History

The April, 1997, issue of the Running Board contains an article by Mo Tremblay called " The Compact Corvair's Demise! Ralph Nader or GM?"

The Studebaker Lark started it all. The first of the 1959 compacts. It boosted sales by 381 per cent between 1958 and 1959. 70 per cent of the cars traded in on the new Larks came from rival makers. The big three introduced their compacts in October of 1959. The Ford Falcon, Chrysler Valiant and the Chevrolet Corvair. The Corvair was radically different with its rearmounted, air-cooled flat six.

The 1959 Falcon, although drab looking, outsold the Corvair and Valiant the first year. It produced 50 per cent of all Ford's sales. It was dropped in 1970 after the production of the Mustang, Comet and Maverick.

The engine in the Corvair was GM's Ed Cole's baby. He saw the success of the Volkswagen bug which boasted a rear-mounted air-cooled horizontal engine. He did not want the Corvair to compete with the Chevy so he made it as different as possible. He wanted the Corvair to compete with the Studebaker Lark and the Volkswagen Beetle.

Legislative

Mid-Year Scoreboard: State Legislative Victories

The 2021 state legislative sessions are in full swing and the SEMA Action Network (SAN) is working non-stop to ensure positive outcomes for our hobby. Below are highlights of the most hard-fought victories counted in the current legislative session.

- In the face of SAN's opposition, the Wyoming legislature killed a bill that would have significantly restricted antique vehicle registration eligibility.
- Thanks to SAN's effort, Kansas Governor Laura Kelly signed into law a version of SEMA's model legislation to allow for the registration and on-road use of surplus military vehicles.
- Kansas enacted a SAN-supported bill to ease restrictions on antique vehicles. The bill is sponsored by State Automotive Enthusiast Leadership Caucus member Rep. Leo Delperdang and was signed into law by Governor Kelly.
- After an outpouring of support from enthusiasts, Montana Governor Greg Gianforte signed into law legislation to expand single license plate usage.
- At the urging of the SAN, Virginia Governor Ralph Northam signed into law legislation to expand imported foreign-market vehicle titling.
- With the SAN's support, Idaho's Governor Greg Little signed into law a bill creating a new custom vehicle registration class.
- With backing from the hobby, Mississippi Governor Tate Reeves signed into law SANsupported legislation to expand titling eligibility for older vehicles.
- West Virginia approved SAN-supported resolutions calling for the creation of an interstate off-highway vehicle trail system. The measures were sponsored by SEMA's 2018 Stephen B. McDonald Legislator of the Year Award winner Sen. Mark Maynard and State Automotive Enthusiast Leadership Caucus Chairman Del. Gary Howell.
- Pro-hobby legislation in Illinois would allow "Antique Expanded Use" vehicles to be driven without limitation for two additional months each year. The bill awaits Governor JB Pritzker's signature or veto

The Stories behind my Packards

I had a gray 1949 fastback Oldsmobile during my High School years. It was my pride and joy - the muscle car of the time - but upon entering the army in 1956 I could not take the car with me and my father sort of took ownership of it. Upon finishing training, I needed a car to take me back and forth from Philadelphia to the south land where all the bases were. I found a convertible. A shiny black 1948 Packard Super Eight Victoria. It served me well but upon discharge my new wife thought it was just an old car and not too reliable. It wound up being scrapped because of a lack of maintenance funds.

Killing a wonderful car like that bothered me throughout the years to the point where I joined the Packard Club to dream on. I looked long and hard for a copy of my "Blackie". None were to be found but a green one belonging to a Naples Packard collector showed up for sale in Ohio. I bought it. Keith Pershing fixed it all up to the point where I won an award at the AACA meet.

Still, I wanted a copy of Blackie and kept looking. A beautiful red one showed up in my garage and then I found Blackie for sale in 2019 at Great Lakes Classic Cars in Hilton, NY. It was to become my show car. Life intervened and the car is still waiting to be gone over from A to Z. I now feel that I've made amends to the Packard gods by keeping three of them alive and well.

Of course, in the meantime, I also ached for youth to reappear with my 49 Oldsmobile. That too was a dream meant to come true but not in silver grey as mine was. I saw a maroon copy at a Mecum auction and to my surprise won the bid.

This year it was found.

I've only driven it once and could tell that the Naples heat was causing vacuum problems but it drove wonderfully otherwise. It too is waiting for a trip to Island Automotive. My 1937 Packard, Model 1502, 4 door convertible, is one of less than a hundred produced. I know of 12 still in existence.


