:

Any public walk ups to the department are being redirected to the front doors instead on leaving the apparatus bays open. This is to ensure health safety for both the public and the personnel.

Station 1 had a plumbing failure in the kitchen. This is being addressed and fixed in house.

A 40 yard construction roll off dumpster is currently at Station 1 to support Spring cleaning.

We need to start staggering purchases of new mattresses & chairs due to the state of the current ones at both stations.

Grants/Donations:

The Command Staff is currently working on several grants. A grant to cover new SCBA's for the department is currently the top priority due to age.

Public Relations:

We are currently working with several entities to plan PR events for spring & summer.

Fleet Summary: Our biggest obstacle remains to be the age and condition of apparatus and equipment, leaving more equipment out of service than in service.
