Our Mission

At Save The Need Foundation, our mission is to eradicate homelessness across the nation. By collaborating with our communities, state, and local officials, we aim to develop targeted solutions for each city's unique needs. Our efforts will focus on supporting families, military veterans, individuals facing mental health challenges, and immigrants experiencing homelessness. We are committed to ending homelessness, raising awareness, and inspiring the power of giving.



The Idea

Save The Need Foundation plans to establish two large campuses in California, with the first set to be developed in Los Angeles County in Southern California. This initial campus will serve as a model for success, which, if achieved, will lead to the development of a second campus in Northern California.

California's homeless population exceeds 150,000, with over 70,000 individuals in Los Angeles County alone. Save The Need Foundation's mission is to rehabilitate and house the entire homeless population across the state. To accomplish this, two separate campuses are necessary. The Southern California campus will be the largest, designed to house and rehabilitate up to 100,000 individuals from diverse backgrounds, including veterans, families, couples, teens, individuals, and court-appointed candidates.

The Foundation intends to offer a rehabilitation program with durations ranging from 90 to 365 days. This program is designed to provide residents with the skills and support needed to rebuild their lives. Recognizing that some individuals may not be suitable for rehabilitation due to mental health or other issues, Save The Need will still offer housing and essential support to those who cannot participate in the program, ensuring their basic needs are met for the rest of their lives.

Save The Need Foundation is committed to addressing homelessness in California with a comprehensive plan that prioritizes veterans, families, individuals, and teens in need. Their goal is to clear the streets of homelessness and provide appropriate housing and support for everyone affected.

Save The Need Foundation has a plan to develop its first campus in Southern California starting with phase one of the development which will start with

ADMINISTRATION

ADMIN BUILDING #1 75,000 SF will be the EXECUTIVE SUITES Building for the following departments: Directors & Executive department, HR department, Nutrition department, Utility department, Policy council department, Recruiting department, outreach department, fundraising/Marketing department, Accounting department, IT department

ADMIN BUILDING #2 68,500 SF-will include a Counseling center, therapy center, drug & alcohol center, & anger management center

ADMIN BUILDING #3 185,000 SF-will include a Trade Skills Center, Life Skills Center, Job Skill Readiness Center, & Adult Ed Learning Center for (HS & GED Program)

ADMIN BUILDING #4 68,500 SF-will include the Security department & Public Safety

ADMIN BUILDING #5 75,000 SF-will include the Intake/screening center & housing department

ADMIN BUILDING #6 75,000 SF-will include the Donation Center & Storage facility

ADMIN BUILDING #7 68,500 SF-will include Veteran affairs and resource department

ADMIN BUILDING #8 185,000 SF- will include the Transportation department / pick up and drop off center

ADMIN BUILDING #9 68,500 SF-will include a Child care day care center

ADMIN BUILDING #10 75,000 SF-will include a Education department

Success

Upon the successful launch of the first campus, Save The Need Foundation will begin planning the development of the second campus in Northern California, aiming to complete its comprehensive solution to California's homelessness crisis.

With both campuses successfully operational, Save The Need Foundation will then look to expand its services, establishing additional campuses across the United States and internationally as needed.



Donations and budget needs

Save The Need Foundation has devised a comprehensive solution to address the homelessness crisis in the U.S., but its success depends on support at every level: state, county, city government, and local communities.

To initiate this project, Save The Need Foundation is seeking a large parcel of land, approximately 500-1,000 acres, and funding between \$500 million and \$2 billion for overall development. We are requesting that the city of Los Angeles, Los Angeles County, and local governments donate this land for our first campus site and assist with securing the necessary permits. Additionally, we seek support for construction funding and annual operational costs. STNF will also engage in its own fundraising and grant-seeking efforts to sustain operations.

Los Angeles County is specifically asked to provide funding for building construction, permits, shelters, and program operations. Other counties, including San Bernardino, San Diego, Santa Barbara, Ventura, Imperial, Orange, Kern, San Luis Obispo, and Riverside, are also called upon to contribute. While the primary focus will be on serving Los Angeles County, we plan to extend our services to all Southern California counties as we achieve success.

The solution requires a collaborative effort, as this is a collective issue that demands a unified response. Once the initial facilities are established, cities can introduce new ordinances to prevent encampments on streets, in parks, and on freeway overpasses, contributing to a cleaner and safer urban environment.

Funding contributions should be proportionate to the homeless population in each city and county. Cities with larger homeless populations will need to contribute more to the operational costs of the facility. While STNF will seek initial funding and support from counties, cities, and local governments, ongoing contributions will be essential to maintain and expand our efforts both now and in the future.



Growing the Economy

Save The Need Foundation aims to create employment opportunities for over 5,000 individuals actively seeking work, in addition to hiring 5,000 more staff members within our campus community. Regular hourly employees will be compensated between \$16 and \$18 per hour for a 40-hour work week. Senior advisors and directors will receive monthly salaries commensurate with their expertise and performance in their roles.



Budget, Cost, & Breakdown

Save The Need Foundation estimates the cost of this project to range from \$200 million to \$1.5 billion. This budget is provisional, as we are still collaborating with our architects to finalize and clarify all budget details and annual operational costs.
