




Kansas City, Mo. NCOM 39

Death Row Ministry

I was not sure if I was going to share this event with you guys but I felt that you really need to know how to pray for us. As you may well know I have been volunteering at Union Prison for over 20 years. My main focus is P Dorm which is Death Row. I have been asked to bring the chapel cart, which has the reading materials from the chapel, to the men on the row. This has been a very special calling for me to drive out to Stark every month and I get to walk down the row and talk to every man there. Sometimes it takes many years to gain the trust of these men. I met Loren 18 years ago and he would not interact with me for the first 5 years. After he opened up to me and we earned each others respect. He saw I was dedicated to show up every month and he could trust I would be there for him. I always say God does not expect us to be perfect just consistent.

Fast forward to 2024. After 34 years on death row Loren was served his death warrant papers in August. I know this because I received a call from the Warden of the Florida Sate Prison asking me if I could meet him in his office. When I showed up he explained that Loren was scheduled to be executed on August 29th and he asked if I would be his Spiritual Advisor. All those years of being faithful to God's calling to this very important ministry was boiling down to this. I explained that I had 5 prisons in Pa. to speak in so I could not be there to guide him to his execution. So the warden ask me if I could call Loren while I was on the road every day for 15 minutes at a time. I replied that I could do this and he walked me down to where Loren was behind a glass and we spoke for 2 hours that day. I explained to him the situation and he agreed this would be ok. So every day we were on the road, prior to the 29th, I would pull over and explain where we were and the sight we were looking at. You have to understand he has not stepped on a blade of grass in over 34 years or seen anything other than a 6X9 cell. So Sharon and I took him on the road and every time our call ended I prayed for him. Loren was a believer in Jesus Christ and you could tell the confidence he had in see his creator in a few days. As the time got closer our conversations got more personal. On the day he was scheduled to be executed at 6:15 pm I talked to him one last time. I will admit I have never been in a situation as this but God gave me the strength to be a vessel to guide him to Heaven. Just before we said our last good byes I asked him if he was going to have any last words to say. He told me to tell everyone:

The measure of a man is not in the words he speaks but rather in his actions which solidifies the words spoken. I prayed my last prayer with Loren and 3 hours later he was in Heaven. This is why we really appreciate your support and prayers to be available to be used by God for a time as this.

In between all of this we had to keep our game face on for our **Pa. Prison Tour.** On the 25-28 we had a prison every night to attend. We knew we could not get into one of the prisons we normally minister in so we added a new one, **Rockview**. It was a well received crowd and a lot more inmates than we anticipated. The next night we went back to the **Quehanna Boot Camp** and this is always a good attendance there. It is a blessing for me to stand in front of a crowd, speaking the word of God and watching God melt their hearts. Then on Tuesday we went to **Smithfield** and this is a small chapel but we were amazed how many guys filled that room. Then the next night we went to that old 1800's prison, **Huntington**, and climbed up 3 flights of stairs to get to the chapel. After that we had a few days off until we went to **Benner Township** on a Sunday morning and there were over 350 men in the auditorium.

Pa. has always been a blessing to be able to travel through the beautiful country and speak to people we meet along the way. It is a blessing but it is also a challenge for us to endure 3 weeks traveling. Sharon and I's goal is to stay as healthy as we can to serve God as long as we can. All glory goes to God.



You Don't Know Til You Go

That has got to be the theme for our ministry. God directs our steps and we just show up. The local church in Umatilla has joined up with Meridzo Ministry in Kentucky to help a local town in Lynch. This ministry was established in 1999 by a couple that had a big paying job in Texas but felt called to move to Kentucky to do God's work. The first year we showed up to help this ministry repair the homes for the people to live in they realized, real quick, that I was **not** a carpenter. After they found out that I spent 30 years in a shop repairing cars and trucks, as a technician, the lights came on as to how I could be useful. All of the volunteers that help make this ministry possible drove cars and they all needed an oil change. So they lined up 18 cars and trucks and I spent the 4 days changing oil and Sharon helped coordinate the process. Just the oil and oil filters for 18 cars cost over \$900. So we must have saved them a whole lot of dough. I was using the gift God gave me.

God had planned many years ago that I would be using my mechanics skills to help out this ministry. And he used George and Roxanne Walker to befriend us when we moved to Umatilla. George was a member of the Skulls Car Club in Lake County. When we got our 1955 Chevy pickup truck we joined this car club and this is when we met George and Roxanne. After a few times of hanging out with George I realized we had a lot in common. Besides being grease monkeys we had a love for Jesus. He is a true man of God. This bonded us a lot closer than I could imagine. Whenever I need car advice or a helping hand George is always ready to come over and help me out. A few years back they asked us if we would consider going to Ky. to help out this ministry? The rest is history. They are also members of the Umatilla Baptist Church which sponsors the

team going to Ky. But once a month they skip their church and attend our church on the second Sunday.

George has been and encouraging brother to me and I really appreciate his advice emotionally, spiritually and physically.
