Cars are airlifted to Alaska for the next leg across the Rocky Mountains, taking in the Yukon and Klondike enroute to Niagara Falls, and another air lift out of New York for Morocco, and the final stages on the fringe of the Sahara. Survivors are due to roll across Tower Bridge and park up at the Royal Mint Court on July 18.
