Safety Talk



New Year's Resolutions by Doug Westly

[Editor's Note: We think Doug's reminders and resolutions merit an annual repeat. See how many of them you completed or instituted and what you may still need to work on this year...Knowing this, we all could benefit by being 'more perfect' in 2025!]

- I will always check my bike before I ride. That includes checking the tires, tire pressures, brakes, drivetrain, lights, controls, etc. I will also check my wife and riding partner's bike, as that is part of our agreed division of pre-ride duties. Nothing is more important to me than her safety! (Yes, she cross-checks me as well.)
- I will also check myself. Am I ready to ride? Is my mind on my riding, and not distracted? Am I rested and not tired? I promise to walk away from a ride if I am not ready. I have nothing to prove.

- I will always wear All The Gear All The Time (ATGATT). I will routinely inspect my gear, particularly my helmet, to ensure it will protect me if needed.
- I will ride responsibly and safely. That means cooperating with other traffic. I will not be a squid on the public streets.
- I will carefully decide with whom I ride. My riding partners should demonstrate the same care towards riding that I do. I will not ride outside my comfort zone. I will ride my own line and ride.
- I will practice good riding techniques. I will focus on my riding.
 I will stay alert to possible hazards (Remember the MSF's Search-Evaluate-Execute strategy?).
- I will seek out more rider training in 2025. For me, that means my annual RiderCoach refresher and this year probably another track school!
- I will always maintain my motorcycles. That means following the maintenance schedule in the Owner's Manual. It means regularly cleaning my bike, not just to show it off, but also as a means to detect possible problems or maintenance issues.
- I am an experienced rider. I recognize that newer riders may look to me or watch how I ride. I will do my best to present a good example of a mature, safe rider. At the same time, it is also my responsibility to show newer riders that safe riding is also fun riding.
- If I see unacceptable riding behavior or unsafe riding techniques, I will take it upon myself to address these issues. I will do it politely and positively. I recognize that, as much as possible, we should all watch out for each other.

Ok, none of us are perfect. I'm sure there will be times when I'll forget something. The important part of this is that I recognize how much motorcycling is a part of my life, and how I want to be able to continue riding. These resolutions are how to make that happen.

How about you? Ready for another year of riding in 2025?

Holiday Lunch Ride-North

Gator Joe's Beach Bar & Grill, Ocklawaha

Well, 23 attended the Holiday Lunch Ride – North at *Gator Joe's Beach Bar & Grill* in Ocklawaha. It was a very crisp morning, and thankfully they

had no trouble seating us all inside. We were the 2nd group there, but the dining room was huge. They said it was OK to pull tables together, but we just took them as they were and engaged in the usual friendly chatter which lasted over an hour.

I'm not sure where everyone rode in from. Twelve rode 100 miles or more to get there, including six from the Melbourne – Vero Beach area. The two Vero guys, Larry and Charlie, shared LD honors at 170 miles each. Two were from Sun City Center. And I think most of rest were from Winter Park north. Several of the latter mentioned their appreciation for having a holiday ride in their area. I was pleased to be able to do it.

We didn't see any sign of a boat parade – probably a nighttime thing. There was a small Cessna seaplane floating next to the restaurant when we got there. One of our group went out and talked to the pilot for a few minutes. We got busy with the small talk and I was selling raffle tickets. When I had a chance to look outside again, it was gone. In fact, we were all having such a good time that no one thought to mention Pearl Harbor Day. So a belated toast to the brave souls who confronted that day in 1942 at Oahu.

The 50/50 grossed \$100. Winner Bob Kehl donated \$10 back to the club. Thanks, Bob, and thank you all.

I can't speak for everybody, but my group of six riders had a really nice day of riding mostly secondary roads up and back. They had their share of curves and in some cases stretches of canopied trees and other interesting scenery. Gator Joe's for us is not only a great destination - all of these fun roads make it a joy to go.

I can't sign off with relating a little history about Gator Joe's, Ocklawaha, Lake Weir and the notorious Ma Barker Gang hideout:

Gator Joe's opened in 1926. The name refers to a big alligator known in the area as "Old Joe". In 1934, while trying to find the Ma Barker Gang, the FBI intercepted a letter from Ma to one of her son's mentioning "Old Joe" near the Barker hideout. Lake Weir was pinpointed because there was a big gator there by that name. Meanwhile, Ocklawaha citizens had been noticing someone shooting at gators with a Tommy gun. On January 16, 1935, the FBI found and surrounded the hideout - a 2-story wood frame home the gang was renting about a quarter mile west of Gator Joe's. And in a 4-hour gun battle, Ma and one of her sons were killed. They were found in the left, upstairs bedroom supposedly with a Tommy gun laying on the floor between them. The rest of the gang had left the

area before the raid. "Old Joe", on the other hand, lived until 1952 when a professional hunter brought on his demise.

The house, now called the Bradford-Ma Barker House, was donated to Marion County in 2016 and relocated to Carney Island Recreation & Conservation Area (a park) on the northwest edge of Lake Weir. The bullet holes have been patched but are still visible. Tours are available. Here's a video link well worth watching: https://youtu.be/aj_jXROXNSc

Next up: "New Year, New Miles." It's lunch at *Peck's Old Port Cove* near Crystal River on January 1st. You don't want to miss it. And then on January 11th, we head back to *Harborside*, a very nice lakeside restaurant in Winter Haven.

We had a very nice response with 21 in attendance and sold \$100 worth of 50-50 tickets. Thank you. The indoor pictures only show the 15 on-time arrivals. We filled two additional tables before it was

all said and done. Thanks to all for making it such an enjoyable gathering.

Sadly for us, Doug Westly announced that this would be his and Becky's last FLMSTA event as they're moving to the Ozark's next month. We thanked them for their long-term support and contributions to MSTA / FLMSTA and wished them the best in their new endeavors. And can you believe it – Doug won the 50-50! Sort of fitting, I think.

Our main server did a great job. She had a pleasant demeanor and a very keen sense of humor (something that I certainly appreciate). I announced right off **that we planned to give her a very good tip** which was "Don't smoke in bed!" She came right back with her own – "Don't fry bacon naked!" So we were off to a roaring start. In all respects, Peck's did not disappoint. She was the one, BTW, to draw Doug's winning ticket.
