WHO WE ARE — Organization Overview

The A.T.O. Outreach (Airwave Take Over Outreach International Ministries) is a federally recognized 501(c)3 nonprofit organization founded on one unshakeable conviction: every life carries God-given purpose, and no life should be lost to despair.

Rooted in faith and driven by action, The A.T.O. confronts the crisis of suicide head-on, particularly among teenagers, young adults, and veterans, through a proven model that combines professional suicide prevention training, large-scale community events, and the life-transforming power of the gospel of Jesus Christ. The organization does not simply raise awareness. It deploys trained teams, builds strategic partnerships, and executes targeted interventions that produce measurable results. For example, in St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, teen suicides stopped completely for nearly three years following a single A.T.O. conference event. In Nairobi, Kenya, a local mega-church recorded zero suicides after A.T.O. engagement in 2024.

Beyond suicide prevention, the A.T.O. leads humanitarian outreach efforts serving children, the elderly, the homeless, and underserved communities by distributing essential supplies, providing hot meals, and connecting individuals with the resources and relationships they need to rebuild their lives. Headquartered in Pinellas County, Florida, and approved through the CityServe Initiative to receive truckloads of supplies, the A.T.O. is positioned to meet community needs at scale.

Internationally, the A.T.O. extends its reach through global missions coordinated with Bishops and denominational leaders overseeing more than 30,500 churches across Kenya, Uganda, Ethiopia, Tanzania, and Congo. Since 2019, the organization has completed mission trips to three nations, trained over 409 pastors and church leaders, funded thousands of hot meals across three countries, and seen more than 26,900 documented decisions for Jesus Christ.

The A.T.O. Outreach exists to do more than respond to crisis; it exists to permanently interrupt it. By equipping individuals with training, surrounding communities with support, and anchoring every effort in the hope of the gospel, The A.T.O. moves people from despair to purpose, and from crisis to a life fully restored.

Our Three Pillars

- Faith — Bringing hope through the gospel of Jesus Christ to the hurting, the homeless, and the hopeless
- Training — SafeTalk suicide prevention certification and professional awareness workshops for organizations
- Action — Large-scale student events, international mission trips, and local humanitarian aid



HUMANITARIAN OUTREACH DIVISION

CURRENT DOMESTIC IMPACT — Missions in America

The A.T.O. Outreach operates its domestic mission from its headquarters in Pinellas County, Florida, one of the Tampa Bay area's most diverse and densely populated regions. From this base, the A.T.O. conducts ongoing local outreach while mobilizing evangelists and mission teams to cities across the United States wherever suicide rates are high and community need is great.

Local Impact — Pinellas County & Saint Petersburg, Florida

The A.T.O.'s local work is consistent, hands-on, and community rooted. Through monthly Soul Winning Saturdays and Faith Night revival events, the organization engages residents with the message of hope while meeting real, tangible needs. The A.T.O. serves hot meals and distributes toiletries, household products, school supplies, gift cards, and essential resources to families, seniors, veterans, and individuals experiencing homelessness every month.

Below are some of our ongoing and upcoming activities:

- Backpack and school supply giveaways held throughout the year
- Christmas toy drives for hundreds of children annually
- Hot meal distributions providing consistent nourishment to community residents
- Suicide prevention awareness and referral services for Pinellas County residents
- Warehouse and distribution site expansion planned by Thanksgiving 2026 through the CityServe Initiative
- Hot meal site expanding from monthly to weekly service with accompanying Bible study

The A.T.O. is also an active partner in the broader Pinellas County nonprofit ecosystem, collaborating with local organizations, churches, and community leaders to connect residents to mental health resources, job training, and family services.

National Reach — Crusades & Revival

The A.T.O.'s domestic mission extends well beyond Florida. The organization has conducted Soul Winning Crusades in California and Indiana, resulting in over 2,600 documented decisions for Christ, and has trained and mobilized dozens of teams in cities across America.

Our future activities include:

- Revival meetings, tent crusades, and Good News Gospel events in high-need cities
- Goal to mobilize 5 to 10 evangelists to cities across America quarterly
- Training local churches in soul-winning strategy and community outreach methods
- Revival meetings in 10 U.S. cities annually to encourage and revive communities

Broadcast & Media Ministry

Recognizing that the mission must reach beyond physical gatherings, the A.T.O. has established a growing video and podcast platform with over 100 published videos. Through digital broadcasting and social media, the organization extends its message of hope to individuals in crisis, in isolation, or in communities without local ministry access.

THE CRISIS — Why This Work Cannot Wait

Suicide is not an abstract statistic. It is a father, a teenager, a veteran, a neighbor. In the United States and around the world, the rates of suicide, particularly among young people, have reached levels that demand urgent, coordinated, and compassionate response.

