My fold out table came in damn handy! I have a couple of chairs that stow into a small bag as well. Overall I learned a lot about what did work for camping and what failed.




Smallmouth bass fishing, tubing, canoes, great music, beer chicken right off the spit, booze and beer. Yep, I'm a bit hurt this morning...

MSTA Track Day is Coming!- Part I

Hey, Everyone! Guess What? MSTA and COG (Concours Owners Group) are hosting a joint, [non-sportbike track day](#) on Friday, February 24, 2017, at [Jennings Raceway](#), in Jennings, FL.

I know I've talked about track days before (as have others), but now is a great time to outline the plan for the MSTA Track Day. First off, it is not "race day". There are no trophies, no races, no timed laps, etc. Instead, the MSTA Track Day is designed to be an opportunity for Riders who may not have track riding experience to go and safely explore their riding limits and those of their machine. Think of it as advanced riders training in a fun environment!

To help with this, MSTA President Dennis Villarose and the Executive Committee have been working with noted motorcycle guru [Ken Condon](#) to develop a track day specifically for MSTA (and we will have some Concours Owners Group Riders joining us as well).

Ken, as well as Becky, myself, and other instructors and assistants, will be on hand that day to work with the Riders on general riding techniques and principles. If you haven't had the opportunity to read Ken's writings and philosophies on motorcycling, I highly encourage you to look into [his offerings](#). As a recognized writer and expert in our sport, Ken brings a great set of knowledge and experience he is going to pass along to everyone!


So what is going to happen at track day? Here is the scoop...

First off, make sure you sign up in advance! See the information on the [MSTA website](#), under the calendar for February 2017.

Riders will show up between 7-7:30 AM on Track Day.

Event staff will be on hand to assist Riders with their bike setup, making sure they have safety equipment, etc.

There will be a morning Riders Meeting, where the track rules and the day's riding agenda will be reviewed for everyone.

Riders will be grouped according to their own and event staff assessments to help maximize safety and everyone's fun for the day, as well as to help with the training aspects of the day.

The track will open for riding at 9 AM. The groups will alternate between track time and time back in the pits and with event staff to discuss techniques, bike characteristics, control methodology, etc.

Lunch is included and will be catered, so everyone can relax around a good meal. Half the fun is the camaraderie!

After lunch, riding starts up again. The afternoon will be more open, as riders get the opportunity to work on their own technique, as well as those learned from the morning sessions.

By 5 PM, when the track riding closes, Riders will be exhausted. They will have spent the entire day working on their riding, learning their limits and the limits of their bikes, as well as absorbing and practicing new techniques.

Member Comment

In mid-October Tom Blake rode up to Hiwassee, GA for a few days and just submitted this brief article:

Ramblings from the Mountains

October 16 to 22, 2016... another fabulous trip to the Blue Ridge Mountains. I left Sunday and met up Monday with old riding buddy, Ken, who rode over from Greenville, NC. We both arrived at the [River's End Restaurant](#) at the [Nantahala Outdoor Center](#) in western North Carolina for lunch. Then off for a jaunt over back roads to Hiwassee to get checked in to the Holiday Inn Express. Then back out to take advantage of the moderate temps and long yearned for mountain riding.

Unlike April, when I was up there last, this time of year is when Mother Nature truly blesses with the colorful changing of the leaves. But that's not why I go up in October. It's the curvy roads, of course, and cooler weather. After a summer of sweat here in Florida, the cooler temperatures are hugely satisfying. Temps made it into the low 80's by the afternoons and 50's overnight. Thursday night a cold front came through dropping a little rain in the wee hours. Friday was breezy and overcast to start but the skies started clearing by mid-day. Low 70's was all it could muster and then down to the low 40's overnight into Saturday morning – which is when we started for home. Fortunately, I was prepared and, by layering, remained comfortable all the way home. The thermometer got up to 71 as I reentered Florida but then fell off at dusk. It took 11 hours in total, including gas stops, for the trip home of right at 600 miles. The whole week was very pleasant.

The last two times up there I had elected to trailer the bike due to a little bursitis on my sit-down parts. I found that certain vehicles aggravated the situation while others did not. The first time I rode the Beemer up, there were no issues. But something changed and riding for over an hour and a half became uncomfortable. I recently demoed a new [Motus MSTR](#) (Victory/Polaris dealer on US-1 south of Fort Pierce). The seat gave me absolutely no problems. (At \$36k, however, the Motus is not the answer. But damn, it was fun! He should also have an MST (non-R) in stock by now – only \$31k!) But compared to my

BMW, the Motus seat was lower and closer to the pegs. And this got me to thinking. Upon examination, I found that my BMW seat was in the high position both front and rear. So, I put the rear to the low position and voilà. The first day, I rode to Commerce, GA with no pain whatsoever. We rode between 200 and 300 miles every day while up there – no issues. And I rode all the way home in one day with no pain. I am a happy camper and once again a cross-country rider!

A good friend of mine retired and, with a partner, purchased a campground in the mountains north of Murphy, NC. They cater to motorcyclists, the Jeep crowd and others. It's called Crawford's Campground and they keep the grounds and facilities spotless. Here's the link: crawfordscg.com. From their website:

Conveniently located just 11 miles outside the historic town of Murphy, North Carolina, at an elevation of 1850 feet, surrounded by mountains! Closer to the natural beauty the area is known for. We are nestled in the center of a peaceful valley with a 360 degree view of the mountains that surround us. The campsites border the many bubbling streams that pass through our valley.

A Full Service Campground, we have 2 separate bath houses with private individual bathing facilities, 3 Bunkhouses as well as Primitive sites. We have a large pavilion for your group meetings, family reunions, fully lighted with electricity available.

We are open year round, be sure to check with the office to make proper precautions to prevent freezing, as you will be responsible for pipe freeze damage at your site.

So, from Murphy we rode Joe Brown and Hanging Dog Roads up to the campground and paid a visit. They will be advertising on a motorcycle touring map covering an area from Nashville to Ashville and northern GA to southern KY. The map includes 40 or so ride loops (paved). He gave us each a map to take along and I've already added a new loop to my ever-expanding list of roads ridden. The maps are free and are also available on line at WildRides.info. Check them out. The new route begins just west of Tellico Plains, TN. From 68, turn south on 39 to 315 and then left on 30 to Lake Ocoee. Being short of time, we then came east on 64 which in that area was scenic and kept us entertained.

During the week, we covered all the familiar territory including the [Cherohala Skyway](#), the [Dragon](#), a bit of the [Blue Ridge Parkway](#) and the so-called [Gauntlet](#) which includes highways 60, 129, 180 and 348 (the [Richard Russell Scenic Parkway](#)). I should mention that the western half of 348 is now resurfaced and just as pristine as the eastern half. This has always been a remarkable, must-do ride and now even more so.

We got to Suches twice and both times the [Two Wheels of Suches](#) campground (old TWO) was closed. That is, the restaurant part was closed. There were people camping on the property. I don't know exactly what is going on. As mentioned before, the parking lot is now paved and the building and grounds are in good repair.

I did not take one picture this go around and since I've reported on many of the roads in a previous article about the North Georgia Classic in Helen – further elaboration would be redundant.

Now that the temps are moderating back here in Florida, I am looking forward to more seat time in the state and some pleasant lunch rides with all of you.


