Feature Article

Wind River Range Wyoming

I took my GS to Wyoming to try it out off highway. This is my first BMW and first true adventure bike. That thing really will do everything I've heard about. It handles great in the dirt.

I wanted to take a few day rides and stay in a hotel at night. We stayed in Lander and Pinedale. The US Forrest service office in Lander was very helpful. I picked up the maps and recommended rides there.

Sink Canyon from the top looking back at Lander. A nice bit of mountain switchbacks to the top.







The gravel roads once you leave the black top.



Mountain lakes are abundant in the Wind River Range. This is Fiddlers Lake.



Once you get off the maintained gravel it gets rough quickly. This road exceeded my skill level.



Typical vista along US Forest Service road 300. I'm stopped at the 4-wheeler unloading area for road 355 to Christina Lake. Once again the trail exceeded my skill level.



Once I got off route 300 I tried a different spot that wasn't so full of trees.



On the way to Pinedale I rode out to South Pass City.



A bit further up Limestone Mountain.



The next day I rode from Pinedale to Green Lakes, the head waters of the Green River.





I'm from Iowa and this is not your Iowa grandmother's gravel. I made adjustments to suspension and tire pressure and got an upgrade on my skills. The washboard took a bit to figure out. A bit faster is better. I found 25-30 about right.

Getting a bit more off-road. The area was littered with campers. I was never alone for long.



I'm used to boat ramps but this was kind of a boat ramp for 4-wheelers.





The Green River was always by your side.



Oh and lots of free range cows.

The next day I took a quick ride into Red Canyon.



MSTA Track Day is Coming! - Part III

You already know about the MSTA/COG track day coming in February 2017. Dennis has been working hard

to make sure this is really going to happen.

Noted motorcycle guru Ken Condon will be on hand as the senior instructor, with assistance from Becky, myself, other instructors and safety riders.

In Part I of this article we already talked about the general event information. Now we want to focus on how this non-sport bike track day is going to benefit attending Riders.

First, you have to recognize the advantages of a race track. You are riding on good pavement, with a groomed surface, good traction and a known path of travel. You get to ride the same track/path over and over again, until you become very familiar with how the pavement feels, the approaches to the corners, the radius and change in radius for each corner. You don't have to worry about the riding surface, but rather can use it to your advantage.

Next, look at the traffic. It is all going in the same direction. There are very specific rules to the traffic, which EVERYONE follows. The other traffic is a known quantity. Additionally, the track activity (riding) will be monitored by safety riders. This means you don't have to be overly concerned with silly stuff from other track riders.

So if you don't have to worry about either the riding surface or the traffic, what does that do for you? If frees your mind (think "The Matrix"!). It allows you to now focus entirely on your riding technique. Want to practice your braking? Lots of opportunities for this, with the approach to every corner. Need to work on your cornering technique? Well, Jennings has 14 corners (9 left and 5 right) that will give your technique a workout. How about basic skills like head and eye usage, etc.? Don't worry about that, you'll

be looking as far ahead as you can, once you get used to track riding techniques.

Now we'll throw in another benefit. We will have Ken and other instructors on hand, to work with Riders as a group, and one-on-one as needed or requested, to improve on all these skills.

There is another very unique benefit to a practice track day. It actually improves and speeds up your riding reflexes. Because most riders tend to ride faster on the track, by necessity their riding and response reflexes





have to speed up. This means that when you transition back to the street, your improved reflexes makes handling non-routine situations even easier. In essence, it slows down the event, as your improved reflexes (from eye movement/line of sight to muscle memory and everything in-between) have sped up from your track experience.

One last benefit? You'll have a blast! More than one new non-sport bike track rider has become a dedicated track junkie.

Come out to track, get the chance to absorb Ken's expertise, and explore your own riding at the same time. You won't regret it!
