First Ride at STAR 2014

Since only eleven members from Florida attended STAR 2014 this year, I thought I would share some photos from one of my rides there.

Due to the rainy weather over the first weekend of STAR in Rapid City, the first good opportunity for riding in the Black Hills during good weather came on Monday, June 9th. The adjacent map shows

the route through the Black Hills and Custer State Park, including the Needles Highway.

For this ride, I joined Norm Kern and two

friends of his from Ohio, with Norm leading. We started out towards the southwest along the Sheridan Lake Road to US-385. Upon reaching the intersection with Hwy-244, Norm unexpectedly turned east towards Mount Rushmore. He and one of the other riders had decided to insert a visit to Mt. Rushmore. When we reached it and they turned into the parking entrance, I decided to skip it as I had already visited Mt. Rushmore on a prior trip.

When heading west from Mt. Rushmore, there is a spot where the profile view of Washington's sculpture on Mt. Rushmore can be seen.

On the road beyond the tight Needles rock formations, I stopped at an overlook with a view of the <u>Cathedral Spires</u> to take this photo of my motorcycle.

Continuing along through Custer State Park, I turned onto the road called "Wildlife Loop." During my prior visit to the park in 2011, I rode through this same area and saw numerous buffalo, some actually on the highway blocking traffic, as well as several pronghorn antelope, and wild donkeys. This time the buffalo were not as evident, nor as close to the highway, although I did take a photo of a sizable group on a nearby hilltop. No antelope anywhere.

SAFETY TALK



Subtropics

I always get a chuckle when northern or western riders come to Florida in summer and ask "How do you ride in this weather?"

We are now in the middle of summer. I saw 97 degrees outside temperature indicated on my GS instrument panel the other day. Even our cats refuse to go outside during middle of the day. So how do we cope with the hot weather riding?

First off, pay attention to the cats. If they aren't going out when the sun is high in the sky, maybe we shouldn't be hopping on our bikes at that time, either. The easiest way to beat the heat is to ride first thing in the morning and/or late afternoon into evening. Mid-

afternoons in Florida should be re-served for naps, boating, and BBQs...in that order. I never get past the first one.

Next: Hydrate, hydrate, hydrate. If you wait until you're thirsty to start drinking water, you're too late. If you know you're going to be riding, start hydrating well before that.

Let's all know the symptom of hyperthermia, heat exhaustion and heat stroke. I won't go into all the medical information here, as it would take the rest of the column, but if you're going to be out in the Florida summer sun, make sure you bone up on the medical safety aspects.

Choose your gear wisely. I saw at least one rider this past weekend in full, non-perforated race leathers, riding on the street in the heat of the day. While I applaud him for his views on crash safety, I question his common sense. Part of safety is understanding the relationship between your gear and the environment, and encapsulating yourself in a leather sauna suit, in 95+ degree weather for a street ride is probably not an exhibition of understanding. That's why they make perforated leather, armored mesh, etc. Good undergarments that wick sweat can help. If you need to, soak down your t-shirt and your gear, then get back on and ride. It will turn your gear into an air conditioner.

Whatever you do, DON'T say to yourself, "It's too hot for gear. Just this once I'll only ride in..." Don't do it. Fail

If you've decided to go ahead and ride in the heat of the day, make sure the environment is part of your ride strategy. Limit yourself to short rides, or short stages in a longer ride. Take lots of breaks. Keep up the fluid intake. Wear a backpack reservoir and sip regularly throughout the ride.

Finally, watch out for each other as well as yourself. Let's all take care as we ride during the hot summer months!
