### **Legislative**

#### MISSISSIPPI BILL TO EXPAND ELIGIBILITY FOR TITLING OF OLDER VEHICLES SIGNED INTO LAW

**Success in Mississippi!** SAN-supported legislation (S.B. 2850) that will allow certificate of title applications for vehicles at least 30 years old that are missing usual documents on oath of ownership was signed into law by Governor Tate Reeves. Previously, there was no such exemption. The new law acknowledges the fact that the documents required to title a vehicle are not always readily available for older vehicles. It goes into effect July 1, 2021.

#### <u>History</u>

The March, 1997 issue of the Running Board has an interesting article entitled "Who Was Margaret Knight?" submitted by Mo Tremblay. Mattie Knight, as she was known, was born in 1838. As a young child she showed her mechanical aptitude by making her brother all of his playthings. These items included sleds, scooters, kites, etc.

At the age of 10, Mattie joined thousands of other children her age, in working in a Manchester, N.H. cotton mill. While working there, she witnessed a steel-tipped shuttle topple out of its loom and severely wounding a worker. Shortly thereafter she devised her first invention – a shuttle restraining device that all looms have had since then. Not bad for a ten year old inventor who had no formal training. She possessed a natural flair for developing mechanical devices.

Mattie continued working in the mills until her late teens, improving Machinery without receiving credit while working for a pittance. She went on to learn Daguerreotype, ambrotype and photography, engraving letters on silver and other piece meal jobs.

#### Some WWII Jeeps

The jeep at right was displayed at the April 3 "Cars as Art" show in Marco Island. It has been in the owner's family since shortly after WWII. It was built in 1942 by Ford. It is quite original, including paint and upholstery. It shows ~5000 miles on the odometer. It was used in England and was assigned to a general (2-star license plate). The owner's family purchased the jeep for use as a farm vehicle, but immediately concluded it was not what they needed. It was parked and remained covered, until the early 1960's.

Some features that a WWII jeep can include and are present on this jeep are straps instead of a door or seat belt (to keep the driver from falling out), hand operated windshield wipers, and a headlight that can be repositioned backwards to illuminate the engine for maintenance. Shown at right is also a special headlight that can be used to limit visibility of the jeep from above when driving at night.

A German "jeep" is shown in the photo at right. This one is at the Tampa Bay Automobile Museum. This is a "Kubelwagen Type 82". It was originally designed by Dr. Ferdinand Porsche and his son Ferry, as a "buggy" for fun. It is air cooled and only the rear wheels are driven. It can be viewed as a forerunner to a Volkswagen. The vehicle is very light and behaves well in rough conditions. Over 48,000 were produced from 1939-45... far less than the ~640,000 US jeeps.

This particular one was restored by a French farmer after the war. Unfortunately, according to the story, he eventually moved to a more populated region where the idea of a restored German military vehicle was frowned upon. He sold the Kubelwagen and purchased instead an American jeep.

You may also want to have a look at tickets for the Friday/Saturday seminars - always interesting, and these often sell out early.

If you wish "preferred" parking (a private residence, quite close to the main entrance), please advise and I will share the appropriate email address for application. Space is limited, but in addition to an assigned space, they provide refreshments & access to clean indoor restrooms.

**The Tour:** We plan to depart from the Cracker Barrel (north Ft.Myers) @ I-75 **Exit 141** at **9 AM** on **Thursday**, May 20, 2021. They open at 7 AM for breakfast.

We have arranged for a visit to a **privately-owned museum in Tampa (<u>www.tbauto.org</u>)** Thursday afternoon, so we will choose a "lunch stop" (to be recommended by the owner) in that area prior to the collection tour. We visited this collection a few years ago, and it was very well received - and we expect a mostly-new group so it's time for a redux.


From there, we may drive or walk to a group dinner.


