FROM THE EAST

Brethren,

Regardless of our circumstances, we always have a choice. We can choose more of the same; or we can recognize this moment is different and that we can be different, too. -Lori Deschene

Great Masons are not born, they're self-made. You can spot them a mile away, even when they're brand new, fresh out of ritual. They exhibit traits and Masonic habits that distinguish them from the average. They begin a journey with four very distinct stages; they are "great Masons" at each stage, but add very different value to my team with each progression.

Stage 1: The Hard Worker — "how should I do it?"

The Hard Worker is always on-time, very focused on her job, and exceedingly attentive to detail. In this stage, they want to learn "the how" of masonry. As such, they're a bit time-consuming to mentor, but, once shown the ropes a few times, can repeat the function of their role very autonomously, and with high quality and reliability.

Stage 2: The Can-Doer — "what do I need to do?"

The Can-Doer is pretty self-sufficient once directed; they either already know "the how" of their job or have sufficient intuition to figure it out; they just need to be told what needs to get done and their typical response is: "can do!" The Can-Doer is a dependable mason who works very well off of task lists. He or She takes much less time to manage from the onset.

Stage 3: The Driver — "why do we need to do something?"

We all know these people: the Drivers. They're the people in the Lodge who know all of the inner workings of the business and where "all the bodies are buried." These rare Masons of greatness need only be told why there's a problem or opportunity and they're off to the races figuring out whom to tap in the organization, which systems need to be modified, and what special favors need to be leveraged to get the job done. If you want to know who these people are, just ask yourself this: when the Lodge has a critical initiative that needs to be addressed, who is called upon to be involved? The names you come up with are probably "the Same Ten People" (the "STP") the very vast majority of the time.

Stage 4: The Successor - "I'm implementing a concept that will benefit all!"

Where do graduates of the STP club move to? The answer: an even more rare club of employee you deem your Successor. Your Successor is your right hand, they're the "jack of all trades" who independently identifies opportunities, knows why they're critical to the Masonry, what needs to happen to address them, and how to get it done. What do you need to tell them? Nothing. This is the same young man or young woman who arrived years earlier at your Lodge step as a Hard Worker, eager to learn and work hard. And, now, they're not only your right hand, they're who you're leaving the keys to when you depart.

Don't waste your time looking back, you're not going that way.

FROM THE WEST

What is Freemasonry?

As someone who wears a masonic lapel pin on my suit jacket everywhere I go in my professional life, I

get this question frequently. Yet, I don't think I've ever answered the questions the same way twice.

As we learn very early on in our Masonic lives, the standard answer to this question is: (1) "Masonry is a system of morality veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols." Give that answer to any non-Mason and you'll quickly see their eyes glaze over. That answer doesn't really answer the question, but if anything leads to even more questions. The first usually being, "what does 'allegory' mean?"

What is Freemasonry? The Courts have defined what Freemasonry is. In Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite vs. Board of County Commissioners, 122 Neb. 586, 241 N.W. 93 (1932), a tax case, the court described Freemasonry as (2) "a system that teaches as a foundational principle faith in God and immortality of the soul." This case went on to make clear that Masonry is not sectarian, holding no affinity to one particular religion, even though it does indeed use as its foundations religious teachings. It aims to bring its devotees a deeper and more conscious contact with "spiritual things," it more generally states.

What is Freemasonry? To the extent that religious purposes include the field of morals, which they do, Masonry makes common cause with organized religion. Meaning, it (3) isn't a religion, but it sure shares a lot of the same traits.

As we learn in the 1 st Degree Lecture, when we are asked "in whom do you place your trust?", it is necessary that we convey a belief in some higher power; be it whoever or whatever, but it need be someone or something, otherwise the obligation that we take would be meaningless for there is no greater consequence holding us to our oath.

What is Freemasonry? Freemasonry is tolerant of all faiths and builds a moral and spiritual fellowship on the foundations of fundamental morality common to them all. It kind of sounds like Freemasonry is all the religions wrapped up into one.

The Masonic Service Association of North America, states that (4) "Freemasonry by its teachings and effort seeks to make real the invisible power of love, the intrinsic worth of harmony, and the beauty and eternal reality of the ideal."

What is Freemasonry? We can't forget Charity, right? It's supposed to be the most important and often times it is in our charitable endeavors that those outside the Craft get a small glimpse of what Freemasonry is all about. (5) Masonry is strongly devoted to charity, which constitutes a very

substantial and major part of our endeavors. If you think about it, most if not all of our public activities, across all of Masonry's appendant bodies, are devoted to charitable purposes, most of which fall within the definition of "education";. Bikes for Books, Scholarships, Teacher Grants, Working Tools for Students, all being great examples.

So here I've given you at least five (5) possible answers to the question "What is Freemasonry?" What answer(s) to you commonly give to that question?



From the Chaplain's Corner

As Masons, we come from a Lodge of the Holy Saints John of Jerusalem. One of these, St. John the Baptist, has a Feast Day celebrated on June 24th.

By history, custom, tradition and ritualistic requirements, the Craft holds in veneration the Festival Days of St. John the Baptist on June 24th, and St. John the Evangelist on December 27th.

St. John the Baptist was the cousin of Jesus of Nazareth, known as the Christ. He is one of only two people in the Bible born without Original Sin. The Holy Mother Mary was born without Original Sin because she was foreordained to be the mother of the Christ child.

At the Annunciation, when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to the Virgin Mary to inform her that she would conceive of the Holy Ghost Jesus, he also informed her that Elizabeth, her cousin, was already six months pregnant. Luke's Gospel recounts that the baby "leapt" in Elizabeth's womb at the greeting of Mary. At that time St. John was cleansed of Original Sin in his mother's womb.

For this reason, the being born without Original Sin, Mary and St. John's Feast Days are celebrated on the dates of their birth, whereas the Feast Days of all the other saints are celebrated on the day of their death, to commemorate the day they ascended to Heaven.

Any Blue Lodge that forgets either of these important Feast Days forfeits a precious link to the past and loses an opportunity for the renewal of allegiance to everything in Freemasonry symbolized by these Patron Saints.
