Latest Helmet Scores!

Ok, I'm on my helmet wearing warpath again. I know that as responsible riders and MSTA members, everyone reading this column ALWAYS wears their helmet, right? However we have probably all had the helmet discussion with those less enlightened. To help you out the next time you attempt to discuss this issue with the cranially unprotected, here are some of the newest facts.

The June issue of *Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery*, the official medical journal of the American Society of Plastic Surgeons, says that in Michigan, head and facial injuries in motorcycle crashes has doubled since the state relaxed its motorcycle helmet laws.



Michigan repealed its universal motorcycle helmet law in 2012, in favor of the now in vogue "Over 21 no helmet as long as you meet criteria" statute. In this case, the criteria are a combination of training/experience and insurance coverage.

The study took three years of crashes before the change in the helmet law and 3 years after. This included 4,643 motorcycle trauma patients seen at 29 Michigan trauma centers. Here are the results of the study:

- ♣ Under the new law, the percentage of motorcycle trauma patients riding without helmets more than doubled, from 20 to 44 percent. Go figure...
- The study specifically addressed cranio-maxillo-facial (CMF) injuries. That translates to head, jaw and facial areas.
- The rate of CMF injuries increased from 25.5 percent to 37.2 percent, including an increase of 28 percent in fractures and a 56 percent increase in soft tissue injuries.
- Fractures of cheekbones increased significantly.
- So did facial lacerations, contusions and abrasions.
- Based on the study's findings, researchers estimate wearing a motorcycle helmet can decrease the risk of facial trauma by half, while requiring all riders to wear helmets could cut facial injuries by more than 30 per cent.
- So what does all this mean? Simple.
- Anyone who argues that helmets do not protect a rider doesn't understand or just doesn't care about the realities of risk in our sport.
- Helmets save lives and protect motorcyclists.
- Given the rate of increased maxillofacial injuries in the study, a full face helmet will give more protection than a "beanie", half or 3/4 helmet.

It goes back to the rider. You may never change their opinion, but at least you'll have more information for the discussion.

Oh, and just in case you've ever thought about riding without a helmet, you should look up the study. It may change your mind, too.

When I first drove by, I thought the place was still empty. But after driving past, turning around and going the other way, I spied some bikes outside. So I stopped and went in. They opened in mid-May and are still getting set up, still waiting on deliveries, etc. A grand opening is in the works. But they have a good selection of BMW's and a several Triumphs and are already making sales and doing service.





The owner is a Triumph dealer in Dade County. The GM came here from Jacksonville where he was at a BMW dealership. There's also a sales guy, a parts/service manager and a service tech with level-2 training. I'm told their shop







rate is \$95/hour which is very reasonable for a BMW dealer. They expect to support an area from Daytona to Orlando to Stuart or a little further down with customer-oriented sales and service. This is an exciting and welcome development. While they have some new Triumphs there, they are still in discussions with Triumph about becoming a dealer.

They also plan on having a bike night on the first Thursday of the month with the possibility of expanding to two per month at some point.