The Numbers

Since 2020, the national suicide average among ages 15 to 24 is 1 in every 1,000 people. Florida's rate has surpassed the national average at 5 suicides per every 1,000 young people in that age group. In Saint Tammany Parish, Louisiana, 17 teenagers died by suicide in six years before the A.T.O. intervened. In Kenya, suicide rates have climbed 58% in a single decade.

Additionally, Veterans face a particularly devastating reality. An estimated 22 veterans die by suicide every single day in the United States. The A.T.O.'s founder, a decorated U.S. Air Force veteran, understands this crisis personally and has made veteran outreach a cornerstone of the organization's training and prevention efforts.

The Root Causes

- Isolation — individuals disconnected from community, family, and faith
- Hopelessness — the absence of purpose, identity, and spiritual grounding
- Economic hardship — financial stress that deepens despair and limits access to help
- Lack of accessible mental health resources — particularly in underserved and rural communities
- Stigma — cultural and social barriers that prevent individuals from seeking help

Humanitarian Aid

Suicide and despair rarely exist in isolation. For many individuals and families, emotional and spiritual crisis is compounded by material hardship. The A.T.O. recognizes that saving a life sometimes begins not with a conversation, but with a meal, a backpack, or a bag of groceries.

Through its Humanitarian Outreach Division, the A.T.O. serves the most vulnerable members of the community, including children, the elderly, the homeless, and underserved families by providing essential resources alongside the message of hope. The organization distributes food, toiletries, clothing, household supplies, school materials, and gift cards throughout the year, ensuring that practical aid is never separated from spiritual encouragement.

As an approved partner of the CityServe Initiative, the A.T.O. is positioned to receive 18-wheeler truckloads of supplies, giving the organization the capacity to respond to community needs at a scale far beyond what many nonprofits can access. This infrastructure allows the A.T.O. to serve hundreds of families at a time, particularly during crises and natural disasters.

The connection between humanitarian need and suicide risk is well documented. Financial stress, food insecurity, housing instability, and social isolation are all established risk factors for suicidal ideation. By addressing both the spiritual and the material needs, the A.T.O. reaches individuals at their most vulnerable moment and offers something far more powerful than temporary relief. It offers a reason to keep going.

OUR SOLUTION: Faith, Training, and Action Model

The A.T.O. does not address suicide and community hardship with a single program or a single approach. Its model is three-dimensional, which integrates spiritual, educational, and practical interventions that work together to produce lasting transformation in individuals and communities.

Faith — The Foundation

Every program, every mission trip, every outreach event begins with one conviction: hope is found in Jesus Christ. The A.T.O. is unapologetically gospel-centered. The organization believes that spiritual restoration is not separate from mental and emotional healing. It is the foundation of it. Through crusades, church partnerships, drama presentations, and one-on-one evangelism, the A.T.O. connects individuals to the love and purpose of God.

- 4,001 souls connected to local churches in Florida alone
- 26 churches planted in Kenya through A.T.O. evangelism training

Training — The Intervention

Awareness without action saves no one. The A.T.O. equips individuals, organizations, churches, and community leaders with the professional tools they need to recognize warning signs, intervene effectively, and connect people to help. Dr. Don Walker was trained by the U.S. Air Force to identify signs of severe depression and suicidal ideation and has carried that training into communities across the nation and around the world.

Action — The Transformation

The A.T.O. believes that faith and training must translate into tangible community action. Through large-scale events, humanitarian aid, and strategic outreach, the A.T.O. creates the conditions where lives are saved, families are strengthened, and communities are rebuilt.

- Large-scale BIG ATO Student Events — concerts, sports competitions, drama performances, and gospel presentations targeting ages 12 to 24
- Humanitarian aid distribution — food, clothing, toiletries, school supplies, Christmas toy drives
- Approved CityServe partner receiving 18-wheeler truckloads of supplies and hurricane relief pallets
- Monthly Soul Winning Saturdays and Faith Night revival events in Pinellas County
- International mission trips to Kenya, Uganda, Ethiopia, and beyond



PROGRAMS & BUDGET — Events, Training, and Phased Growth

The BIG ATO Student Event

The BIG ATO Event is the A.T.O.’s flagship suicide prevention program for young people ages 12 to 24. It is built on a simple but powerful insight: to reach young people, you must first attract them with what they love. This includes sports, music, and entertainment. Once they arrive, they encounter a message of hope, purpose, and the love of Jesus Christ.

Each event features a slam dunk contest, 3-point competition, video game tournaments, Double Dutch demonstrations, a full-length drama, a concert, encouraging messages by life speakers, thousands of dollars in prizes, and a gospel presentation. The event costs \$1 to enter, removing every financial barrier to attendance.

