Flickr: Motorcycle Touring A different way of meeting riders

Those of you, who know me, know that I have a passion for two things, traveling via motorcycle and photography. Seems the two go pretty well together.

Several years back I discovered a photo site that was great for sharing your photography with others. There are many sites available to the avid photographer, but my personal favorite is *Flickr*.

Flickr's basic account is free and allows you to upload 2 videos and 300MB worth of photos each calendar month. The *Flickr* Pro account is basically unlimited posting of your photography at a reasonable rate of \$24.95 per year.

The *Flickr* site allows you to organize your photos into albums, collections and galleries. I have organized my site, for example, into four collections: Nature Photography, Family Photos, A Bit of This and That, and Two Wheel Trips. Each collection is then organized into individual albums, (i.e., 2001 West Trip, Local Rides, etc.). The site also allows you to geo-reference the location of your photograph. The map is displayed neatly along side of the photo depicting the regional location such as the country or city and then a much closer location showing the street level.

But what makes the site interesting is the ability to interact with other photographers. Not only can you view photos posted by others but you can comment or ask questions about the photograph.

While exploring the features of *Flickr*, I discovered the ability to set up a photo group. A group is where Flickr members can post their photos according to the group guidelines and create group discussions. I chose to set up a "Motorcycle Touring" group. At the time I expected very little interest in the group, but boy was I wrong!

Today the motorcycle touring group has nearly 1500 members from all over the world, with over 15,000 contributing photographs and 80 discussion groups. There are members as far away as China, Iceland,



Argentina, England and Viet Nam, just to name a few. The site has grown so large that I have a co-administrator (screen name Will Design Works), Koichi Takahashi.

Koichi lives in Yonezawa, Japan just 50 miles from the nuclear disaster. He was fortunate that he personally suffered minimal damage from the earthquake however some of his family members were forced to relocate to the Tokyo area for the safety of their children. I am trying to talk him into coming stateside one year to attend a STAR rally.

Last year I was able to meet with several *Flickr* members on my trip west. I met with a member in Washington for lunch and another member in Oregon, Chuck, who gave me a personal tour of the area on his 1974 BMW R90S but I had to pass on an invite to spend the evening with Priti, a molecular biophysicist and her husband in San Francisco due to a timing issue.

I have spent many enjoyable hours on *Flickr* both viewing photographs from around the world and reading comments from other avid two wheel travelers.

Take a moment and explore *Flickr*, better yet join the site. After all it free and you don't get any spin off spam. The best feature however is the really interesting people you'll meet!

You Are Responsible

How many times have you seen it? It happens a lot at rallies and motorcycle bike nights across the country (and around the world). It seems like the challenge is to find the girl wearing the skimpiest attire and put her on the

back of the bike for a ride.

OK, so it may not be this extreme. But you have seen it. The rider is dressed head to toe in protective gear, and the passenger is riding unprotected. Have you ever taken someone for a ride, even a quick one, around the block, without the passenger wearing even a helmet? Or perhaps you insisted on a helmet, but that was the extent of the protection? Is it the magic force field at work again? What is going to protect them if something happens?



The bottom line here (no pun intended...OK, maybe a little) is that YOU are responsible for the safety of your passenger. That means making sure that they are wearing protective gear to start. If they don't have the gear and you don't have it to offer to them, they don't belong on the back of your bike. Once you have them on the back of your ride, your next responsibility is to their safety. It's bad enough to involve yourself in a crash, but you don't want the added burden of knowing you may have caused, or contributed to serious injuries of a friend or loved one.

Don't get conned into taking someone for a ride, no matter how cute she (or he, ladies...) might be. Don't think you can get away with showing off. And DON"T be so over-confident as to think that "Gee, just this once, it won't hurt..." That's the kind of mentality that exceeds common sense and often gets us into trouble. Respect your passengers and our sport. Ride safe, and make sure your passengers do as well!

Central Director's Report - October 2019

Seventy-four degrees, low humidity, a gorgeous baby blue sky and nary a cloud in sight – what a fabulous way to relaunch our fall lunch rides. I aired up the Super Duke's tires the night before. Alas, a bit of wishful thinking because my achy knee issue persists. Not wanting to aggravate it further, I begrudgingly drove the car to DeBary instead. What a letdown!

However, there were a few smile-producing highlights on the way over. Taylor Branch Rd between SR's 520 and 50 at Christmas is a nice, meandering 2-lane through trees and pastures. Fort Christmas Rd between Christmas and Chuluota is another lightly traveled bit of rural pleasure which passes by the Fort Christmas Historical Park. Just above the park, a banked, ninety-degree tight sweeper is always an adrenalin rush. There are a few additional attention-getting twists along this byway. Below Osteen, very rural Reed Ellis Rd branches northwest off CR 415 and ties into Enterprise Rd. Enterprise skirts the north side of Lake Bethel and Lake Monroe under a canopy of very old oaks before veering northwest to Highbanks. The *Swamp House Grille* sits at the west end of Highbanks in a beautiful setting right at the St John's River.

Out of curiosity, I Googled 'Fort Christmas' to see how it got its name. According to Wikipedia, a force of 2,000 US Army and Alabama Volunteers arrived in the area on December 25, 1838, to construct a fort. It was one of 200 built during the Second Seminole Indian War (1835 - 1842). A full-sized replica sits on the site today and is part of the historical park.



Six of us made it to the *Grille*. The northern burgs of Orlando, Fleming Island near Jacksonville, the north St Augustine area and Valkaria were our starting locations. It was nice to have recent MSTA president Dennis Villarose back in Florida and coming out for our rides. We ate a leisurely lunch and did a whole bunch of storytelling. It was 2 o'clock when we finally forced ourselves to get up and leave.

Have to say, after a super experience here on our initial visit, the kitchen was a little slow this time around but the food, once served, was excellent. It's a really nice property in a beautiful setting. But surrounded by Deland and Orange City to the north, Deltona to the east, Sanford to the south and the river to the west, it's not the most moto-friendly spot to get to, my road selection aside.

NEW YEAR, NEW MILES!!! Start 2020 off in a (Bill) Royal sort of way with a lunch ride to one of Florida's best gulf coast seafood restaurants near the end of one of Florida's twistiest roads. Meal time is at noon.

Peck's Old Port Cove is old Florida charm at its very best. They are located out in the gulf's marshes between the towns of Crystal River and Homosassa Springs. Nine miles of twisty Ozello Trail gets you out there from US98.

Everybody raves about Peck's seafood. In addition, the waterside property is clean and comfortable and the whole staff at Peck's is extremely accommodating. We expect to reserve the 50-seat dining room – and fill it. There's plenty of parking.

Long distance riders may wish to get near by December 31st (or earlier). We're not reserving rooms and don't have any activities planned. However, the Equus Inn at 3434 SW College Rd, Ocala 34474 is suggested (previously a Quality Inn, they have a 4 star rating with Trip Advisor and others). We've used them in the past during Bike Week. They offer comfortable rooms at reasonable rates with complimentary breakfasts and in-room coffee, microwave & frig, etc. More importantly, very good restaurants and watering holes are just a short walk away. And in the morning, it's only about an hour's ride through mostly rural Florida to Peck's. You can phone the hotel directly at (352) 854-3200. Verify cancellation policy and book early.
