Wizard's Wild Weekend 10th Anniversary Gathering

I attended this MSTA Just-for-Fun event, April 1 - April 3 in Cedar Key, Florida. Kevin Healey, a/k/a Wizard, organizes this yearly event. Kevin is a longtime rider who has formed friendships through the years with motorcyclists living all over the country. In fact, as an aside, a few years ago when I bought a used F650GS as a second "fun" bike, Kevin told me that he rode an F650GS when he traveled to Prudhoe Bay, Alaska. Some of those friends who accompanied Kevin on that "Haul Road" trip also attended Wizard's 10th anniversary gathering.

A number of MSTA riders and others from South Florida followed a route planned by Jim Park that took us from Wellington, Florida, on

back roads to Cedar Key (300+ miles). We left Friday morning and headed north. Yes, north! No "fooling" on April 1st. Cedar Key is not in the Florida Keys but instead almost directly west of Ocala, except that Cedar Key is on the Gulf of Mexico, not in the center of the state. Here are a couple pictures taken at our lunch stop at Cherry Pocket on Lake Pierce in Lakes Wales.





Van led one group, initially of seven bikes, and I led the second group, initially of six bikes. Re-grouping occurred after our lunch stop. Jim's route took us through orange groves where the smell of orange blossoms



permeated the air, on canopied roads that provided some shade from the sun and heat, and on roads with sweeping curves. We arrived in Cedar Key with just enough time to check into our rooms and get ready for the Friday evening meal.

What do we do at Wizard's Wild Weekends? Well, we always do a lot of eating! For this special anniversary gathering, Kevin and Deborah Healey rented the Cedar Key Community Center for Friday and Saturday. They arranged for a catered buffet dinner both evenings. No worries about enough table seating in restaurants this time! Yum! The food was excellent.

I'll provide some background info as to exactly why this 10th anniversary was special. The usual weekend for Kevin's ride is the first weekend in December. Several years ago (in 2012) Kevin and Deborah were severely injured in a horrific crash as they led the group ride to Cedar Key. Two young fellows with total disregard for traffic laws decided to pass our group. They were speeding in the left lane of a two-lane highway, and their car reached Kevin and Deborah, who were riding two-up, just as Kevin began turning left. The high impact crash left Kevin with a severed leg and other broken bones and Deborah with multiple injuries to her left leg. When the paramedics arrived, they commented that Kevin survived at the scene only because one of our quick-thinking riders took off his webbed belt and used it as a tourniquet on Kevin's thigh.

Needless to say, what followed has been years of multiple surgeries for Deborah's mangled leg in an effort to save it. Kevin has had to learn how to function without his left leg and to walk with a prosthetic leg. Prayers have been offered at every stage of their recovery which has required the expertise of some truly skilled

surgeons.

This weekend celebrated Kevin and Deborah's survival and moving forward with life. Kevin's positive outlook has been an inspiration to all who know him and to the new friends made the past few years. The Friday evening dinner was titled a "Meet and Greet" by Kevin and Saturday's evening gathering called a "Celebration of Recovery." For both evenings, prior to heading to the buffet line, we all stood as Kevin played a video of the National Anthem sung by Lady Gaga at the Super Bowl in February. A marvelous rendition! What did we do before YouTube? The adjacent photo shows Kevin, daughter Faren, Deborah, and even their dog Roxy sneaking in the photo.

Poster-sized enlargements of photos depicting various events including motorcycling journeys of Kevin and his friends were placed on walls around the room. They were an interesting tribute to a lifetime of friendships made and inspirational to those of us







reading the inscriptions. Even the few of family had interesting, if not amusing, stories associated with them! Kevin is an excellent narrator and teller of tales!

A Saturday morning lunch ride to another location is planned for Wizard's weekend. This year the ride was to <u>Salt Creek</u> <u>Restaurant</u> in Suwannee, Florida. Some adventurous riders went on this 100+ mile ride but I stayed behind in Cedar Key this year. After being up way too late on Friday evening, then listening to the thunder and rain before it was time to awake on Saturday, I needed more sleep! The weather had improved by the 10:30 am rider departure time but a late breakfast was on my mind instead.

Okay, so what else is there to do in Cedar Key? Since once in Cedar Key, you can park your motorcycle at your motel/condo/B&B and then walk around town, some of us stop in at the Big Deck on Friday and/or Saturday evenings for an alcoholic beverage or two or more! Across the street from Big Deck is the Black Dog bar where you can engage in a lively game of darts, listen to the singer/guitar player, maybe sing along, and after more beers or drinks, walk or stumble back to your room.

This year since I didn't go on the Saturday ride, I finally made it to Tony's for their famous clam chowder. It was perfectly seasoned and I was glad I'd ordered a bowl and not just a cup. I'll definitely return to Tony's again next time I'm in Cedar Key. Nearby was the Cedar Key Historical Museum which I understand should be on my list of places to see. That will have to wait until "next time" though.