TRAINING AND REFERRAL SYSTEM

Prevention Training Program

The A.T.O. provides SafeTALK Suicide Awareness for Everyone Certification, training for organizations, churches, schools, and government agencies. We also have the ability to create new training programs with our Advisory Team psychologist. Estimated one-time setup cost: \$50,000. Referral services connecting individuals to Christian counselors launch Fall 2027 at an estimated one-time cost of \$50,000.



TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Our Suicide Awareness Training program teaches how to reduce the risk of suicide by recognizing signs, asking tough questions, and connecting those at risk to an intervention resource for more specialized support. Our classes are available at the lowest rates for communities from teenagers in middle school high school to military veterans and first responders. The life-saving skills learned using SafeTalk techniques are perfect for organizations and individuals serious about suicide prevention.

REFERRAL SERVICES

Our goal is to create a robust referral system for adults and youth to speak to a therapist and schedule appointments with Christian Counselors by the Fall of 2027.

The estimated cost for referral service set up is a one-time \$50,000 cost.

Debra Lynn Stibick, PhD, Advisory Team Psychologist

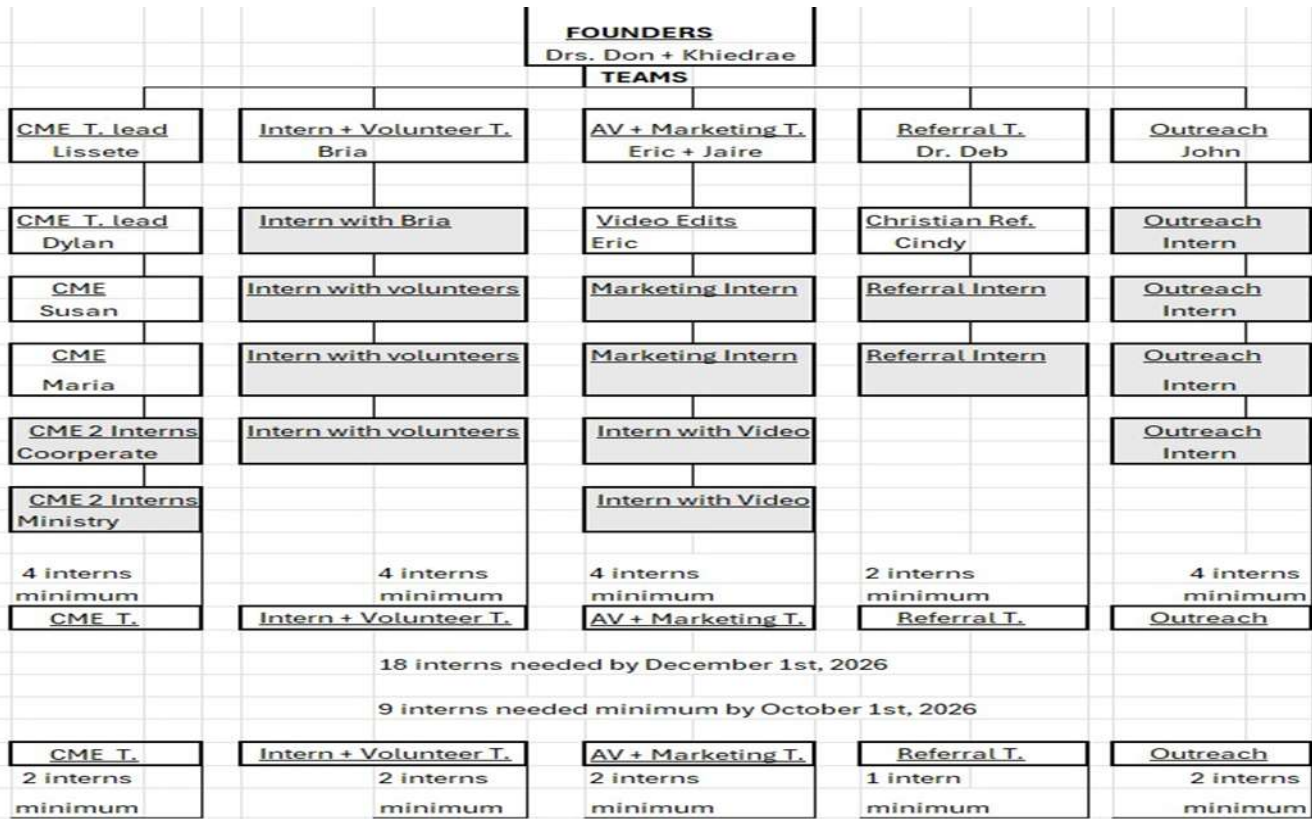

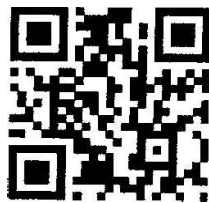
