On Thursday 30 July, a collaborative effort between the Woorabinda Aboriginal Shire Council, BCF Concreting Solutions, Department of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships and Woorabinda State School saw the construction of a concrete path for the student and community entry to the school.

This path was a major priority for the school as Kyleigh (a student in our year 1 / 2 Class) requires extra support for mobility.

BCF Concreting Solutions is a revolutionary company owned by Mick Davis in Rockhampton. One of the innovative concreting solutions the company offers is a mobile batching mixer which compromises a range of capabilities. BCF donated the use of the Reimer batching plant, all of the mixes and staff time for free. This donation of service also included the instruction to Woorabinda Council staff of the batching plant operation and its capabilities. Mick also provided his expert staff of Shaun Cora (Traditional Owner) and Tyrone Davis for the day. This was a great opportunity to showcase the remote work that can be done and also to look to the future to expand this type of operation and possibilities for the Woorabinda community. Ultimately, this means real jobs and long term employment.
