This committee met with Blake High alumni on August 3, 1991 in the Blake Cafeteria to discuss the two alumni groups working together to get both schools rebuilt. Eleven years later both schools were open again, with first Blake in August of 1997 and then Middleton Senior High School, in August of 2002. Middleton Senior High School is now a 52-acre, \$40 million facility located just three blocks from its original site.

The Middleton Senior High School Alumni Association, Inc. became incorporated with the State of Florida on May 29, 1992, with Middletonian Atty. Frank Stewart serving as registered agent. Fred Hearns served as president from 1991 through 2000 and Tyrone A. Brown has been president for the past three years.

The organization is hosting its <u>fourth</u> All-Class Reunion this year and has frequently recognized former teachers — most notably Coach William O. Bethel and Coach Abraham R. Brown with the naming of the school's new gymnasium and football stadium, respectively, in their honor. The organization sponsored the alumni wall and numerous other school and community projects since its inception.
