BOOK CLUB

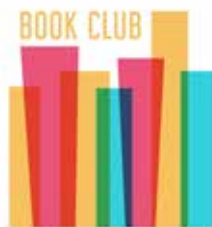

ABOUT THE DUCKS!

I am writing to address concerns and provide information regarding the presence of Muscovy ducks in our area.

Muscovy ducks are a non-native species commonly found in urban and suburban environments. While they are often perceived as harmless or appealing, unmanaged populations can create issues such as property damage, accumulation of droppings, aggressive behavior during nesting season, and potential health concerns related to water quality and sanitation.

It is important to note that feeding (including having bird feeders out) Muscovy ducks can contribute to overpopulation and behavioral changes, including reduced fear of humans and increased dependency. For these reasons, many wildlife and environmental agencies recommend discouraging feeding and instead focusing on humane population management strategies.

I encourage consideration of responsible and lawful approaches to managing Muscovy duck populations, including public education, habitat modification, and coordination with local wildlife authorities when necessary. The office is currently in contact with agencies for their services. Anyone who knows of someone using bird feeders or feeding wildlife, is encouraged to complete a comment form and hand it in to the office for follow up. These steps can help balance animal welfare with environmental health and community safety.

Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. I appreciate your efforts to maintain a clean, safe, and harmonious environment for all residents.

NOTICE FROM THE HOMEOWNERS COMMITTEE

The committee met twice with ELS management, Park Manager Susan Worden and Regional Manager Bill Smoljanovich. Both meetings were fruitless and disappointing. We twice proposed an increase of 4.25% for 2026. It was pointed out that we have never settled for the rate stated in our increase notice letters. Mr. Smoljanovich gave the appearance of being bored and uninterested, contributing very little to the discussions. He was adamant that upper management would not deviate from the increase stated in the notice letters. So much for “negotiating.”

In the course of our discussions, we learned the ELS has engaged in what we consider to be unfair and predatory accounting practices. Our rents have always been calculated by multiplying resident current base rent by the agreed upon increase percentage, rounded to the next cent. Rents were always expressed in dollars and cents. The increase for 2025 was calculated as base rent times 6.0% (the rate specified in our last agreement) and the result was *rounded up* to the next whole dollar! This was not specified in the signed rental agreement, nor were the residents informed of this calculation in 2025. The committee considers this an overpayment and demanded 2025 rents be recalculated and the overpayments credited to resident accounts. Further compounding this egregious practice, the rent increase for 2026 was calculated as 2025 base rent times 5.25%, *rounded up* to the next dollar, plus an additional dollar! The same was done at Country Place. Rounding up is generally not considered a standard GAAP practice for rent increases. Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) focus on the accurate representation of financial transactions rather than specific rounding practices.

This appears to be the new corporate policy. If this is applied across all ELS properties, they are skimming quite a bit of money!

At our last meeting we told management that we would inform the public of this “creative accounting.” We have filed a consumer complaint with the Florida Attorney General, contacted the print media (Tampa Bay Times), and broadcast media (WTVT Fox 13 Investigates).

I would like to thank the Homeowners Committee members Willy Hughes, Ramona McCain, Linda Oye, and Tammy Robichaud for their time, input, and participation.

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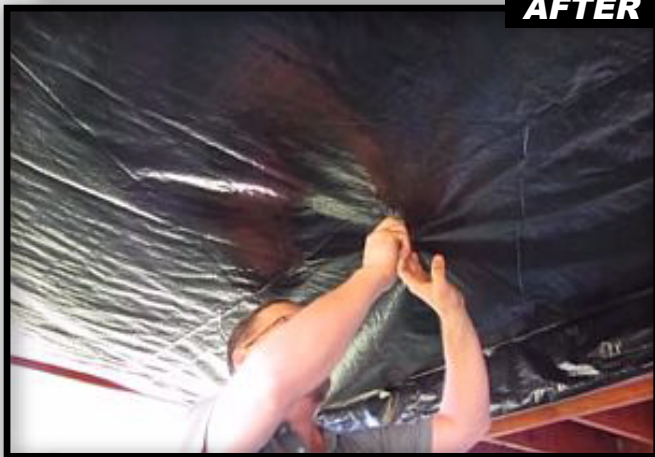
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
