Contrary to popular belief, the terms cool and hip can be synonymous with <u>Appalachia</u>. Yeah, sure, you have <u>Asheville, NC</u> in the <u>Blue Ridge</u> area and <u>Burlington, VT</u> in the <u>Green Mountains</u> area. But, what about other small Appalachian towns? I've been to <u>Blowing Rock, NC</u> a few times, and while it can be a little too touristy for me during the peak season, it's a cool little town up in the <u>Appalachian Mountains</u>. I've also read and have heard a lot about <u>Greenville, SC</u>. I have never been to Greenville before. So, that was a good enough reason to get on the bike and head south.

On my way, it went through Mooresville, NC which is home to most of the NASCAR teams' home garages.

My view from my lunch location where I had the <u>She-Crab Soup</u> and a salad.



"Smoke on the Water." I didn't take my main camera, so the following shots are from my iPhone.












It was getting dark, so I made my way to the restaurant, passing by "Shoeless Joe Jackson."