Of course, water activities are the heart of Cedar Key.

Offshore and inshore boating and fishing opportunities abound. With Saturday's gloomy and windy day, being on the water wasn't the best choice this year. However, in recent years a number of our riders took advantage of various boat trips, and others rode over to Cedar Key's small airport and ended up taking a short flight for a bird's eye view of the town. You always see a lot of folks riding around on golf







carts they rent by the hour, half day, etc. We could tease and say they're practicing for when they move to The Villages in Florida! Before dinner on Saturday evening, I saw fellow rider Dan Barnett finishing up his ride on



an electric bicycle he had rented. That looked like an interesting activity to try in the future.

Oh, yes. I almost forgot about the cats. Lots of cats in Cedar Key. I thought that hanging around the Hemingway House in Key West was the place to see cats. Maybe, but there's no shortage of cats in Cedar Key.

The sunsets in Cedar Key are spectacular. No so this weekend but that's another reason to return time and time again. Watching the sun sinking below the horizon on the Gulf of Mexico and seeing the sky changing colors is a photographer's dream. You will see cameras set on tripods with folks anxiously waiting to capture the setting sun. A couple years ago Jim Park took some sunset pictures that included a kayaker in the foreground. Just stunning!



Our usual Saturday evening dinner at a local restaurant cost each of us \$25 but this year with the use of the Community Center, Kevin asked us to contribute \$25 for each evening which included our buffet dinner and a small amount towards the fee for rental of the Community Center. We were asked to pay the total on Saturday evening. With cash in hand our names were written on an envelope and we put our \$50 inside, assuming we'd attended both evenings. At the end of Saturday's gathering, Kevin surprised us by making a special request. From the box of envelopes, Kevin called our names individually and the envelopes were returned to us. When we turned them over, a yellow sticker had been placed on the back of the envelope challenging us to Pay It Forward. Kevin and Deborah had pre-paid for these two catered evening dinners and the hall rental and did not want to be reimbursed! In appreciation, we were encouraged to donate our cash to someone in need or to a cause with special meaning to us. What a great idea! "My Pay It Forward \$\$\$" were donated the same week I returned from Cedar Key.

Sunday morning dawned without rain in the view. Time already to pack up our motorcycles, say goodbye to friends traveling in other directions, and decide on a route to return home.

A common thread when attending a gathering of motorcyclists: lots of hugs, sharing of stories, making new friends, and of course eating! This definitely happened in Cedar Key.

Road Trip!

Becky and I will be road tripping during the first week of May. We're riding first up to North Carolina so she can attend a Women's Rider Conference in Little Switzerland. From there we are parting company. She will ride home and I'm riding to Birmingham, for work meetings with the Barber Racetrack folks before turning for home.

It's Spring. That means road trips for a lot of folks. With road trips comes preparation. Here are some thoughts for preparing you and your bike for that upcoming long distance journey:

- Maintenance! Is the bike ready? No, it won't make it those last thousand miles before you think the cords will start to show. If needed, replace the tires, both of them.
- ♣ Brakes. Check them. If the pads are getting close, change them! Why worry during the trip? If you don't know how to inspect pads, find someone who does. Or look it up. Easy to do and a critical safety item on the list.
- Fluids? Is this starting to sound like a T-CLOCK check? That's because basically it is the same thing. Are you due, or close to an oil change interval? Same applies to that chain condition, or your final drive service. Just Do It!
- & General Bike Condition: Cables, hoses, fasteners, wheels, all that stuff.
- Equipment: Now we're talking safety equipment. That means tools (and knowing what to take, not those stupid "all-in-one", prepackaged kits. Take what you need and what fits your bike. Don't forget the tire patch kit (I prepare the old-fashioned strings and glue, just because they still seem to work the best and are the most versatile, but there are other solutions out there). Along with that comes a miniature air compressor and tire gauge.
- First Aid Kit: Please don't set off on a journey without one. How big and complete is up to you, but something as simple as a splinter can ruin your riding day.
- Rain Suit: One-piece or two-piece. It is up to you. A rain suit is not a convenience on a long trip. It is a necessity. I prefer two-piece, just because of the more flexible combinations.
- Finally, a SPOT. If you don't know what a SPOT is by now, you aren't a real rider! Get it and learn to use at least the basic features. It's a great way for the family to keep track of you as well. A note on SPOTs: Do not attach them to the bike. Keep it on your person. If the unthinkable happens and you are lying in the ditch, you may not be able to crawl back up and reach your bike-mounted SPOT to hit the emergency beacon.
- Finally, the Rider: Are YOU ready? Physically, are you in shape? Mentally, are you prepared for the journey?

One Final Thought: We're all going to put a lot of miles on our bikes this year. Let's look out for ourselves and one another. Ride your own ride and know your limits. And as always: ATGATT!




